Family Discussion of the Week: Quiet Sacrifice Jesus said, "Whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all." (Mark 10:44) Adults: Why is it hard to do good works if you will not be acknowledged for them? *Kids:* Are you willing to do a good deed even if no one knows that you did it? Why?

WORDS OF WISDOM

The spirit of wisdom, as we discover in today's first reading, comes to those who pray for her. Wisdom, like the word of God, carries a message of consolation as well as of great challenge. The Letter to the Hebrews tells us that the word of God, infused with the wisdom of God, is "sharper than any two-edged sword." We cannot shrink from the wisdom of God, or from the word that has the power to penetrate our hearts and minds. Jesus, the living word of God, the embodiment of wisdom, has strong, deeply penetrating words for the rich young man who comes to him seeking answers to his most profound questions. Just when the young man thought he had done enough to fulfill God's commands, more was asked of him. This is no less true for us.

Recently we had a gathering of our volunteer leaders that we called "Jesus Sends Out the 72." The purpose of this meeting was to continue to expose more of our parish to the principles behind the Amazing Parish Movement that we and many parishes around the country are a part of. Our staff, Parish Leadership Team (PLT) and Pastoral Council have been soaking in these principles for the last year or two and it is now time to invite the rest of the parish to do so. The PLT identified individuals who are leading ministries, committees and other areas of parish life (as well as parishioners who are involved in leadership or ministry at the diocesan level) and invited them to be a part of this gathering. This group will meet two more times and then be sent out to bring this experience to the ministries and committees they lead in the first part of 2025. Eventually we will invite the whole parish to experience this on some level in the Fall of 2025. There is always a risk of excluding someone when you initiate something like this, so please let me know if you are a volunteer leader in our parish community and were not invited to the gathering last week. Also, as I said before, volunteers who are a part of ministries and committees at OLP will be exposed to this in 2025; so, you have not missed out.

**<u>Anointing of the Sick Mass</u> Next weekend (Sunday, October 20th) we have an Anointing of the Sick Mass at OLP

at I I am where we will administer the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. This is a unique Mass because it involves the SACRAMENT of Anointing of the Sick. In this sacrament we pray for healing for our recipients as well as the grace to "suffer well." We pray to be strengthened in the virtue of hope so that the cross of our sickness does not tempt us to despair. Remember that this sacrament is NOT FOR EVERYONE but for those who fit in one of the following categories:

+ those who are dangerously ill through sickness or old age (physical or psychological)

★ a sick person...before surgery whenever the surgery is necessitated by a dangerous illness

+ elderly people...if they are weak, though not dangerously ill

★ sick children...sufficiently mature to be comforted by the sacrament

★ sick people who have lost consciousness or who have lost the use of reason...if ...they would have requested it if they had been in possession of their faculties

Of course, if a sick person who received this anointing recovers his/her health, he/she can in the case of another serious illness receive this sacrament again. If during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious, the sacrament may be repeated as well. So if this applies to you or someone you know, please join us at this special Mass of healing and grace. Please arrive early so you can sign in and find your seats. If you are not in need of the sacrament or prayers for healing yourself, I encourage you to come join us as we pray with and for those in our community who are carrying the cross of significant physical or psychological illness.

**Eucharistic Consecration begins at OLP This week starts our Eucharistic Consecration; I know will be a great source of grace for our parish. I have asked all our liturgical ministers to participate in the consecration as part of their formation for their ministry and I hope that many others in our parish will be a part of this as well. Remember that it is a 33-day journey and that the first official day is this Tuesday, October 22nd (the feast of St. John Paul II) and will conclude on Saturday, November 23rd. Each week we have 3 sessions to pray with each other and share with others how the Spirit is moving in us throughout the Consecration (Sunday 9:30-10:30am in the school, Tuesday 6:30-7:30pm in the church and Wednesday 10-I I am in the church). Please join me in praying that this consecration can be a great blessing for our parish and all those who participate!

**<u>Consecration Kickoff Holy Hour</u> This Tuesday, October 22nd from 5:30-6:30pm we will have a Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration to kickoff our Eucharistic Consecration at OLP. You do not have to be participating in the Consecration in order to come to the Holy Hour.

**Divine Mercy Encounter Retreat I will be on the team for the Divine Mercy Encounter (DME) Retreat November 8-10, 2024, at St. Joseph Church/Bread of Life Community) and I would love to have you join me. What is DME? From the DME website... "DME (Divine Mercy Encounter) is a three-day retreat program. Each day has a different focus: Friday is the Day of Invitation, focusing on how God is inviting us into relationship. Saturday is

the Day of Encounter, where we encounter God through the sacraments, Adoration, and others. Sunday is the Day of Commission, where we as a community are empowered to evangelize and share our faith. The weekend includes talks, exposure to different types of prayer, Mass, community, and much more. The weekend runs from 10am on Friday to 5pm on Sunday, and retreat participants stay onsite for the weekend." It is for anyone 16 years old and up- yes that includes adults and young adults). The other upcoming DME retreats in 2025 are January 31-Feb 2; March 28-30; July 11-13 (all at SJBOL). **OLP Cursillo We are trying something new next year in collaboration with the Cursillo Retreat Movement in our Diocese. We are planning a parish focused Curillo Retreat where OLP members are the team and we hope to fill the retreat with you, the men of OLP. So, on February 21-23, 2025, we will have our first OLP Men's Cursillo at Our Lady of Mercy Church in Harborcreek. I will be one of the spiritual directors, along with Deacon Ralph, and Mike McLaughlin will be the lay leader. Here's a little more about Erie Cursillo from their website... "Cursillo (kur-SEE-yo) literally means "little course" and is an intense three-day spiritual retreat, the purpose of which is a deep personal encounter with Jesus Christ. Those who experience the Cursillo Movement know it is more than just three days of religious instruction. It is an effort to change the spiritual environment, to bring Jesus Christ into the world." 
