

Jesus, the living word of God, the embodiment of wisdom, has strong, deeply penetrating words for the rich young man who comes to him seeking answers to his most profound questions. 
- **Annual Retreat I will be away for my annual priest retreat this week at St. Meinrad Abbey in Indiana. Please keep me and the other priests attending in your prayers and know as always that I pray for you!
- **<u>All Souls Day Memorial Service</u> The memorial service for All Souls Day will be held on Monday, November 4th at 7:00PM.

We pray for all those who have died and had funeral services through Our Lady of Peace over the past year. We welcome also praying for and with our parish families who have lost loved ones in the last year whose funerals were not at OLP. So any parishioners of OLP can notify the office if your spouse, parent or child died since last November 2nd and we will include them by name in our service and make a candle for them. Please let us know by Monday, October 21st.

- **Masses this Week Monday, Oct. 14th- St. Callistus, Pope and Martyr (3rd Century organizer of first Christian cemetery); Tuesday, Oct. 15th- St. Theresa of Avila, Virgin and Doctor of the Church (16th Century mystic who reformed the Carmelites); Wednesday, Oct. 16th- St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, Virgin (17th Century French Visitandine Mystic who promoted devotion to the Sacred Heart); Thursday, Oct. 17th- St. Ignatius of Antoich, Bishop and Martyr (2nd Century Apostolic Father known as the 2nd successor of St. Peter in Antioch); Friday, Oct. 18th- St. Luke, Evangelist; Saturday, Oct. 19th- Sts. John de Brebeuf and Isaac Jogues, Priests, and Companions, Martyrs (17th Century Jesuit North American Martyrs).
- **Anointing of the Sick Mass Next weekend (Sunday, October 20th) we have an Anointing of the Sick Mass at OLP at I I am where we will administer the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. This is a unique Mass because it involves the SACRAMENT of Anointing of the Sick. In this sacrament we pray for healing for our recipients as well as the grace to "suffer well." We pray to be strengthened in the virtue of hope so that the cross of our sickness does not tempt us to despair. Remember that this sacrament is NOT FOR EVERYONE but for those who fit in one of the following categories:
- → those who are dangerously ill through sickness or old age (physical or psychological)
- → a sick person…before surgery whenever the surgery is necessitated by a dangerous illness
- → elderly people...if they are weak, though not dangerously ill
- → sick children...sufficiently mature to be comforted by the sacrament
- ★ sick people who have lost consciousness or who have lost the use of reason...if ...they would have requested it if they had been in possession of their faculties

Of course, if a sick person who received this anointing recovers his/her health, he/she can in the case of another serious illness receive this sacrament again. If during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious, the sacrament may be repeated as well. So if this applies to you or someone you know, please join us at this special Mass of healing and grace. Please arrive early so you can sign in and find your seats. If you are not in need of the sacrament or prayers for healing yourself, I encourage you to come join us as we pray with and for those in our community who are carrying the cross of significant physical or psychological illness.

- **Eucharistic Revival Continues at OLP Our parish leadership is planning to take the next year to continue to our Eucharistic Renewal here at OLP. Three aspects of that effort include:
- (1.) A parish wide Eucharistic Consecration from October 22-November 24 using Matthew Kelly's 33 Days of Eucharistic Glory. (2.) A Eucharistic Miracle Exhibit during Advent. (3.) Catechesis on the Mass/Eucharist in the bulletin with inserts.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In 2024, World Mission Sunday will be celebrated on the weekend of October 19-20. Donations collected at these worldwide Masses go entirely to support churches, hospitals, schools and vocations in countries where the Church is new, young or poor. World Mission Sunday supports over 1,150 mission territories specifically in Asia, Africa, Latin America, the Pacific Islands, and the Middle East. In the 1800's, it was the Catholic Church in the United States that benefitted from this collection. Now is our chance to give back.

This year's theme is: "Go and invite everyone to the banquet." (cf. Mt 22:9). This message, rooted in the parable of the wedding banquet, calls us to a renewed sense of our missionary responsibility. Pope Francis emphasizes the call to every Christian to bear witness to Christ, to participate in a mission of universal evangelization, and to seek strength and guidance from the Holy Spirit. As we prepare for World Mission Sunday, may we be inspired by the words of Pope Francis. Let us pray that the Lord may help us to be a more missionary Church, reaching out to every corner of the earth with His message of love and salvation.


