

# **Sunday's Readings:**

#### Family Discussion of the Week: **Time Accepting Responsibility**

Jesus unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor." (Luke 4:17b-18a) Adults: What do you believe that the anointing you received at baptism requires you to do? *Kids:* What could you do this week for someone who has less than you?

#### GOD'S LAW

Scripture has always held God's law to be the path to human happiness. In today's first reading, Ezra the priest reads the scroll of the law to the people returned from exile. They weep—then are joyful. Israel's relationship with God had always been defined by how they kept and lived God's law. The author of Psalm 96 likewise praises the law of God as the source of wisdom, joy and enlightenment, purity and justice.

In his advice to the bickering Corinthians, Paul points out that, just as God has made all parts of a human body essential for the health of the whole, living as "Christ's body" requires that each member be recognized as necessary for the good of all. Finally, in Luke's Gospel Jesus claims that the Spirit is sending him to relieve human suffering. Like Ezra, he is reading from a scroll, proclaiming God's "law" of mercy to those in need.

On the fifth (5th) day of March will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season.

On the twentieth (20th) day of April you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the twenty-ninth (29th) day of May will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the eighth (8th) day of June, the feast of Pentecost.

On the twenty-second (22nd) day of June the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. On the thirtieth (30th) day of November, the First Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen.




