A blessed Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ! As we start the 3rd year of our National Eucharistic Revival, I bring to your attention several opportunities to offer special prayer and devotion to our Eucharistic Lord in the next few days locally, and in the next year nationally and even internationally.

1. With your parish... Corpus Christi Holy Hour led by Fr. Luke Daghir on Saturday, June 1st at 7pm at OLP Church to pray in Thanksgiving for his ordination and to pray for more vocations to the priesthood. Fr. Dan will be preaching at the holy hour.

2. With your diocese... A Eucharistic Procession will again be held on the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ THIS Sunday, June 2nd at 2pm at St. Peter Cathedral. Bishop Persico is scheduled to lead the procession. This has been a great unifying celebration for the Catholic Community of Erie; and I hope many of our OLP members will make the effort to be a part of it.

3. With Catholics from across the country... Join the National Eucharistic Caravan. Beginning in May through July there are four Eucharistic Processions making their way across the United States with the ultimate destination of Indianapolis, Indiana where the first National Eucharistic Congress in 83 years will take place July 17-21. The Seton Route procession will start in Connecticut and pass through Pennsylvania. I am encouraging members of the OLP community to join in part of this Procession on Tuesday, June 18th in New Castle, PA (Diocese of Pittsburgh). There will be a mass at St. Vitus Church at 9am and then a procession of the Eucharist from 9:45-11am to St. Mary Church. Those who want to carpool or caravan will meet at OLP at 7am to depart.

4. With pilgrims who want to grow in faith and devotion... Join Miracles of the Eucharist Pilgrimage to Italy with Fr. Rich: May 5-16, 2025 (12 Days) Tour company: Select International Pilgrimage Tours & Cruises. This pilgrimage features visiting four Eucharistic Miracles in Orvieto, Siena (St. Catherine), Lanciano and Cascia (St. Rita) and visiting other towns like Florence, Assisi (St. Franics and Clare as well as Blessed Carlo Acutis who is one of the patron saints of the Eucharistic Revival), Loreto (the House of the Holy Family), San Giovanni in Rotundo (St. Padre Pio), and Rome (St. Peter, St. Paul, St. John Paul II, St. Paul VI, St. John XXIII, St. Gregory and Leo the Greats, St. Monica and more)! ****Catholic Services Appeal 2024 (CSA) UPDATE** We presently have 397 pledges for \$199,150. Recall that our overall goal is \$200,000 with our annual assessment from the Diocesan Church at \$144,333 and the cost of our church mortar pointing project being \$55,000.

**Praying for the Dead/Purgatory The most effective prayer we have in our Catholic tradition is offering Mass for our deceased loved ones. We do so, following the example of Judas Maccabee in the Bible. Remember that in the Second Book of Maccabees, Judas takes up a collection for an expiatory sacrifice for those who had died in battle against the Greeks. It was found out that those slain had worshiped false gods and Judas makes atonement for them so that they might be freed of sin. Scripture says that "in doing this he acted in a very excellent and noble way." (2 Macc. 12: 38-46). This event in the Bible shows the efficaciousness of praying for the dead. It reaffirms our fundamental Catholic belief that in a mysterious way, our prayers can assist those who have died and are experiencing the purifying process of purgatory. In its section on the final purification, or purgatory, the Catechism (#s1030-1032) explains it this way: "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned." So to all those who ask "does the Catholic Church/do we still believe in Purgatory?"- hopefully the example of Judas Maccabee and 2,000 years of tradition of praying for the dead help you to see the answer to your question is YES!




