THE MASTER STORYTELLER

In today's Gospel, Jesus is presented to us as the master storyteller. He loved to use parables as a tool for comparing one thing to something else. In most of his parables, Jesus revealed who God is by comparing God's essence or actions with something familiar to his listeners. In the parable of the mustard seed, Jesus proclaims a marvelous and irrefutable truth. His small band of disciples, as insignificant as they may have felt, would one day produce a mighty kingdom whose growth was initiated by God. The seeds of this kingdom were planted by God and it is God who will harvest the fruit brought forth from those seeds. The extent of the growth of God's kingdom cannot be predicted. We must trust the work of the Master's hand as we, the mustard plant, grow and grow.

Happy Father's Day! We thank our fathers in a special way this weekend and ask God's blessing upon them. Our fathers have an essential role in revealing the love of God to their families. Our children get their first understanding of God as Father (supernatural) through their experience of their natural fathers; so we need to ask God's inspiration of our fathers in this great responsibility. We pledge our prayers for you, fathers, on this day dedicated to you!

I also ask your prayers in a special way this week for your spiritual fathers and the deacons of the Diocese of Erie who will be gathering for our annual Emmaus Convocation in Latrobe, PA from June 17-20. The Emmaus prayer is included in the bulletin for this purpose. This is a chance for the clergy to join in prayer, fellowship, recreation, and learning so as to strengthen our priestly fraternity and zeal. Please note that there will be NO Mass on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday at OLP and there will be Communion Services held at 12:10pm each of those days. On another note, I want to let you know about a few adjustments that will be implemented in July from the Parish Liturgy Committee. <u>One</u>- We will have two ministers of the Precious Blood at the 5pm Saturday evening Mass. Ideally, we would have the Precious Blood at every Mass but due to limitations in ministers we cannot. <u>Two</u>- we will no longer ask the ministers to sanitize their hands in the sanctuary. Ministers are being asked to sanitize in the pews before they approach the sanctuary (with their own bottle of sanitizer). Extra bottles of sanitizer will be in the sacristy in case of need. Let me know if you have any questions about those adjustments.

Always verify such requests by calling the parish directly. *Don't use phone numbers in the fraudulent email or text.* Always look for the parish's official phone number found on the diocesan website or in the parish's Sunday bulletin. When personal data can be misused by scam artists, please be aware that the Roman Catholic Diocese of Erie, its clergy, parishes and schools will never solicit your personal or business info by any method.

Should you receive an unsolicited request for money or personal information - including a request for gift cards of any type - exercise extreme caution. Contact the person or parish by using official contact information only.






