

Family Discussion of the Week: Time Faith and Works

Faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead. But someone will say, "You have faith and I have works." Show me your faith apart from your works, and I by my works will show you my faith. (James 2:17-18)

Adults: Why should faith always lead to good works?

Kids: What good works can you do to show your faith in Jesus?

LISTENING AND RESPONDING

There are three interwoven themes in today's readings: listening to God, faith vs. good works, and losing our life in order to find it. How are they related?

The Suffering Servant of Isaiah undergoes much distress and ridicule, but is able to bear it because he has listened to the promptings of God day after day. The psalm tells us that God listens, too. God hears our prayers for help and is always ready to save us. As our faith deepens, so does our desire to do the works of justice and charity that build up the reign of God. God directs our actions in ways we often cannot see, and we don't always see the results. We are called upon in faith to trust that what we do is enough, and that willingness to listen to God's promptings will lead us in the right way.

Serra Prayer for Vocations

From the Pastor's Desk...

I share with you part of my homily from last weekend; for some it will be the first time and for others this is a chance to reinforce the message. In the Gospel Jesus was opening the ears of deaf mute through the word "Aphphatha," the Hebrew word for "Be open!" In my homily I shared... "My second question is... just because your ears were opened in Baptism to hear the Gospel, are they still hearing? God? Others? As important as it is to be challenged in hearing God and doing some self-reflection about whether you are taking time to listen to God, I would like to focus more here on hearing others. Are you really hearing others around you? In your marriage? in your family? at your workplace? at our parish?

The next stage of the Synod that Pope Francis is leading our universal Catholic Church in right now is to form our church in listening better in dialogue. We cannot have debates like the political ones we see on television- where each side is not open to the other sides perspective, doesn't listen to the other but rather just focuses on the next response or personal slam of the opponent they are going to give, and sees the other as an opponent to be conquered. We must engage in dialogue where both sides are open to the other perspective, where each side genuinely listens in a dialogue and both sides see the other as a colleague/teammate where both are seeking to grow and learn through this process.

Over my 7 and half years at OLP, we have sporadically had a series we call 'The Church in Dialogue.' We had sessions on same sex attraction, the clergy abuse scandal and racial justice. And even in that church setting where we asked people to approach the discussion with the qualities I mentioned above, some people still were not open to the other perspective, they didn't really listen to what those on the other side were saying, they were not willing to concede any points, and they seemed to see the other side as an opponent to conquer. They wanted to spend most of the time teaching the other side what they should be thinking rather than really listening and trying to understand where they were coming from.

If the church struggles to truly have dialogue and genuine listening, then how can we expect that to happen in the political and secular world. I believe Jesus through the synod is once again commanding that the ears of our minds and hearts 'be open!' . . . I hope and pray that we truly desire that our ears be opened and that that might involve change... not only in others... but in me."

May God bless our Synodal Process in our universal Catholic Church and our week ahead!

(3) A culture of healthy teamwork- team members (and parishioners) commit to and practice the Five Behaviors of a Team which are building trust, mastering conflict, achieving commitment, embracing accountability and focusing on

So for the last 2 and half years, our PLT, staff and pastoral council have been continuing formation in these building blocks with the help of our Amazing Parish Coach, Nate Schaaf from Denver. One fruit of this formation is creating clarity and cohesiveness when it comes to our parish vision and strategy. And the next step for our parish is communicating this vision and strategy with our lead volunteers and eventually the entire parish as well as helping our entire parish to be strengthened in the building blocks above. I pray that this next step can continue to be a part of our parish transformation which can only happen through the power of the Holy Spirit. So please pray for the Holy Spirit to set us on fire in His love and power to grow in the principles and vision of Amazing Parish and to boldly bring His love and peace to our families, our community and our world!

The following are needed:


- · Men's clothing: pants, long sleeve shirts, winter coats
