

Family Discussion of the Week: Praying for Others

Jesus prayed, "I pray not only for them, but also for those who believe in me through their word, so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me." (John 17:20-21)

Adults & Kids: What are some of the most important things to ask of God?

IN BETWEEN

In between: we all find ourselves there from time to time—sometimes uncomfortably. Like in between money coming in and money going out, earning income and paying bills. In between customer and manager, diner and chef: any honest server trying to serve both. In between theory and practice, ideal and reality: everyone from parents to pastors. Ask the kids—or parishioners! This Sunday, in between Ascension and Pentecost, reminds us we're in between Jesus' departure and glorious return—sometimes uncomfortably. Though Jesus promises in Revelation, "I am coming soon," Acts shows Stephen tragically called home first. But Pope Francis urges us not to become "sourpusses," as if living Gospel love is impossible in between. Today's Gospel shows Jesus praying for those about to betray, deny, and desert him, but also praying "for those who will believe in me through their word." Us! "So that they"—we—"may all be one."

- **Pentecost Vigil Next Saturday, June 7th, we will celebrate the full Pentecost Vigil at the 5pm Mass as we end the Easter Season. This is meant to parallel the Great Easter Vigil which begins the Easter Season. The main difference is that there are 4 readings from the Old Testament that set the stage for Pentecost in the New Testament and so allow us to appreciate and celebrate Pentecost more fully.
- **Pentecost Solemn Evening Prayer Next Sunday, June 8th, we will celebrate the last liturgy of the Easter Season with Solemn Evening Prayer and Benediction at 6pm. There will be exposition and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from the end of 4:30pm Mass (5:10 or so) until the start of Evening Prayer. Also, since Pentecost is the birthday of the church, we will gather for birthday cake in the rectory right after prayer!

**Catholic Services Appeal 2025 We had 410 Pledges for \$223,850. Thank you to all who have pledged! We have exceeded our assessment to the Diocese of Erie (\$151,000) and reached our goal of 400 pledges but are just about \$4,000 short of our monetary goal. Remember our parish project is the renovation of the rectory kitchen as well as the replacing of the flooring for the first floor. Please consider making a pledge. Pledge envelopes are at the doors of church or the parish office.

**Pope Leo XIV Inaugural Mass Habemus Papam! I am extremely grateful to the pilgrimage group and the staff from

extremely grateful to the pilgrimage group and the staff from Our Lady of Peace who encouraged me to stay after our Italy Pilgrimage for the Inaugural Mass of Pope Leo XIV Papacy (the pilgrims returned on May 16th and the Papal Mass was May 18th at St. Peter Square in the Vatican). It was an incredible blessing to be there and experience the excitement and hope that Catholics from all over the world were sharing. Pope Leo's emphasis on unity and love was powerfully reinforced in his homily, especially through his episcopal motto, 'In illo Uno unum' - ' In the One, we are one', a phrase taken from Saint Augustine. 'Pilgrims of Hope,' the theme of the Jubilee Year 2025, is being renewed through his election, and that's exactly what I felt at the Papal Mass. 
material, please consider donating it to the **Sew What?** group. Yarn, thread and batting is also needed.






