

#### Family Discussion of the Week: Salvation Through Faith

For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved." (Rom. 10:13) Adults: How willing are you to profess your faith in Jesus Christ openly to others? Kids: Would you still be able to say that you believe in Jesus if others made fun of you for it?

#### IN THE DESERT

Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days, and then the devil tested him. Moses and the Israelites had been in the desert for forty years before being led to the land of milk and honey. There were times when they called out to God, sure that, as Saint Paul wrote to the Romans, "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." We sometimes spend time in the desert as well. Not a literal desert most of the time, but a desert in which it seems difficult to perceive God's presence, times when we face difficulty and are tempted to leave God's ways behind. #### From the Pastor's Desk...

Please pray for Pope Francis as his physical condition declines. Also this Sunday, March 9<sup>th</sup> we celebrate the Rite of Sending with our OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) and OCIC (Order of Christian Initiation of children) candidates at the I I am Mass. We "send" the candidates to the Rite of Election with Bishop Persico which takes place at St. Peter Cathedral at 3pm. These rites are the beginning of the Period of Enlightenment which is the catechumens (those preparing for Baptism) and candidates (those preparing for Eucharist and Confirmation) final period of preparation for entering full communion with us in the Catholic faith (at the Easter Vigil- April 19<sup>th</sup>).

Other notes from the pastor...

- \*\*The 6th Grade students from OLP School will be leading us in prayer through the LIVING STATIONS this Friday, March 14th. I thank the school for offering this to the parish and hope you will take advantage of it.
- \*\*Please keep the Blessed Sacrament Parish and School communities in your prayers as they deal with the decision of the Erie Catholic School System (ECSS) to close the school. These are never easy decisions and it is understandably a very sensitive issue. I would like to address a few questions I have been asked and a few misconceptions that are out there. I heard some people suggesting that the parents of school families found out

the school was closing through the news. That is incorrect. ECSS made every effort to personally inform the faculty and staff as parents were being notified simultaneously via email. Not everyone agrees with the process of how it was handled but there is never a perfect way to ensure that everyone hears the way you hope with today's instant communication.

Some people have expressed that they were blindsided by the announcement. I know that the principals, pastors and faculty were all aware that a national company was conducting a study of the System over the last six months and that closures could be recommended. With the Blessed Sacrament School enrollment being 52% of what it was 8 years ago, it seemed that Blessed Sacrament School would most likely be the one recommended.

I know my first reaction was wondering if teachers, students and their families could have been notified that this was a possibility months ago or last year, so they had time to make an effort to turn things around. But the more I thought about that and talked to others, the more I understood that in past situations of this nature, when you bring up the possibility of future closings, it leads to a very unstable school environment where many teachers and families leave to get ahead of the closing and then it becomes a self-fulfilling prophecy. So it really seems to me there is no good way to approach this; if you warn people it could be coming it leads to a quicker downfall and if you wait to say something until it has to be done then people are shocked. I am sympathetic with this challenge and believe the System did their best to handle this professionally and responsibly. As always, let me know if you have any questions or concerns on this.

- \*\*Please keep our children who celebrated their First
  Reconciliation this weekend in your prayers. May they know the great gift of peace and joy that comes from this concrete encounter with the love and mercy of God!
- \*\*Stations of the Cross will be held on Fridays during Lent. On March 14<sup>th</sup> students from OLP will present Living Stations.

  Confessions will be heard from 6-7pm each night before Stations.
- \*\*St. Joseph Table and Feast OLP will continue its tradition of celebrating the Feast of St. Joseph, the patron of the Universal Catholic Church, with the traditional St. Joseph Table. The Table will be held on Tuesday, March 19<sup>th</sup> at 6pm in the cafeteria. We will gather for a prayer service of 10-15 minutes followed by a meatless meal. Part of the tradition of the St. Joseph Table is to provide food for those in need so you are asked to bring non-perishable food or monetary donations that will go to the West Millcreek Food Pantry.
- \*\*OLP Cursillo... Strive for '25 Recently we had over 15 men of the parish participate in Cursillo #255; now the women are encouraged to sign up for Women's Cursillo #263 taking place March 21-23 at Our Lady of Mercy Church in Harborcreek. There are several women of the parish on the team as well.

Here's a little info about Cursillo: "Cursillo (kur-SEE-yo) literally means "little course" and is an intense three-day spiritual retreat, the purpose of which is a deep personal encounter with Jesus Christ. Those who experience the Cursillo Movement know it is more than just three days of religious instruction. It is an effort to change the spiritual environment, to bring Jesus Christ

into the world." See www.eriecursillo.org to register online or stop by the office for a form.

\*\*Lenten Confessions In addition to our normal weekly confession times (Wednesdays from 11:15am-Noon, Saturdays from 8:30-9am and 3:45-4:45pm) we will have extra opportunities throughout Lent. They are Fridays from 6-7pm (before Stations) and after all Sunday Masses including 4:30pm. "The Light is On for You" is Wednesday, April 9th from 5-7pm (local churches are open and priests are hearing confessions).

\*\* Masses this Week Monday, March 10<sup>th</sup> through Saturday, March 15<sup>th</sup>- Lenten Weekdays (first full week of Lent).

\*\*Catholic Services Appeal 2025 In the Gospel of John, Jesus prays: "That they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you" (Jn 17:21). One Faith, One Family is an invitation for all of us at Our Lady of Peace Parish to deepen our commitment to live this unity in our shared faith and common mission as one family in Christ.

\*\*Walking with the American Saints

Our 5-part series on the American Saints begins this week. The journey is led by myself, Sr. Kathleen and Fr. Nick. Saints are not just individuals who lived long ago in far of places. They have lived the call to holiness in recent centuries and on our continent and hopefully they inspire us to strive for that holiness in our lives. There are presently 11 Saints who lived on US soil either before or after the founding of our country and there are six Blesseds who are one step/approved miracle away from being canonized saints.

I look forward to my presentations on St. Theodore Guerin from Indiana who's shrine I was able to visit last October when I was on my annual retreat, and on St. Katherine Drexel who is from our very own state of Pennsylvania and who's shrine I visited during Pope Francis' first papal visit to the United States

in 2015 for the World Gathering of Families. Since then, St. Elizabeth's tomb was moved to the Cathedral in Philadelphia. We hope to see you on Tuesday's during Lent from 7:00-8:00PM in the church.

\*\*Personal Lenten Spiritual Plan | I cannot encourage you enough to make a plan for your Lenten commitments in those areas of prayer, fasting and almsgiving (giving to the poor). Here are some opportunities at OLP to consider during Lent: -DAILY MASS (it has been a powerful Catholic tradition to commit to this pray more regularly during Lent). -Celebrate Mass on 3 special feasts in March... the Feast of St. Patrick, the Patron Saint of the Diocese of Erie on Monday, March 17th; the Solemnity of St. Joseph, the Patron Saint of the Universal Church on Wednesday, March 19th (see below about the Table that day as well), and the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord on Tuesday, March 25th (when we genuflect during the Creed like at Christmas).-Daily Rosary is said at 11:35am in the main church from Monday through Friday. "Walking with the American Saints" Series on Lenten Tuesdays from 7-8pm in the church, -Stations of the Cross at 7pm on all Fridays during Lent. -St. Joseph Table on Wednesday, March 19th at 6pm in the school cafeteria which includes a prayer service and blessing of the food and then a meal. People are encouraged to bring nonperishable food or monetary donations for the West Millcreek Food Pantry.-24 Hours for the Lord at St. Peter Cathedral with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Confessions available for 24 straight hours from 5:45pm Friday, March 28th until Saturday, March 29th at 3:30pm (which Sr. Kathleen and OLP is organizing). -Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Friday, March 7th and Friday, April 4th from 7:30am-7pm and April 15th and 16th (Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week) from Ipm to 12 Noon (23 hours straight). -Operation Rice Bowl (given to all children in Faith Formation or at the school and in the bulletin) to support Catholic Relief Services. -"the Light is On for You" where confessions are heard at all participating local parishes from 5-7pm on Wednesday, April 9th.

In addition to these communal opportunities, see my notes for the full Confession schedule for Lent. Also, the Hallow App has another great Lenten Challenge called Pray40 that I would recommend. Whatever you decide for your plan, Lent should look different for us as Catholics so let's get ready to begin to renew our spiritual health.

\*\*OLP will be leading a Pilgrimage to Sights and Sounds Theatre in Lancaster to see their production of "Noah" on June 17-19, 2025. "Noah" is the show that originally propelled Sights and Sounds to National awareness. We will also be stopping at St. Leo's Church in Ridgway, PA which Bishop Persico has

designated as a special destination of pilgrimage for the Jubilee Year in the Diocese of Erie where special indulgences may be received. A \$50 per person deposit will hold your spot. The bus fills quickly, so get your


