

Family Discussion of the Week: The Habit of Prayer

Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man. (Luke 21:36)

Adults: What have been the strength of your prayer life? What habit of prayer could you strengthen during this Advent season?

Kids: What prayers will you say each day and each week during Advent?

THE PROMISE OF JUSTICE

We are in fairly good company when we ask God for justice. Often enough we hear and agree with the lament of the people of Israel asking God why the wicked prosper. However, when we call out for justice, we usually want someone to get his or her comeuppance. God's justice is something other than this, of course. God's justice comprises a wonderful rightness between God and humankind.

Today, Jeremiah looks ahead to a time when a just one will sprout from the shorn-off stump of Jesse of the house and family of David. Life was not fair in Jeremiah's time. Israel's kings held the promise of God's fidelity, but it was difficult to see how God's promise could be realized through them.

Nevertheless, Jeremiah lifts his voice and announces that the Promised One will come. Luke's Gospel echoes that appouncement, and Paul is filled with sturdy encouragement. And so Advent begins with a promise.

Happy New Year as we start a new liturgical year! Recall that, like Lent, Advent is a preparatory and penitential season and so we are encouraged to renew our commitments in the basic areas of Christian discipleship- prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Here are some opportunities to do that...

- 1. Prayer:
 - Tuesday, December 3rd- Eucharistic Adoration Holy Hour from 6:30-7:30pm with a theme of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and Eucharistic Miracles.
 - b. **Friday, December 6th** First Friday Adoration from 7:30am-7pm Benediction.
 - c. **Monday, December 9th** Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Masses are at 7am, 12:10pm, and 2pm (School) and 5:30pm. This is a holy day of obligation.
- 2. Sacrament of Reconciliation:
 - a. Confessions after all Sunday Masses
 - b. Normal weekly opportunities- Wednesdays from 11:15am-Noon; Saturdays from 8:30-9am and 3:45-4:45pm

- **#iGiveCatholic now through December 3, 2024 This year our goal is \$45,000 and 175 donors. We have chosen the Adult Faith Formation program to benefit from your sacrifice. Donations will be used to fund our new staff position, Coordinator of Adult Faith Formation, held by Sr. Kathleen Dietz, FSO. They will also be used for parish subscriptions to media resources such as FORMED and Hallow; for a Parish Mission in Spring 2026 (we hope to bring in a nationally-known speaker); and for other supplies and hospitality at new formation events. Donations will be accepted until midnight on Tuesday, December 3rd which is the National #iGiveCatholic day. - **Masses this Week Monday, Dec. 2nd and Thursday, Dec. 5th- Weekdays in Advent; Tuesday, Dec. 3rd St. Francis Xavier, Priest (Jesuit missionary in the 16th Century); Wednesday, Dec. 4th- St. John Damascene, Priest and Doctor of the Church (8th Century Damascus); Friday, Dec. 6th- St. Nicholas, Bishop (4th century Asia Minor); Saturday, Dec. 7th- St. Ambrose, Bishop and Doctor of the Church
- **Mass Catechesis Section in the Bulletin
 We have begun to periodically include a section in the bulletin called "Our Catholic Faith" which explains parts of the Mass and other parts of our Catholic Tradition that involve liturgy and worship. We planned this as part of the ongoing Eucharistic Revival that is still happening in the National Catholic Church (this is the 3rd of three years); and as a follow up to the "The One Hour to Peace . . . from Mass to Mission" Formation we experienced as a parish last Fall (2023) which gave an overview of the Mass. So keep your eyes open for those sections over the next 8-10 months and let's keep diving deeper in Eucharistic Amazement here at OLP!
- **OLP Cursillo... Strive for '25 We are trying something new in collaboration with the Diocesan Cursillo Retreat Movement. We are attempting to have a parish focused Cursillo Retreat where OLP parishioners are team members and to have mostly OLP members make the retreat. On February 21-23, 2025, will be the OLP Men's Cursillo at Our Lady of Mercy Church in Harborcreek. I am one of the spiritual directors, along with Deacon Ralph, and Mike McLaughlin as the lay leader. A Women's Cursillo is set for March 21-23, 2025, at Our Lady of Mercy Church with many OLP members as part of the team. "Cursillo (kur-SEE-yo) literally means "little course" and is an intense 3-day spiritual retreat, the purpose of which is a deep personal encounter with Jesus Christ. Advent Wreath

An Advent wreath symbolizes our longing for the coming of Christ. The wreath is a circle of evergreen branches into which are set four candles. Traditionally three candles are violet and one is rose, but four violet or four white candles may also be used.

The wreath symbolizes many things. Evergreens signify God's enduring promise of redemption, evident like green branches in the midst of snow. The circle signifies our hope for the return of Christ, whose Kingdom will have no end. The colors of the candles match the traditional colors of the vesture for the four Sundays of Advent. Violet garments signify our penitent hope for salvation. The rose color, which may be worn on Advent's Third Sunday, signals that the season is nearly over—joy is at hand!

The wreath's most luminous symbol is its growing light. One candle is lit on the First Sunday of Advent, two on the Second, three on the Third and all four on the Fourth. In the northern hemisphere, Advent comes at a time when the days decrease to their shortest length. As the hours of darkness increase, we light more candles on the wreath. The wreath, which symbolizes the coming of Christ, grows in intensity as the anniversary of Jesus' birth draws near.

The Advent wreath may be used at home or at church. It should be blessed on the First Sunday of Advent after the homily at one Mass, at evening prayer Saturday night, or during a prayer service including biblical readings and Advent songs. At home, a family member can bless the wreath. It may be lit during the evening meal, to remind everyone of the true meaning of this holy season.

Advent Wreath Year C

IF YOU are setting up an Advent wreath in your home this year, here are some prayers you could say while you light its candles. You may say these before or after a meal, when waking up, before going to bed, or whenever you and the members of your household can gather for prayer. Before you say the prayer, read and talk over the gospel you heard at Sunday Mass that week.

Week 1: O God, whose Son promised to come back in a cloud with power and great glory, help us prepare for his return. When we are afraid, give us hope. As we light this first candle, give us strength to endure our trials. Through Christ our Lord.

Week 2: O God, who sent your Word to John in the desert, open our ears to hear his message. By the glow of these two candles, make straight our winding roads. Brighten our path that we may run to meet Christ at his coming. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

Week 3: O God, who filled people with expectation, hear our prayer as we light the rose candle. Help us know what we should do as we await the coming of your Son, Jesus Christ. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

Week 4: O God, who fulfilled your promise to Mary, fill us also with your Spirit. Make us leap for joy as we light the fourth candle of this wreath. May its light purify our hearts for the coming of Christ. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever.




