Family Discussion of the Week: Overcoming Jealousy

Then Herod sent the (magi) to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." (Matthew 2:8)

Adults: When have you been jealous or fearful of another person? When are such feelings harmful?

Kids: When have you been jealous because something good happened to another person instead of you? What is the problem with feeling that way?

LIGHT OF THE WORLD

Epiphany can be understood as an extension of the Nativity of the Lord that we celebrate on December

25. While at Christmas we celebrate Jesus' coming as the long-awaited king and Messiah of the Jewish people, on Epiphany we celebrate the revelation that Jesus is the Savior and Light of all nations—Jews, Gentiles, and all people.

The star shines so brightly that it attracts magi who come from far distant countries to worship Jesus. They are not Jews, yet they are drawn to the Light of the world. The letter to the Ephesians reveals that the Light of the world was for the Gentiles as well as the Jews—Christ gathers all people into the light of his love. The reading from Isaiah also describes a gathering of diverse peoples, but this time it is to the light that emanates from the people of God.

From the Pastor's Desk...

Happy Feast of the Epiphany and Merry Christmas! As we continue in the Christmas Season it is interesting to note that the traditional 12 days of Christmas (December 25-January 6) are not really a part of our liturgical calendar. To add further confusion, in most Catholic churches in the United States, we move the Feast of the Epiphany to the Sunday closest to January 6th. So that is why this Sunday we celebrate the Epiphany and remember the adoration of the Magi.

The recognition of the Christ child by the Magi (gentiles or non-Jews) from other countries was significant as a fulfillment of the Old Testament prophesies and reminds us that the Savior came for ALL peoples (the lowly shepherds and foreigners); and not just for the Jews or more exclusively for the Jewish religious and upper class. It reinforces the universality of our faith, and that Jesus came to save ALL peoples. Recall that the word "catholic" means universal, and the Epiphany is a good time to renew our prayer for all people to know the saving truth of Jesus Christ.

There is great symbolism and tradition surrounding the Epiphany. In some cultures, because of the connection with the gifts of the Magi, families exchange gifts on this day. Each gift from the Magi is symbolic of the different dimensions of the infant Jesus' identity and mission. Gold is associated with royalty to recognize Him as King of Kings, frankincense is associated with the worship of God in the temple to recognize His divinity, and myrrh, the oil associated with preparing the body for burial, to recognize His ultimate purpose to die for our salvation.

This weekend is the traditional time for the Epiphany Proclamation, the announcement of Easter and the movable feasts of the church. See the Proclamation below and make sure you mark the dates on your personal calendar and set aside those most important days of our liturgical year (Holy Week and Easter) for prayer and celebration with your parish family. Do not let those days be an after-thought; make them a priority around which to plan vacations, events, and other things that can keep us from worshiping.

The Christmas Season, and more specifically the Epiphany, is also the traditional time of year for house blessings. Fr. Luke and I are available to come to your homes and bless them with you. Feel free to call either one of us and set up a time to do so.

May God bless our conclusion to the Christmas Season and our week of Ordinary Time ahead!

****Epiphany Announcement of Easter and the Moveable Feasts**

(for the year 2026)

"Know, dear brothers and sisters, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ,

so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior.

On the eighteenth day of February will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season. On the fifth day of April you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the seventeenth day of May will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the twenty-fourth day of May, the feast of Pentecost.

On the seventh day of June the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

On the twenty-ninth day of November, the First Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen."

****House Blessing Cards for 2026 will be blessed and available at all Masses this weekend.** You are encouraged to take the card home, say the prayers with those in your household and then fasten them over the main door of your house. Recall that the letter stand for the names of the Magi, Caspar, Balthasar and Melchior, but also stands for the Latin phrase- "Christus Benedic Mansionem" which means "Christ bless this dwelling place."

****House Blessings** The Christmas Season, and more specifically the Epiphany, is the traditional time of year for house blessings. Fr. Luke and I are more than willing to come to your homes and bless them with you. Feel free to call either one of us and set up a time to do so.

****Masses this Week** *Monday, Jan. 5th- St. John Neumann, Bishop, (20th Century missionary, first American bishop canonized); Tuesday, Jan. 6th- St. Andre Bessette, Religious (20th Century Holy Cross Brother known as the "miracle man of Montreal"); Wednesday, Jan. 7th- St. Raymond of Penyafort, Priest (13th Century Dominican leader after St. Dominic); Thursday, Jan. 8th through Saturday, Jan. 10th. Christmas Weekdays.*




