

**\*\***Distribution of Holy Communion Adjustments The Parish Liturgy Committee is implementing the following changes to the distribution of Holy Communion in July.

<u>One-</u> We will have two ministers of the Precious Blood at the 5pm Saturday evening Mass. Ideally, we would have the

Precious Blood at every Mass but due to limitations in ministers we cannot.

<u>Two-</u> we will no longer ask the ministers to sanitize their hands in the sanctuary. Ministers will do this in the pews before they approach the sanctuary (with their own bottle of sanitizer). Extra bottles of sanitizer are in the sacristy. Let me know if you have questions about these adjustments. \*\*Summary of Outreach Efforts at OLP from Fr. Rich's Homily Last Weekend As much as I push our parish to grow in the ways that we care for each other, I want to acknowledge 2<sup>nd</sup> several areas where we already do this. One-Collections throughout the year- I had asked our parish leadership if we should consider tithing our offertory income as a way to model stewardship as a community and to reinforce what we ask our members to do individually. In one of these conversations, someone suggested that our 2nd collections are a consistent way that we do ensure that our financial support goes beyond our parish need. I asked Mary Beth Whitman, our Business Manager, to determine our annual 2nd collections as a percentage of our annual offertory. And it turns out second collection donations are about 6% of total weekly offertory. That doesn't include other fundraisers like the Baby Bottles for the Women's Care Center, our Thanksgiving Collection for the West Millcreek Food Pantry and the Shining Stars Effort for St. Martin Center at Christmas Time. If we added all those extra efforts we would be around 8% so well done OLP!

<u>Two-</u> The addition of our **new "Outreach Coordinator"** Andy Heinlein in the last few months who will continue to help us grow in taking care of each other.

<u>Three-</u> **OLP Needy Fund** which addresses emergency needs of parishioners throughout the year. We have not promoted this fund for a while; so we are going to find new ways to build it up. You are always welcome to give to that fund by dropping donations off in the collection at Mass or at the office. Just mark the envelope as OLP Needy Fund. Again that money is designated for helping OLP parish families in need. Also, feel free to approach me or Andy Heinlein if you are willing to be "on call" for emergency situations that fellow parishioners are facing.






