From the Pastor's Desk...

"Christ Is Risen...He is Risen Indeed!" Every year on Easter I talk about this traditional Paschal greeting which is still used in many Eastern Catholic and Orthodox churches, and some Roman Catholic Churches. This greeting goes back to the early church and reinforced the ultimate significance of what we celebrate on Easter Sunday... that the resurrection of Jesus Christ is the defining truth for all Christians. It was said in a dialogue form in which one Christian would greet another with "Christus resurrexit!" (Latin for Christ is Risen!) and the other would respond "Vere resurrexit!" (He is Risen Indeed!). This form of greeting reminds us that our identity as Christians should be the first and most significant dimension of who we are.

Speaking of rising, next weekend I will be announcing the start of a new plan to bring new life and resurrection to our parish campus! (actually it's a return to an old plan that started when I first came to Our Lady of Peace over 7 years ago). So please keep an eye out for our bulletin, our weekly parish enewsletter and be ready to hear a little about it.

Also speaking of rising... congratulations to our newly initiated members of the Church: Franchesa O'Neill Carino, Cassius Fyke, Caleb Casey, Drew Dennington, Craig Johnston, Mark Keinath, Kyle Lazenby, Brandon Leuellen, Scott Russell, Devin Sharp, Joe Sierota and Nate Steis. And I thank the OCIA Team-Deacon John and Tammie Mang, Michael and Denise Gaines, who worked with these individuals since last August to help prepare them for this special step in their journey of faith. This year's "class" was particularly inspiring through their faith, their stories of conversion, their authentic desire to go deeper in relationship with God and their appreciation for the Catholic Church. I cannot wait to see the great things that God will continue to accomplish in and through them!

I also extend much gratitude to everyone who helped plan and execute the Liturgies of Holy Week and the Sacred Triduum here at OLP- Brian Kuzmin (Director of Music and Liturgy), the Environment Committee and Alburn Florists, our Festival Ensemble Choir as well as our song leaders, all liturgical ministers who volunteered to serve (including our Masters of Ceremony and our two sacristans, Warren Beaver and Karen Martin, who worked all the liturgies), and our staff who put in overtime including our parochial vicar, Fr. ******<u>Masses this Week</u> April 21^{st} - Monday of the Easter Octave; April 22^{nd} - Tuesday of the Easter Octave; April 23^{rd} -Wednesday of the Easter Octave; April 24^{th} - Thursday of the Easter Octave; April 25^{th} - Friday of the Easter Octave; April 26^{th} - Saturday of the Easter Octave.

****Easter Octave** The celebration of Easter cannot be exhausted or limited to one day, so we as Catholics reserve 8 of them, the OCTAVE of EASTER, to celebrate as Easter Day. The celebration of this most central part of our Christian faith, the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, reminds us that the resurrection of Jesus, and its result, the conquering of sin and death FOREVER, requires a full week, plus one, to celebrate. We know that the celebration of the hope and joy the resurrection brings is actually what we celebrate EVERY SUNDAY (and what we celebrate for the 50 days of the Easter Season), but in these 8 days we amplify the FESTIVE REALITY of Easter. The most concrete way we celebrate the octave is at daily Mass where the prayers for Easter Sunday are said every day. The Gospel readings at Mass recount many of the post resurrection appearances of Jesus to the apostles and disciples. Also, the Easter dismissal at Mass ("Go in Peace, Alleluia, Alleluia") is used all week. Consider joining in daily Mass or find your own way to honor the octave but the key is to celebrate all week! **Divine Mercy Sunday/Confessions and Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration The Octave of Easter ends next Sunday, April 27th.

The fact that it is the last day of the Easter Octave is reason enough to be joyful, BUT it is also the celebration of a relatively new feast in our Catholic calendar called Divine Mercy Sunday. In April 2000, Pope John Paul II declared the 2nd Sunday of Easter to be Divine Mercy Sunday in the Universal Church. In 1931, Our Lord appeared to Saint Faustina (Helen Kowalska) near Krakow, Poland. She writes about this vision in "The Diary of St. Faustina, Divine Mercy in My Soul." In the vision she saw Jesus clothed in a white garment with His right hand raised in blessing. His left hand was touching His garment in the area of the heart, from where two large rays came forth, one red and the other pale. She gazed intently at the Lord in silence, her soul filled with awe, but also with great joy. Jesus said to her: "Paint an image according to the pattern you see with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You ... I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over [its] enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I Myself will defend it as My own glory" (47, 48) ... "I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature: 'Jesus, I trust in You' " (327). The image painted to St. Faustina's description will be displayed in Church throughout this week. Jesus also asked St. Faustina to promote a new prayer for devotion to Divine Mercy. This led to the Divine Mercy Chaplet which we will sing during our Divine Mercy Holy Hour next Sunday at 3:00pm. There are pamphlets detailing how to say this prayer (as well as explaining the Divine Mercy Devotion) at all the doors of the church. We will also have an hour of confessions from 2-3pm next Sunday as well. Hopefully, this feast can motivate all of us to learn more about this great devotion to God's love and mercy, but even more importantly to ask for it!

****Catholic Services Appeal 2025** We presently have 346 Pledges for \$197,986. Thank you to all who have pledged! We have exceeded our assessment to the Diocese of Erie (\$151,000) but our goal is 400 pledges for \$227,000 and our parish project is the renovation of the rectory kitchen as well as the replacing of the flooring for the first floor. **National Day of Prayer/ All Day Adoration at OLP The National Day of Prayer is an annual observance held on the first Thursday of May, inviting people to pray for the nation. It was created in 1952 by a joint resolution of the United States Congress, and signed into law by President Harry S. Truman. The Task Force is a privately funded organization whose purpose is to encourage participation on the National Day of Prayer. It exists to communicate with every individual the need for personal repentance and prayer, to create appropriate materials, and to mobilize the Christian community to intercede for America's leaders and its families. The Task Force represents a Judeo-Christian expression of the national observance, based on our understanding that this country was birthed in prayer and in reverence for the God of the Bible. So, we have switched our First Friday Adoration to Thursday, May 1st as a way to encourage the National Day of Prayer for our country. It begins at 7:30am and continues in the chapel until Benediction at 7pm. ** "OLP Faithful to the Finish 5K Next month is our 11th Annual "Faithful to the Finish" 5K Run/Walk at Presque Isle State Park at 8am (Saturday, May 10th). Part of our mission at Our Lady of Peace is to ensure that the Christian way of life continues not just in our generation, but for generations to come. One way we can do that is by supporting our Parish Endowment that we was established with the Catholic Foundation of NWPA. For the past 4 years all the money raised by our annual Faithful to the Finish 5K has gone towards the OLP Parish Endowment. We started the endowment at \$10,000 in 2022 and it is now up to \$57,765 so let's keep it growing! Unfortunately, I will not be at the 5K this year because of the pilgrimage to Italy (May 5-16) but know I will be with you in spirit and prayer!



I was sitting in the dentist's chair. My mouth was wide open and full of various dental instruments designed to keep it that way. I wasn't looking forward to a rollicking good time. I was, frankly, nervous. It occurred to me that I should pray while dreading the procedure which was about to begin. The only words which came to mind were: "I believe in God, the Father almighty ... " I prayed it-with conviction-and it struck me how powerful those words are, how sold and foundational, how grounding.

We pray the Creed as a congregation every Sunday and Solemnity. At the Easter Masses, the Creed is replaced by a renewal of baptismal promises in the form of questions and answers. This brings home to us what we are doing every time we say the Creed together: we are reaffirming our beliefs and our commitment to those beliefs. So, next time you pray the Creed or renounce Satan and his empty promises, do it with conviction and with gratitude for the gift of faith.

Office for the Protection of Children/Youth

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments - Child Abuse Prevention Month: Be Vigilant: It is vitally important that we are constantly vigilant concerning the behaviors of those who interact with children and communicating our concerns to the appropriate parties. Each one of us can play an important role in strengthening this culture of prevention. For example, we can better prevent abuse by ensuring that the signs of abuse are identified and reported. Noticing these warning signs, taking them seriously, and reporting them could prevent abuse in the future. When we witness inappropriate behavior or something that just doesn't seem quite right, we must report our concerns through the appropriate channels.
