


Family Discussion of the Week: Respect for Elders

Kids: What do you think it was like for Jesus to be in the Temple for three days without his parents?

SALVATION IN DAILY LIFE

This Sunday is the feast of the Holy Family, which comes on the first Sunday after Christmas Day. Today's feast celebrates how the humanity of Jesus (including his entire family life) has brought saving significance into the daily rhythms of our human family life.

The scriptures offer instruction and encouragement on how to share—within our families, parish families, and the wider human family—the love that God shares with us in Jesus. Selections from Sirach, Psalm 128, and Colossians encourage us to reflect divine love and thus find holiness in all our human relationships. The reading from Matthew's Gospel offers a living example of love in the actions Joseph took to protect his young family from danger and to nurture them within the larger family of faith of their time.



From the Pastor's Desk...

A blessed Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph! I share a reflection from "My Catholic Life"

"In honoring the Holy Family, we also honor all families, big or small. And in honoring all families, we honor the family of God, the Church. But most especially, we focus on the hidden, day-to-day life of the Holy Family of Nazareth.

What was it like to live day in and day out in the household of St. Joseph? What was it like to have Jesus for a son, Mary as a wife and mother, and Joseph as a father and husband? Their home would have certainly been a sacred place and a dwelling of true peace and unity. But it would have also been so much more. The family home of Jesus, Mary and Joseph would have been, in numerous ways, just like any other home. They would have related together, talked, had fun, disagreed, worked, eaten, dealt with problems, and encountered everything else that makes up daily family life.

Of course, the virtues of Jesus and Mary were perfect, and St. Joseph was a truly "just man." Therefore, the overriding characteristic of their home would have been love. But with that said, their family would not have been exempt from daily toil, hurt and challenges that face most families. For example, they would have encountered the death of loved ones, St. Joseph most likely passed away prior to Jesus' public ministry. They would have encountered misunderstandings and gossip from others. Our Blessed Mother, for example, was found with child out of wedlock. This would have been a topic of discussion among many acquaintances for sure. They would have had to fulfill all daily chores, earn a living, put food on the table, attend gatherings of family and friends and the like. They would have lived normal family life in every way.

This is significant because it reveals God's love for family life. The Father allowed His Divine Son to live this life and, as a result, elevated family life to a place within the Trinity. The holiness of the Holy Family reveals to us that every family is invited to share in God's divine life and to encounter ordinary daily life with grace and virtue.

I encourage you to reflect today upon your own family life. Some families are strong in virtue, some struggle with basic communication. Some are faithful day in and day out, some are broken and deeply wounded. No matter the case, know that God wants to enter more deeply into your family life just as it is right now. He desires to give you strength and virtue to live as the Holy Family. Surrender yourself and your family, this day, and invite the Triune God to make your family a holy family."

May God bless our families and the rest of our Christmas Octave ahead!

**Please note that the parish office is closed until Wednesday, January 1st and thank you for understanding the need to give our parish staff a well-deserved break.

- **Christmas Octave
 as an Octave so from Tuesday, December 25 to Wednesday,
 January 1st and our Masses will have full solemnity as if
 Christmas Day with a Gloria, extra music and chant as well as
 the use of the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I).
- **Christmas Season Recall that the Christmas Season lasts for 2 and a half weeks this year. Highlights include the Feast of the Holy Family (Sunday, December 29th), Mary the Mother of God (Wednesday, January 1st), and the Epiphany (Sunday, January 5th when we will have the Proclamation of the dates for Easter and other significant dates of the Liturgical Year and hand out the house blessing cards). The Christmas Season will conclude on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord on Sunday, January 12th when we will a short presentation on the Jubilee Year "Pilgrims of Hope" and the opening of the Holy Door (by Pope Francis on December 24th) at 5:30pm followed by Solemn Evening Prayer with Benediction at 6pm.
- **Holy Hour for Peace We will continue the tradition of ringing in the New Year with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from I Ipm-I2 Midnight on New Year's Eve (Tuesday, December 31st). What a great way to start the new year by receiving the Blessing (Benediction) of Jesus through His Eucharistic Presence right at Midnight! We will pray for peace in our world though a litany of peace. After the Holy Hour there will be time for a champagne toast and fellowship in the rectory.
- **Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God is Wednesday, January 1st and is a holy day of obligation and the last day of the Octave of Christmas. It has also been designated as the World Day of Prayer for Peace. For all of those reasons, it is a great day to participate in Mass which will be held on Tuesday, December 31st at 5:30pm and Wednesday, January 1st at 10am.
- **House Blessings The Christmas Season, and more specifically the Epiphany, is the traditional time of year for house blessings. Fr. Nick and I are more than willing to come to your homes and bless them with you. Feel free to call either one of us.

Basil the Great and Gregory of Nanzianzen, Bishops, Doctors of the Church (4th Century): *Friday, Jan. 3*rd- the Holy Name of Jesus; *Saturday, Jan. 4*th- St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, Religious (early 19th century convert from Episcopalian high society in New York, founder of first Catholic School in the United States).

We received the most donations for the Diocese of Erie and 4th in total raised. This is a major help to support and grow our Adult Faith Formation program. - **Vatican Eucharistic Miracle Exhibit We have extended the time that we will have this exhibit since Advent was thrown off by the big storm. So we rotate through the 3 sets of panels after the Christmas Season from Monday, January 13th through Sunday, February 2nd.






