I invite and encourage you to be part of our parish Eucharistic Consecration this Fall. The Eucharistic liturgy is the source and summit of all that we do and are as a Parish. The need for us to grow in our appreciation of, and relationship with God and each other through the Eucharist is never ending. So, in our third year of the National Eucharistic Revival, I ask you to participate in this Eucharistic Consecration. What is a Consecration? It is a promise of renewal, a re-commitment and deeper devotion to Jesus Christ through a specific person or mystery of the faith, in this case through the Eucharist. We will be using Matthew Kelly's book "33 Days to Eucharistic Glory" which is provided for free to all thanks to generous benefactors. The Consecration begins October 20th and ends on November 24th.

There will be Adoration from 5:30-6:00pm and the prayer service will follow.

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments - Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments – Is Your Child Street Smart? Being street smart means knowing how to keep yourself safe from strangers when you're alone or with other kids. When your street smart you know your way around, you know how to handle yourself in tough situations and you can "read" people. Teach your child who are strangers - (-anyone they do not know or kind of knowand to never approach a strangers vehicle. Teach to your child to always tell you where they are. Teach your child to always go with a friend or two whether walking to school, bike riding or going to the store. Pick out safe spots where your child can go and get help. Places like police stations, stores, restaurants. Teach them how to spot safe places on their route and to avoid places that aren't safe. 
