

### Family Discussion of the Week: **Tempered With Humility**

The reign of God is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in the garden; it grew and became a tree, and the birds of the air made nests in its branches. (Lk. 13:19b) Adults: What important work could bear fruit in your life right now if you have more confidence in God's loving care?

Kids: What great work would you like to do as you grow older? What can you do to begin now?

#### MID-LENT CHECK-IN

God says to Moses, "This is what you shall tell the Israelites: I AM sent me to you... The LORD, the God of your [ancestors], the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, the God of Jacob" (Exodus 3:14, 15). As Jesus would later say, God is not a God of the dead, but of the living, and so we believe that the dead will one day rise. At this midpoint of Lent, we pause to consider how our repentance is leading us to the Resurrection, to our reunion with the great "I AM." Part of our repentance involves working to secure justice for all and helping our neighbor to live in God's ways. We encourage each other and nurture each other, like the compassionate gardener of today's Gospel, who tells the owner of the orchard that he will nurture the tree, fertilize it, and perhaps it will bear fruit. ## From the Pastor's Desk...

A blessed 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Lent to you! "24 Hours for the Lord" is a Lenten initiative introduced by Pope Francis that encourages 24 hours of Eucharistic adoration and the Sacrament of Reconciliation, inviting the faithful to experience God's mercy. The Catholic Church of Erie will be observing "24 Hours for the Lord" at St. Peter Cathedral Parish, located at 230 W. 10th St., Erie, beginning on Friday, March 28 with a 5:15PM Mass celebrated by Bishop Persico, followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Stations of the Cross at 7PM, Evening Prayer at IOPM and Night Prayer. The event will continue on Saturday, March 29 starting at 3AM with the Divine Mercy Chaplet, Morning Prayer at 6:30AM, an 8AM Mass with Bishop Persico, the Rosary at 12PM, another Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3PM, Benediction at 3:30PM and concluding with the 4PM Vigil Mass. Throughout this 24-hour period, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed and the Sacrament of Confession will be available, offering a profound opportunity to pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life while experiencing the Lord's abundant mercy.

Sr. Kathleen has organized this event in the past for our Diocese and is doing it again this year as part of our staff at OLP. I have told her she has the full support of our parish, and I volunteered our parish to cover the hours of Midnight to 6AM for adoration. I hope you all will make an effort to be a part of this great opportunity for grace (you are free to go to any of the 24 hours and are not just limited to the ones OLP has agreed to cover) and please see elsewhere in the bulletin for what hours still need to be covered. I also thank the different ministries and groups from OLP who have committed to taking an hour of adoration already.

May God bless our 3<sup>rd</sup> Week of Lent ahead including our "24 Hours for the Lord!"

- \*\*Thank you to Pete and Debbie Piotrowski for covering the cost of the Paschal Candle, which we will light at the Great Easter Vigil on April 19<sup>th</sup>, in memory of Richard and Joan Sahovey and Joseph & Magdalena Piotrowski.
- \*\* Masses this Week Monday, March 24<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday, March 26<sup>th</sup> through Saturday, March 29<sup>th</sup>. Lenten Weekdays; Tuesday, March 25<sup>th</sup> the Annunciation of the Lord.
- \*\*Stations of the Cross will be held on Fridays of Lent (March 28; April 4 and 11) at 7pm. Consider adding Stations of the Cross to your Lenten sacrifice this year, especially if you have not ever with prayed them. Confessions will be heard from 6-7pm before Stations.

- \*\*Lenten Confessions In addition to our normal weekly confession times (Wednesdays from 11:15am-Noon, Saturdays from 8:30-9am and 3:45-4:45pm) we will have extra opportunities throughout Lent. They are Fridays from 6-7pm (before Stations) and after all Sunday Masses including 4:30pm. "The Light is On for You" is Wednesday, April 9th from 5-7pm (local churches are open and priests hearing confessions throughout Erie).
- \*\*Mass Intentions/Mass Schedule at OLP We are opening the Mass Intention Book for the rest of 2025 on April 2<sup>nd</sup>. Until now we had only opened January to June of 2025 because there was talk of a collective effort by the Diocese to evaluate the Mass schedule for all churches in and around Erie. After further consideration, the Bishop and Diocesan leadership have decided not to initiate that and are leaving it up to individual parishes to consider the need to adjust their Mass schedules. I can tell you that I have tasked our leadership at OLP to create a process to look at our schedule and consider if we need to make changes. Looking at the October Count for the Diocese of Erie (all parishes are asked to get a count on the number of people attending each weekend Mass throughout October each year), although OLP had the highest weekly average in 2024 of 1,140 people per weekend (with the next closest being St. James- 865, St. Jude- 768, St. George-767, Blessed Sacrament-753, St. Patrick at 750 and St. Peter-598), that is only one third of the weekly attendance we had in 2005 when we had 6 Masses a weekend. Our church can hold approximately 800-900 people so 5 Masses could handle 4000-4500 per weekend so we are at about 25% capacity overall. So let's pray that the Holy Spirit guide this process that we are beginning and inspire what is best for our parish and diocese regarding our Mass schedule at OLP.
- \*\*Catholic Services Appeal 2025 We presently have 262
  Pledges for \$134,762. Thank you to all who have pledged! Our goal is 400 pledges for \$227,600 and our parish project is the renovation of the rectory kitchen as well as the replacing the flooring for the first floor. Please consider making a pledge if you have not already. Pledge envelopes are at the doors of the church or at the parish office.
- \*\*Walking with the American Saints Our 5-part series on the American Saints continues. This journey is led by myself, Sr. Kathleen and Fr. Nick. Saints are not just individuals who lived long ago in far of places. They have lived the call to holiness in recent centuries and on our continent and hopefully, they inspire us to strive for that holiness in our lives. There are presently 11 Saints who live on US soil either before or after the founding of our country and there are six "Blesseds" who are one step/approved miracle away from being canonized saints.

This week, I will give a presentations on St. Theodore Guerin from Indiana who's shrine I was able to visit last October when I was on my annual retreat, and on April 8<sup>th</sup>, St. Catherine Drexel who is from our very own state of Pennsylvania and who's shrine I visited during Pope Francis' first papal visit to the United States in 2015 for the World Gathering of Families. Since then, St. Catherine's tomb was moved to the Cathedral in Philadelphia.


\*\*Jubilee 2025 Page 8 has our schedule for celebrating the Jubilee at OLP. Masses for the Jubilees that pertain to you (maybe you are in a band or play sports so you would come the weekend of June 14/15 for a special blessing) and to invite others to join us for the blessing as well. The groups identified in our schedule are all being invited to the Vatican where they will have Jubilee days of prayer. We could not celebrate all these groups individually or at the same times as the Vatican so we grouped them together in a way that works for our parish schedule. Our next Jubilee Mass at OLP will be April 5/6 for the Sick/World Health (April 5-6)/Disability (April 28-29)- we will have the Sacrament of ANOINTING of the Sick AT THE 5PM April 5th Mass.



The papal encyclical Humanae Vitae (On Human Life) made headlines worldwide. Many talked about the encyclical when it was issued in 1968, but few actually read it. Why is it perhaps the most controversial document in modern Church history?



Humanae Vitae is Pope Paul VI's explanation of why the Catholic Church rejects contraception. The pope referred to two aspects, or meanings, of human sexuality: the unitive and the procreative. He also warned of the consequences if contraception became widely practiced—consequences that have since come to pass.
