SHEPHERDS LIKE JESUS

Each year this Fourth Sunday of Easter celebrates Jesus the Good Shepherd. Today's Gospel seems especially timely, for as Christians worldwide suffer persecution like Paul and Barnabas, Jesus promises his sheep enduring, invincible safety: "They shall never perish. No one can take them out of my hand." But we who are free to live our faith peacefully sometimes take our membership in Jesus' flock for granted, wandering astray to seek our own pleasure and prosperity. The simple cross that Pope Francis always wears seems to show us how Jesus responds to that. Francis's cross features an image of Jesus, who has sought and found a lost sheep, then joyfully set it on his shoulders to carry it gently home. May Good Shepherd Sunday inspire us, so often lost and found ourselves, to assist Jesus in seeking, finding, and gently carrying home our fellow precious lambs.

From the Pastor's Desk...

Last weekend I announced that our parish leadership has reinitiated the process for consideration of a significant renovation to our Church and Parish Campus that initially began back in 2018. More will be coming in the weeks and months ahead about that RE-CREATION plan but for now I want to ask our entire parish to join our parish patron, Our Lady of Peace, in the "upper room" to seek the inspiration of the Holy Spirit for a new Pentecost for our parish that will lead to a new birth of Jesus at our parish through this process.

The prayer plan will look like this... between May 15^{th} (the anniversary of our Church Dedication-May 15, 1977) and September 30^{th} (the 70^{th} anniversary of the founding of our parish-September 30, 1955) everyone in our parish will be asked to pray specific Marian prayers. There will be some creative ways for you to acknowledge the prayers you have said. We hope to accumulate thousands of prayers to Mary for this purpose of new birth at OLP by September 30^{th} and that these prayers will pave the way for the next steps in our re-creation process in the Fall.

The first prayer we will pray collectively starting on THURSDAY, May 15th (the 48th Anniversary of the Dedication of OLP Church) is to Mary Undoer of Knots. Pick up a prayer card at any of the church exits or stop by the office. It seems fitting to start with this devotion that was popularized by Pope Francis as we continue to consider his legacy. Of the many devotions Pope Francis promoted during his pontificate, perhaps none is better known than his devotion to Our Lady, Undoer of Knots (also referred to as Our Lady, Untier of Knots), whose feast day is observed Sept. 28.

While it has been reported that Pope Francis encountered the painting while studying in Germany, the pope pointed out in a 2017 interview with German news outlet Zeit that he has never been to Augsburg. What happened, he explained in the interview, was that a nun whom he had met while in Germany sent him a card at Christmas with the image on it. The picture made an impression on the future pope, who noted that the devotion is based on a quote from St. Irenaeus: "The knot of Eve's disobedience was untied by Mary's obedience: what the virgin Eve bound through her disbelief, Mary loosened by her faith" ("Against Heresies," 3, 22, 4, as quoted in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, No. 494).

The pope said he liked the image so much that he started sending postcards of it, too. Replicas of the image were painted in the pope's home country, Argentina, and devotion there spread. Once Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio was elected pope in 2013, devotion to Our Lady, Undoer of Knots spread throughout the world. Francis has talked about the devotion throughout his pontificate, even praying specifically to Our Lady, Undoer of Knots in 2021 during the coronavirus pandemic.

Say the prayer to Mary Undoer of Knots (prayer on the next column) every day for our parish re-creation plan and for whatever personal intentions you may have and then untie one of the fabric pieces from the prayer fence and place it in the prayer bowl. This will continue until May 31st, the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary at which time we will start a Novena until Pentecost on June 8th (more details to come).

Prayer to Mary Undoer of Knots:

"O Virgin Mary, faithful Mother who never refuses to come to the aid of your children; Mother whose hands never cease to help, because they are moved by the loving kindness that exists in your Immaculate Heart, cast your eyes of compassion upon me, and see the snarl of knots that exists in my life. You know all the pains and sorrows caused by these tangled knots. Mary, my Mother, I entrust to your loving hands the entire ribbon of my life. In your hands there is no knot which cannot be undone. Most holy Mother, pray for Divine assistance to come to my aid. Take this knot (mention need) into your maternal hands this day; I beg you to undo it for the glory of God, once and for all, in the name of your Divine Son, Jesus Christ. Amen. Mary, Undoer of Knots, pray for me."

May God bless our parish re-creation and our 4th week of Easter ahead!

**A Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration for Vocations will be held Monday, May 12th at 6:30pm (Sunday, May 11th is World Day of Prayer for Vocations).

**Our Parish Jubilee for Bishops (June 25)/Priests (June 25-27)/ Deacons (Feb 21- 23)/ Seminarians (June 23-24)/ and Consecrated Life (Oct 8-9) will be THIS weekend of May 10/11. Remember the dates parenthesis are when the Vatican will be celebrating these jubilees but we have packaged them differently for our celebrations at OLP. This weekend is the 4th Sunday of Easter and also traditionally called Good Shepherd Sunday and has been designated as World Day of Prayer for Vocations for years. Recall that at our monthly jubilee Masses, we include those designated in our intercessions, we pray Pope Francis' Jubilee Prayer and we offer a special blessing for the "jubilarians" at the end of Mass (in this case, bishops, priests, deacons, seminarians and those in consecrated life. Please join us in praying for all of those who have responded to these important religious vocations in our church.

**Remember next weekend the Knights of Columbus have two options to support them:

-The first is the annual Spring Flower Sale on Saturday, May 17th from 8am to 12noon or until sold out. If they don't sell out by weekend Masses they will be available after Mass.

-The second is the Pancake Breakfast for Mothers (who eat for free!) on Sunday, May 18th from 8-11:30am. ****Catholic Services Appeal 2025** As of May 5th, we had 379 **Pledges for \$218,185.** Thank you to all who have pledged! We have exceeded our assessment to the Diocese of Erie (\$151,600) but our goal is 400 pledges for \$227,600 so we are 21 pledges and about \$9,500 short of our goals. Remember our parish project is the renovation of the rectory kitchen as well as the replacing of the flooring for the first floor. Please consider making a pledge if you have not already. **Death of Pope Francis/ Conclave to Elect New Pope Let us continue to pray for the repose of the soul of Pope Francis and thank God for his ministry of shepherding the Universal Catholic Church for the last 12 years. I spoke at our parish memorial Mass for Pope Francis about his legacy and I would like to summarize my comments here... I have been inspired by the following characteristics of Pope Francis' heart over the last 12 years- ONE- a true heart for the poor as he sought throughout his papacy and episcopacy to reach out to and serve those on the margins and challenged other bishops and priests "to know the smell of the sheep" and to not isolate themselves in their rectories or churches; TWO- a humble heart that he displayed from the very beginning of his papacy on the balcony of St. Peter Basilica when he was first introduced and asked for the prayers of the people before offering his first Papal Blessing to us and that he continued to show throughout his shepherding; THREE- a heart for the environment in the spirit of St. Francis which was the topic of one of his three encyclicals and in which he challenged our church and culture to be weary of the "throw away" attitude that much of the world has adopted; FOUR- an accompanying heart through which he challenged Catholics to allow others to experience and see Christ's love in us before challenging them to conversion and to live out the Church's moral tradition; FIVE- a synodal heart in which Pope Francis encouraged us to grow in our willingness to dialogue about issues and not just divide ourselves from others who do not think like we do.

I did not always agree with Pope Francis' methods and ways of communicating but I greatly admired his shepherd's heart and am grateful for the ways he challenged me and our church, and inspired me to be a better shepherd after the heart of the Father in heaven. Thank you, Pope Francis, and may your soul through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

Also, the conclave was scheduled to begin on May 7th so the assumption is that by the time you are reading this we will have a new Pope. So let's join the universal church in praying for our new Vicar of Christ and Successor of Peter to guide us and unite us in the grace of the Holy Spirit. Silence before Mass

SILENCE IS sacred. No words can adequately express the mystery of God. Everything we try to say falls short. In quiet, we can sense God's presence even more deeply than in sound.

At designated times of the Mass, we fall silent to offer prayers, to reflect on the Scripture or to thank God for the Eucharist. But "it is a praiseworthy practice for silence to be observed in the church, in the sacristy, in the vesting room, and in adjacent areas, so that all may dispose themselves to carry out the sacred celebration in a devout and fitting manner" (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, 45).

Many sounds precede Mass. At home and in the car, you may have the television or radio on, or you may be conversing with family and friends about many things. At church, in the minutes before Mass begins, you might hear people greeting people, someone leading a Rosary, musicians tuning their instruments, cantors rehearsing the Responsorial Psalm, or coins plunking in the poor box. The organist might play a prelude, or the song leader might rehearse a hymn with you. All these sounds serve some purpose, and they help prepare us for the Eucharist.

But some time of silence beforehand helps everyone enter the Mass devoutly. In silent prayer, we think about the role we are to play, the songs we will sing, the prayers we will offer, the Scriptures we will hear, the sacrifice we make, the service we give to our neighbor, and the presence of Jesus Christ, who comes to us in sacrament to nourish us at this Mass and throughout the week. His holiness renders us speechless.
