

Serra Prayer for Vocations

From the Pastor's Desk...

A blessed Second Sunday of Advent to you! Today would normally be the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary but it is transferred to tomorrow, December 9th since it falls on a Sunday. The Diocesan Office of Worship provided parishes with the following: "The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception falls on Sunday, December 8, 2024, which coincides with the Second Sunday of Advent. As such, the Solemnity is transferred to Monday, December 9. Previously, when the date was transferred, the obligation was abrogated: This is no longer the case. Recently, the USCCB requested clarification from the Holy See about the obligation to attend Mass when a holy day of obligation in Advent, Lent, or Easter falls on a Sunday and is transferred to Monday. In a memo to U.S. Bishops dated October 10, 2024, Bishop Paprocki communicated the decision of the Dicastery for Legislative Texts: "The feast must be observed as a day of obligation on the day to which it is transferred." The faithful should be reminded that their Sunday obligation and obligation for the Solemnity are two separate obligations and must be observed by attending Mass twice. The obligation for the Second Sunday of Advent may be fulfilled from the evening of Saturday, December 7 through Sunday, December 8 (4:30pm at OLP). The obligation for the Immaculate Conception may be fulfilled anytime on Monday, December 9. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact the Office for Divine Worship." Or feel free to contact me at the parish office. With that in mind, we will have Masses for the Immaculate Conception on Monday at 7am, 12:10pm, 2pm (school) and 5:30pm.

I have always seen the window from December 8th to December 12th (Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe) as a special opportunity to ensure that Mary is part of our Advent preparations for Christmas. In 2019, Pope Francis added the feast of Our Lady of Loreto on December 10th to the universal calendar of the church so now we even have more opportunity to honor Mary in this stretch coming up this week. Our Lady of Loreto is the main Marian devotion in Italy and the shrine holds the Holy House of Nazareth (where we will visit during our Eucharistic Miracles of Italy Pilgrimage in May). There is also a Litany of Loreto to Mary which is the only Litany to Mary officially approved by the Catholic Church and which includes many of the Marian Titles for Mary acknowledged in our Catholic Tradition over the years.

I encourage you to do something extra this week to honor our Blessed Mother. Consider praying the rosary, or a novena to Mary, or the Litany of Loreto (which is included in the bulletin), or refamiliarize yourself with our stain glass windows in the chapel that are dedicated to Mary (and are explained in the hallway outside the sacristy. As a Marian Parish, we can never honor Mary enough. Recall the words of St. Maximilian Kolbe who had a great devotion to Mary... "Never be afraid of loving the Blessed Virgin too much. You can never love her more than Jesus did."

May God bless us in this special Marian window and our second week of Advent ahead! Fr. Rich

****Mass Catechesis Section in the Bulletin** We have begun to periodically include a section in the bulletin called "Our Catholic Faith" which explains parts of the Mass and other parts of our Catholic Tradition that involve liturgy and worship. We planned this as part of the ongoing Eucharistic Revival that is still happening in the National Catholic Church (this is the 3rd of three years); and as a follow up to the "The One Hour to Peace . . . from Mass to Mission" Formation we experienced as a parish last Fall (2023) which gave an overview of the Mass. So keep your eyes open for those sections over the next 8-10 months and let's keep diving deeper in Eucharistic Amazement here at OLP!

**OLP Cursillo... Strive for '25 We are trying something in collaboration with the Cursillo Retreat Movement in our Diocese. We are planning a parish focused Curillo Retreat where OLP parishioners are the team members and we try to have mostly OLP members make the retreat. The Men's Cursillo is on February 21-23, and the Women's Cursillo is on March 21-23. Both take place at Our Lady of Mercy Church in Harborcreek. I am one of the spiritual directors, along with Deacon Ralph, and Mike McLaughlin is the lay leader for the Men's Cursillo. What is Cursillo? "Cursillo (kur-SEE-yo) literally means "little course" and is an intense three-day spiritual retreat, the purpose of which is a deep personal encounter with Jesus Christ. The place of honor it now holds in the life of the Church is due to its faithful use at the shrine of the Holy House at Loreto. It was definitively approved by Pope Sixtus V in 1587, and all other Marian litanies were suppressed, at least for public use. Since then, several Popes have added titles to the Litany, as only they may do.


consider donating it to the **Sew What?** group. Yarn, thread and batting is also needed.






