THE GIFT OF PEACE

"There arose no little dissension and debate." Did that happen at work this week? Most of us can recall run-ins with coworkers, even with the boss. Did it happen while socializing with friends? Go easy on politics, religion . . . even sports. At home? Even the most peaceful household experiences a little "give and take" now and then. So where was it that "there arose no little dissension and debate"? That tumultuous conflict occurred among our first Christian ancestors, disrupting the community life of the early church. But today's Acts of the Apostles shows how beautifully the Holy Spirit, promised by Jesus in today's Gospel, helped the church achieve a grace-filled resolution. What evolved was that "reconciled diversity," often encouraged by Pope Francis and even envisioned in today's Revelation passage; and a wondrous experience of Jesus' promised Gospel gift: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you."O

Happy sixth Sunday of Easter!
Celebrating the 6th Sunday means we are 42 days through the 50 days when we will celebrate Pentecost. We are almost entirely through the season of Easter. Remember, Pentecost, the birth of the Church, takes place after Jesus ascended. So, I remind you that we celebrate the Holy Day of obligation in Ascension Thursday on May 29, 2025. Please remember to attend mass, keeping the day as the special reminder of the day Christ ascended to heaven. It is a triumphal day of Jesus' return to the right hand of God. Ascension is the end of Jesus's earthly ministry. The Ascension is appropriately celebrated 40 days after the Resurrection. Then a 10-day waiting for the celebration of Pentecost, the descent of the Holy Spirit upon humanity. These are important celebrations to mark because they make the Church what she is.

As for today, we read the account of the First Council of the Church, the Council of Jerusalem. The controversy was addressed of whether one had to be circumcised to be regarded Christian. The outward sign is regarded less important than the internal disposition. We have John's vision of the triumphant new creation and new city of Jerusalem. Finally, the Gospel message we take with us is that after Jesus departs from the Apostles, Jesus's followers are still assured of a place with the Father in eternal life and Jesus Himself gives us His peace. I hope you have experienced the peace of Christ because it is an experience of comfort and security. It is a gift we need to balance the other challenges and insecurities of life.

May the peace of Christ be with us all.

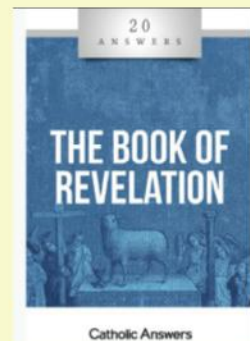
