GOD'S WORK

We are so busy! Most of us have more than one job to do, and we never seem to have enough time. We are workers, volunteers, parents, friends, and most of us are more than one thing at a time. But which of these is the work of God?

We seldom view our ordinary work as being the work of God. We may think that we have to be ministers or priests, missionaries or charity workers, engaged full-time in works formally identified as being "God's work." But everything we do with a faithful heart and with love for others is God's work. We each have our own role to fill in the world, and many gifts are necessary. We cannot always see the direct connection of our daily work to the plan of God. But we trust and we believe that God leads us to do what is needed, where it is needed. What is "God's work?" "This is the work of God, that you believe in the one he sent" (John 6:29).



Serra Prayer for Vocations

From the Pastor's Desk...

In the last several weeks we have seen two significant celebrations on a national and international level that surprisingly became infamously connected... the National Eucharistic Congress and the Olympics. As I mentioned last weekend, I was blessed to attend the Congress in mid July in Indianapolis with 16 other OLP parishioners, 75-80 people from the Diocese of Erie and 60,000 people from across the country and beyond. It was amazing on so many levels! Among the many positive observations made by many who attended (and I've heard the same comments about World Youth Days and other significant gatherings of Catholics) is how kind and gracious everyone was even in the midst of dealing with the many inconveniences of such large gatherings. Also, the affirmation of the churches vocations and comradery between clergy, the religious men and women and the laity (especially the hundreds of young families who attended). I heard consistent comments about the hope and encouragement the Congress gave to all those who attended and a renewed appreciation of the Eucharist and its centrality and importance in our Catholic faith. Many people commented on how proud they were to be Catholic when seeing and being a part of this special gathering.

Coming off the momentum of the Congress I was then excited to realize that it was leading right into the deep dive into the John 6 that occurs every three years in our Catholic Cycle of Sunday readings. So, the next 5 weeks we will hear Gospel readings from John 6 culminating in the Bread of Life Discourse. Last weekend was the setup of the discourse which is the multiplication of loaves and fishes. In addition to reinforcing the truth that Jesus can miraculously provide for us and nourish us as seen in the multiplication, it also reminds us of what God can accomplish through our limited gifts and talents. We just have to let God use us (however limited we think it is) and He can take that offering and change the world.

So this leads to the other major international event going on right now... the Olympics. Who would have thought the Olympics would be a place we would have to be concerned about religious persecution and offenses but it was. If you have not heard already, the French opening ceremony creators decided to use this international spotlight to mock the very Eucharist (parody of Da Vinci's Last Supper) which was celebrated by our country so beautifully last month. To say I was disappointed by this is an understatement. I was sad. I was angry. But then I found expression in a statement that I received from Bishop Andrew Cozzens, chair of the U.S. Bishops' Committee on Evangelization and Catechesis who was also the chair of the National Eucharistic Congress.

Referencing the Opening Ceremony of the Olympics, Bishop Cozzens wrote, "Jesus experienced his Passion anew Friday night in Paris when his Last Supper was publicly defamed." "France and the entire world are saved by the love poured out through the Mass, which came to us through the Last Supper. Inspired by the many martyrs who shed their blood to witness to the truth of the Mass, we will not stand aside and quietly abide as the world mocks our greatest gift from the Lord Jesus," the bishop wrote. "Rather, through our prayer and fasting, we will ask the Holy Spirit to strengthen us with the virtue of fortitude so that we may preach Christ—our Lord and Savior, truly present in the Eucharist—for the Glory of God and the Salvation of Souls." Bishop Cozzens specifically encouraged us to consider going to extra daily Masses, praying extra holy hours and spending time in Eucharistic Adoration to make reparation (repair) for the offenses against Jesus and His mystical body, the Church. So, if you are also sad and disappointed or even angry, offer your 2 loaves and 5 fish this week... pray and fast for the church's sanctification and the world's conversion, making your voice heard in response to this affront and maybe even consider boycotting the Olympics. Whatever it is, make sure you do something extra to let God know how much we love and honor Him even when the world does not!

May God bless our week ahead!
