Family Discussion of the Week: In Another's Shoes

Jesus said, "But I say to you that listen, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you." (Lk. 6:27-28)

Adults: What has allowed you to overcome obstacles and forgive someone who has hurt you?

Kids: When has it been hard to forgive someone who hurt you? What did you do?

LOVE AS GOD LOVES

Our Gospel today continues Jesus' Sermon on the Plain, in which we heard Luke's version of the Beatitudes. This week, Jesus gives us new "commandments," telling us how to live and act in the world as his disciples, rooted in the radical love of God for humanity. It reminds us of his later speech about loving one another as he loves us, in other words with a God-like love, the kind we see in today's psalm about God's mercy. How else could we do as Jesus tells us by loving our enemies, which seems impossible, until we remember that God gave us the example of Jesus, who is like God but also like us? David understands this merciful love when he spares the life of his enemy in the first reading. Finally, Paul tells us that we will become like Jesus if we act as he did, as God does.

Since then, St. Elizabeth's tomb was moved to the Cathedral in Philadelphia.



Come, enjoy some delicious gumbo, activities for kids and time with your spiritual family before we enter the great season of Lent. **Night to Shine Thank you to all who volunteered or donated to the "Night to Shine" prom event for our special needs community. We had 150 guests who were celebrated with a red carpet introduction, dinner, dancing and a special message from Demi and Tim Tebow before they were all crowned kings and gueens of the prom (they all received crowns and tiaras). The parents of the guests are treated to an adult social and time of respite in a separate room. It is always a special night and OLP has been blessed to sponsor it for Erie. A special thank you to Linda Hennigan, Michelle Ohmer and Mary Beth Whitman who helped organize the event! Also, we are looking to solidify the revenue source to cover the \$20,000 it costs to put on this event each year. The Tim Tebow Foundation has helped us regularly with a small grant to help with costs but once a community has the event established for a few years, they no longer financially support it. 


