From the Pastor's Desk...

Happy (official start of) Fall! We ended up moving our Picnic Mass on Saturday, September 7th into the church instead of having it outdoors as we have done for several years. That was due to a recent articulation of our Diocesan Policy which I share with you here. "Reminder on the Proper Place for the Celebration of the Eucharist: Canon 932: §1 The Eucharistic celebration is to be carried out in a sacred place unless in a particular case necessity requires otherwise; in such a case the celebration must be done in a decent place. In a sacred place: The proper location for the celebration of the Mass is a sacred place, which is a technical term in the law (cf. c. 1205). Sacred places include: • Churches (both parish and secondary, with or without mission status) • Oratories (e.g., seminary, university, and convent chapels) • Catholic cemeteries. When necessity requires: In responding to the spiritual needs of the faithful, the priests of the parish may also be requested to celebrate Masses in other places, such as nursing homes, correctional facilities, the location for the parish picnic, or other appropriate places. The location should be decent and there must always be at least an altar cloth (always white) and a corporal (cf. c. 932 §2). The canon requires necessity, not just pastoral advantage, to celebrate outside of a sacred place. Barring possible exceptions, celebrating Mass on the parish property outside of the church building (such as in the parking lot or on the church lawn), when the church building is available and ready at hand, would lack any sense of necessity. Mass in that case should be celebrated in the church."

We had chosen to have to Mass outside for the parish picnic to create a unique setting to set the picnic Mass apart from our regular weekly Masses, but I completely understand and agree with the diocesan policy and hope that we can all support the parish complying with this policy. **PA March for Life Please pray for the group headed to the PA March for Life this Monday, September 23rd in Harrisburg (including me for the first time participating at the state level!). There is still room on the bus so contact either myself or Sarah Beaver if you interested in joining us. We will meet at Blessed Sacrament Church at 4:30am for Morning Prayer before the buses leave from the Blessed Sacrament parking lot at 5am. The estimated time of return is 8pm. In January 2023, I participated in the National March for Life in Washington DC. I did that as a pilgrimage of thanksgiving for the 2022 overturn of the Roe Vs. Wade Supreme Court decision that had permitted abortion nationally since 1973. Now the decision on ending abortion lies with the States so we turn our attention to Harrisburg and let our lawmakers and enforcers know that a truly just state requires the legal protection of the most vulnerable human lives there are, the unborn. Please pray

for the legal protection of the unborn and again for all the pilgrims who head to the PA March for Life this week to pray for and march for this urgent cause.

Catechesis on the Mass/Eucharist in the bulletin with inserts over the next year.

Our Picnic Committee, which is primarily our Families Together Ministry with a few others who join in, did an incredible job and they were very impressed with the amount of parishioners who got involved. In addition to many individuals who help, the scouts, the Knights of Columbus and the Parish Pastoral Council had many members help. Well done OLP! **Parish Raffle Results Congratulations to our OLP Raffle Winners: Natalie Prischak-\$500, Joseph Dudenhoeffer-\$500, CJ. Mukovich-\$500, David Mackowski-\$1,000, Emily Sertz-\$2,500 and Jim Malue-\$10,000. Together, our annual parish raffle raised \$45,759 which is the second highest total since we started the raffle back in 2021. Thank you to all who sold or bought tickets! Again, well done OLP!

**Homily on "Be open!" I share with you part of my recent homily; for some it will be the first time and for others this is a chance to reinforce the message. In the Gospel Jesus was opening the ears of deaf mute through the word "Aphphatha," the Hebrew for "Be open!" In my homily I shared... "My second question is... just because your ears were opened in Baptism to hear the Gospel, are they still hearing? God? Others? As important as it is to be challenged in hearing God and doing some self-reflection about whether you are taking time to listen to God, I would like to focus more here on hearing others. Are you really hearing others around you? In your marriage? in your family? at your workplace? at our parish?

The next stage of the Synod that Pope Francis is leading our universal Catholic Church in right now is to form our church in listening better in dialogue. We cannot have debates like the political ones we see on television- where each side is not open to the other sides perspective, doesn't listen to the other but rather just focuses on the next response or personal slam of the opponent they are going to give, and sees the other as an opponent to be conquered. We must engage in dialogue where both sides are open to the other perspective, where each side genuinely listens in a dialogue and both sides see the other as a colleague/teammate where both are seeking to grow and learn through this process.

Over my 7 and half years at OLP, we have sporadically had a series we call 'The Church in Dialogue.' We had sessions on same sex attraction, the clergy abuse scandal and racial justice. And even in that church setting where we asked people to approach the discussion with the qualities I mentioned above, some people still were not open to the other perspective, they didn't really listen to what those on the other side were saying, they were not willing to concede any points, and they seemed to see the other side as an opponent to conquer. They wanted to spend most of the time teaching the other side what they should be thinking rather than really listening and trying to understand where they were coming from.

If the church struggles to truly have dialogue and genuine listening, then how can we expect that to happen in the political and secular world. I believe Jesus through the synod is once again commanding that the ears of our minds and hearts 'be open!' . . . I hope and pray that we truly desire that our ears be opened and that that might involve change... not only in others... but in me."







Knights of Columbus Soccer Challenge


