Family Discussion of the Week: Christian Marriage

This is a great mystery, and I am applying it to Christ and the church. Each of you, however, should love his wife as himself, and a wife should respect her husband. (Ephesians 5:32-33) *Adults:* In what way has the example of Christian marriage (your own or that of another couple) helped you understand the relationship between Christ and his church? *Kids:* What can you do for your family to show them Jesus' love and care?

HOUSEHOLDS IN GOD'S SERVICE

In the ancient world, "household" was a wide-reaching concept. When Joshua today speaks of his household serving the Lord, he meant not just those people who lived inside his walls or those related to him by blood or marriage; he meant slaves or servants and their families, and anyone indebted to him in any way. Even his livestock and other possessions would be consecrated to service of God. In our world, we value allowing individuals their freedom to choose how they live, and wouldn't think of offering our pets to the service of God. But, as we discern our vocation as disciples baptized into Christ, we can come to realize how far-ranging the "households" of our lives still are: how we act toward our spouses, children, roommates or anyone we live with; our behavior with neighbors; or in public as we encounter many "strangers" every day in stores or traffic who suddenly are "pext door" to us. How can we use our time, our resources, or gifts for selfless reasons rather than personal gain? No matter what life our witness to the Good News calls us to, we all have a "household" that must be consecrated to service of the Lord our God.

From the Pastor's Desk...

The end of August always represents several things for us at OLP....ONE- the end of August represents a big transition back to school for many in our community. I want to wish all families, students, teachers, staff, and administrators that are in this transition a blessed return to school- whether elementary, middle, high school, college or grad school. I pray that we all can be open to the ways that God uses our experience in school to grow in His love, truth and wisdom whether we are in a private or public school. At Our Lady of Peace School, the first day is this Wednesday, August 28th, and Fr. Nick will celebrate the opening school Mass at 9am that day. The rest of the school year we will celebrate weekly Mass for OLP School on Thursdays at 2pm. I also want to alert you that the school will be bringing back the car line so everyone is asked not to park on the west side of the church or school between 2-3:30pm Monday through Friday as this will allow for a much safer and secure dismissal. Thank you for your cooperation.

TWO- the end of August means we are nearing the end of our annual parish fundraiser, the OLP Raffle. We are ONLY TWO WEEKS away from the big drawing on Saturday, September 7th at the Parish Picnic! Presently 2,450 tickets have been sold, which is 2/3 of our goal of 3,800, and still short of our budgeted breakeven point. So, we are hoping for big returns in these last two weeks! The raffle raises approx. \$40,000 for the budget; so please make every effort to sell the tickets you received and consider taking extras if possible. Thank you!

THREE- every three years the end of August has five straight weeks of Gospel readings from John 6 which contains the great Bread of Life Discourse. I have been preaching on different aspects of this great discourse the last month. It is so timely this year coming off the National Eucharistic Congress (NEC) in July. I encourage you to watch as many of the talks and sessions from the NEC that you can including Jonathan Roumie's talk in which he went into his Jesus character from The Chosen to quote Jn. 6:51-58 which is the foundation of Catholic Eucharistic Theology, faith and understanding.

Allow me to comment on John 6 a bit further here: This weekend we see that many of the listeners say that Jn. 6:51-58 is hard to accept and many return to their former way of life. As is always emphasized, Jesus didn't change his vivid language of "chewing" his body and blood or say he was only speaking symbolically in order to get them back. He let them leave and turned to his Apostles to ask them if they too would leave. Jesus knew that this teaching was so fundamental to how he would continue to nourish His church and keep them in communion with him that he could not compromise on this truth that "his body is true food and his blood is true drink." This is the scripture that is at the heart of the Eucharistic Revival that our National Catholic Church is in (we are in the last year of a 3-year Revival). Our Liturgy Committee is planning to take the next year to continue our Eucharistic Renewal here at OLP. Three aspects of that effort include: (1.) A parish wide Eucharistic Consecration from October 22-November 24 using Matthew Kelly's 33 Days of Eucharistic Glory. (2.) A Eucharistic Miracle Exhibit during Advent. (3.) Catechesis on the Mass/ Eucharist in the bulletin with inserts over the next year. I also plan on commenting more on Open Communion (the argument

that everyone should be able to receive Holy Communion at Mass) in the next few weeks in my bulletin article.

May God bless those returning to school and our week ahead!




