

Serra Prayer for Vocations

From the Pastor's Desk...

A blessed Laetare Sunday to you! We are less than a month away from THE SACRED TRIDUUM! Sundown on Holy Thursday (April 17th) to sundown on Easter Sunday (April 20th) is considered the most solemn part of the liturgical year. MARK YOUR CALENDARS NOW! Usually I wait until Palm Sunday to promote the Triduum the following week, but the last two years at the encouragement of the Liturgy Committee, I started promoting it sooner as a way to reinforce how important and special it is. I also want to again directly challenge you to attend these special liturgies this year (especially if you have not experienced them before). When our parish comes together for these days in prayer and communion with each other, there is a palpable grace and presence of the Holy Spirit that everyone should experience and that increases as more of us gather. I will explain more about the Sacred Triduum and Holy Thursday in this week's column, and then explain Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter in the next two weeks.

This three-day period is referred to as **the Easter Triduum, also known as the Sacred Triduum, or Paschal Triduum**. The word "triduum" comes from the Latin word triduum, which comes from tris ("three") + dies ("day").

Basically, the Sacred Triduum is one great festival recounting the last three days of Jesus' life on earth, the events of his Passion and Resurrection, when the Lamb of God laid down his life in atonement for our sins. A quote from our bishops... "Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery" (USCCB).

It is known as the "Paschal Mystery" because it is the ultimate fulfillment of the ancient Jewish Passover (or Pasch), which itself was a recollection of how God brought the Jews out of their slavery in Egypt. The spotless lamb was slaughtered at the Passover meal and consumed—that same night the destroying angel "passed over" the homes marked with the blood of the Passover Lamb, and those covered by the Blood were saved. This was the Old Testament pre-figurement of Jesus' work at the Last Supper—where he inserted himself as the Paschal Lamb—and Calvary, where the sacrifice was offered to save us from our slavery to sin. With the Holy Eucharist, we consume the victim that died for our sins. The Paschal Mystery is, therefore, God's plan of redemption for the fallen human race through the passion, death, and resurrection of the God-man Jesus Christ. It is one marvelous event stretched out over three days.

HOLY THURSDAY, APRIL 17th- The evening Mass on Holy Thursday (at 7pm at OLP) is referred to as The Mass of the Lord's Supper. This is where the Church re-lives the institution of the Eucharist and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass at the Last Supper, as well as the institution of the priesthood, which took place the evening before Jesus was crucified. After the homily there is an optional "washing of the feet" ceremony, where the priest washes the feet of others to signify his role as servant—just as Jesus did with his disciples. Extra hosts are consecrated at this Mass to be used on Good Friday when no Mass will be celebrated.

The Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday concludes with a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the "altar of repose," a place where the consecrated Host is kept, away from the main altar where Mass is normally celebrated. (at OLP this is held in

the school cafeteria). Many parishes create space for people to stay and pray with the reposed Eucharist at this altar of repose late into the night, remembering Jesus' request in the Garden of Gethsemane for someone to "watch and pray" with Him. (at OLP we do this from 8:15-11pm at which time we pray Night Prayer (Liturgy of the Hours) and then public prayer ends).

May God bless our 4th Week of Lent ahead! Yours in Christ,

Other notes from the pastor...

**Jubilee Weekend for the Sick/World Health/Disability AND
Anointing of the Sick Mass

Weekend at OLP will be April 5/6 for the Sick/World Health
(April 5-6)/Disability (April 28-29)- we will have the Sacrament
of ANOINTING of the Sick at the 5PM Mass on April 5th
Mass.

**Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick Next weekend we will have the Anointing of the Sick Mass at OLP (April 5th at 5pm) where we will administer the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. This is a unique Mass because it involves the SACRAMENT of Anointing of the Sick. In this sacrament we pray for healing for our recipients as well as the grace to "suffer well." We pray to be strengthened in the virtue of hope so that the cross of our sickness does not tempt us to despair. Remember that this sacrament is NOT FOR EVERYONE but for those who fit in one of the following categories:

- those who are dangerously ill through sickness or old age (physical or psychological)
- a sick person...before surgery whenever the surgery is necessitated by a dangerous illness
- elderly people...if they are weak, though not dangerously ill
- sick children...sufficiently mature to be comforted by the sacrament
- sick people who have lost consciousness or who have lost the use of reason...if ...they would have requested it if they had been in possession of their faculties

Of course, if a sick person who received this anointing recovers his/her health, he/she can in the case of another serious illness receive this sacrament again. If during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious, the sacrament may be repeated as well. So if this applies to you or someone you know, please join us at this special Mass of healing and grace. Please arrive early so you can sign in and find your seats. If you are not in need of the sacrament or prayers for healing yourself, I encourage you to come join us as we pray with and for those in our community who are carrying the cross of significant physical or psychological illness.

**Mass Intentions/Mass Schedule at OLP We are opening the Mass Intention Book for the rest of 2025 on April 2nd. Until now, the book was only open through June of 2025 because there was talk of a collective effort by the Diocese to evaluate the Mass schedule for all churches in and around Erie. After further consideration, the Bishop and Diocesan leadership have decided not to initiate that and are leaving it up to individual parishes to consider the need to adjust their Mass schedules. I can tell you that I have tasked our leadership at OLP to look at our schedule and consider if we need to make changes. Looking at the October Count for the Diocese of Erie (all parishes are asked to get a count on the number of people attending each weekend Mass throughout October each year), although OLP had the highest weekly average in 2024 of 1,140 people per weekend (with the next closest being St. James- 865, St. Jude-768, St. George-767, Blessed Sacrament-753, St. Patrick at 750 and St. Peter-598), that is only one third of the weekly attendance we had in 2005 when we had 6 Masses each weekend. Our church can hold approximately 800-900 people so with 5 Masses we could handle 4000-4500 per weekend; so we are at about 25% capacity overall. So let's pray that the Holy Spirit guide this process that we are beginning and inspire what is best for our parish and diocese regarding our Mass schedule at OLP.

- **Stations of the Cross are held each Friday of Lent. Join us on April 4th and 11th at 7pm. Confessions are heard from 6-7pm every night of the Stations.
- **Lenten Confessions In addition to our normal weekly confession times (Wednesdays from 11:15am-Noon, Saturdays from 8:30-9am and 3:45-4:45pm) we have extra opportunities throughout Lent. They are Fridays from 6-7pm (before Stations) and after all Sunday Masses including 4:30pm. "The Light is On for You" is Wednesday, April 9th from 5-7pm (local churches are open and priests hearing confessions throughout Erie)
- **Walking with the American Saints Our 5-part series on the American Saints continues. This journey is led by myself, Sr. Kathleen and Fr. Nick. Saints are not just individuals who lived long ago in far of places. They have lived the call to holiness in recent centuries and on our continent and hopefully, they inspire us to strive for that holiness in our lives. There are presently 11 Saints who live on US soil either before or after the founding of our country and there are six "Blesseds" who are one step/approved miracle away from being canonized saints.

This week we will learn about St. Damian of Molokai and on April 8^{th} , Fr. Rich will close us out with St. Katharine Drexel who is from our very own state of Pennsylvania.

**Faithful to the Finish 5K Our 11th Annual 5K will be held on Saturday, May 10th at 8am at Presque Isle. Remember that all funds raised by our 5K will go towards building up our Parish Endowment which we started several years ago with the Catholic Foundation of NWPa. As we prepare to celebrate the 70th Anniversary of the OLP your support of the 5K will ensure the ministry of Our Lady of Peace for years to come! See elsewhere in the bulletin for how you, your business or employer can be a sponsor or how to register and participate in this fun 5K walk/race.

- **Catholic Services Appeal 2025 We presently have 312 Pledges for \$173,720. Thank you to all who have pledged! We have exceeded our assessment to the Diocese of Erie (\$151,000) but our goal is 400 pledges for \$227,000 and our parish project is the renovation of the rectory kitchen as well as the replacing the flooring for the first floor. 

Carrying the Cross with Christ this Lent

We are now far along on our Lenten journey. **Are you walking with Jesus?** Last week you were encouraged to participate in the Stations of the Cross some time this Lent. This week, let us especially think about the second Station: Jesus Accepts His Cross, with the words of St. John Paul II.

Through Christ's acceptance of the Cross, men will come to know that *God is love*. Love without limits: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life" (Jn 3:16). This truth about God was revealed in the cross. The Father chose the Cross for his Son, and his Son shouldered it, carried it to Mount Calvary and on it offered his life.

Lord Jesus Christ, who accept the Cross at the hand of men to make of it the sign of God's saving love for humanity, grant us and all the men and women of our time the grace of faith in this infinite love. To you, O Jesus, Priest and Victim, be praise and glory for ever. Amen (John Paul II, Via Crucis, 2000)


