

CALLED BY GOD

Today's scriptures invite us to listen to two calls. The first is the call issued by the LORD to the prophet Amos, the "shepherd and a dresser of sycamores" (Amos 7:14). The second is the call the Lord Jesus issued to the Twelve, whom he sent out "two by two" (Mark 6:7). These faithful people responded to the call, prophesying and preaching to the people to whom they had been sent. Each of us received a call when we were baptized. The second reading invites us to ponder that call as we are reminded that we are chosen in Christ and that, in love, God "destined us for adoption" (Ephesians 1:5). As adopted daughters and sons of God we are called to bring the presence of Christ into our marriages, families, schools, and places of work. Let us be inspired today to say yes to the call we hear once again through God's living word.

- **National Eucharistic Congress Please pray for all those who are traveling to Indianapolis this week (July 17-21) for the first National Eucharistic Congress in the United States in 83 years. Among them are at least 15 members of OLP Parish (myself and members of our Parish Leadership Team-Fr. Dan, Mary Beth Whitman, Gina Adams, and Warren (Christine) Beaver as well as approximately 75 or more people from the Diocese of Erie. We also pray that this Congress, as a culminating point for the National Eucharistic Revival, can be a source of grace and renewal for the Catholic Church in the United States of America. We pray for a new Eucharistic amazement in our church and greater belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Communion.
- **National Eucharistic Revival Prayer

 Many of the pilgrims have been praying this prayer as we prepare for the Congress and I hope you will pray it with us this week.

Grant that as we lift you up during this time of Eucharistic Revival, your Holy Spirit may draw all people to join us at this Banquet of Life. You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, God forever and ever. Amen.

**Article on the Eucharistic Congress
Bishop Andrew H. Cozzens of Crookston, Minnesota, has been the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) point person for its three-year National Eucharistic Revival and the National Eucharistic Congress (NEC), which will be held July 17 to 21 this year in Indianapolis.

As chairman of the NEC Inc., he has experienced many inspiring moments and faced unexpected obstacles in leading both. In Houston for a Jan. 23 event previewing the upcoming Eucharistic celebrations set for this summer, Bishop Cozzens said the Eucharistic Congress would be a "generational moment." "The Eucharist is the linchpin of evangelization," Bishop Cozzens said. "When someone comes to meet and encounter Jesus in the Eucharist, it changes their life. I believe that this is part of God's work to strengthen the Church in our day: That the Holy Spirit's about strengthening the Church through the Eucharistic Revival, the Eucharistic Congress."

Bishop Cozzens said he was inspired by writings of past popes, including an encyclical by Pope Leo XIII that encouraged the faithful to carry the world's problems in prayer with resolve to strengthen faith in the Eucharist. In the encyclical, Pope Leo XIII wrote that: "If the Church is strong in her Eucharistic faith, then she will be strong to stand against the evil that's in the world." Understanding what difficult times the Church exists in today, Bishop Cozzens said, "If Catholics have a strong Eucharistic faith, they'll be strengthened to live their faith. If their Eucharistic faith is weak, they won't be able to do it. This is the real mission of the Eucharist. We like to say of the Eucharistic Revival and Congress, 'We don't want to stop until every Catholic has had an experience of the living presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Because we know that's what it takes to strengthen us to be who God's calling us to be in the world."

The NEC is the pinnacle of the National Eucharistic Revival, a three-year initiative the USCCB launched in 2022 to renew and strengthen Catholics' understanding of and love for Jesus in the Eucharist. The revival's first year focused on diocesan leadership. Its second year focused on parish life, with its final year focused on missionary discipleship. The revival includes a National Eucharistic Pilgrimage, which will include pilgrims walking across the country along four designated pilgrimage routes with the Eucharist, converging in Indianapolis for the congress. The pilgrimage routes begin in Brownsville; New Haven, Connecticut: northern Minnesota; and San Francisco May 17 to 19, the weekend of Pentecost. Catholics are invited to join the routes' "perpetual pilgrims" — young adult Catholics walking the entire route — for daily Mass and processions or join the "Eucharistic caravans" for hours or days. The congress will be the first national Eucharistic gathering in the U.S. in 83 years, with the last being the ninth NEC held in St. Paul and Minneapolis in 1941. The 41st International Eucharistic Congress was held in Philadelphia in 1976, drawing an estimated 1.5 million people. St. Teresa of Kolkata and Catholic Worker co-founder Dorothy Day, now a servant of God, were panelists on the topic of "Women and the Eucharist"; St. John Paul II — then Karol Cardinal Wojtyla, the archbishop of Krakow, Poland — gave a homily on justice; and sitting U.S. President Gerald Ford delivered an address on freedom and peace. The Pontifical Committee for International

Eucharistic Congresses continues to organize international gatherings, with the 53rd International Eucharist Congress planned Sept. 8-15 in Quito, Ecuador.

Bishop Cozzens called the congress "an opportunity for us to come together and as a Church to gather and be renewed." "Whether participants attend for one day or five days, they will be invited to a profound experience of renewal by the Holy Spirit, and they'll be invited, we hope, to be set on fire with that missionary desire," he said. "I just pray that as we gather together in Indianapolis, this might be a moment of great renewal and great revival for our Church."

**Summary of Outreach Efforts at OLP from Fr. Rich's Homily Last Weekend As much as I push our parish to grow in the ways that we care for each other, I want to acknowledge several areas where we already do this.

2nd Collections throughout the year- I had Oneasked our parish leadership if we should consider tithing our offertory income as a way to model stewardship as a community and to reinforce what we ask our members to do individually. In one of these conversations, someone suggested that our 2nd collections are a consistent way that we do ensure that our financial support goes beyond our parish need. I asked Mary Beth Whitman, our Business Manager, to determine our annual 2nd collections as a percentage of our annual offertory. And it turns out second collection donations are about 6% of total weekly offertory. That doesn't include other fundraisers like the Baby Bottles for the Women's Care Center, our Thanksgiving Collection for the West Millcreek Food Pantry and the Shining Stars Effort for St. Martin Center at Christmas Time. If we added all those extra efforts we would be around 8% so well done OLP!

Two- The addition of our **new "Outreach Coordinator" Andy Heinlein** in the last few months who will continue to help us grow in taking care of each other.

Three- OLP Needy Fund which addresses emergency needs of parishioners throughout the year. We have not promoted this fund for a while; so we are going to find new ways to build it up. You are always welcome to give to that fund by dropping donations off in the collection at Mass or at the office. Just mark the envelope as OLP Needy Fund. Again that money is designated for helping OLP parish families in need. Also, feel free to approach me or Andy Heinlein if you are willing to be "on call" for emergency situations that fellow parishioners are facing.





Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When we think of mission territory, we are likely to think of Africa or Asia, not of parts of our own country. Yet, there are many poor, sparsely populated dioceses in our country who need our help to minister to the People of God and to spread the Good News.

The Collection for National Needs, to be taken this year on July 20 and 21, gives each of us the opportunity to stand in solidarity with poorer dioceses in the United States. This collection is a combination of two other collections:

- The Catholic Home Missions Appeal impacts the lives of nearly 9 million Catholics. Through annual grants, the Catholic Home Missions Appeal funds catechesis for children and adults, seminarian education, lay ministry training, Hispanic ministry and other pastoral programs in needy dioceses. The dioceses funded by the appeal comprise nearly 45 percent of all US dioceses.
- The Black and Indian Mission Collection helps to evangelize and support our African American, Native American and Alaskan Native communities with mission schools, religious education programs, the purchase of catechetical materials and ministry training.


