

#### Family Discussion of the Week: The Spirit of Truth

Jesus said, "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come." (Jn 16:12-13a)

Adults: In what difficult situation has the Holy Spirit helped you see more clearly?

Kids: What kind of decision can the Holy Spirit help you with?

#### THIS IS THE HOLY TRINITY

Today we celebrate the Holy Trinity, one of the most confounding mysteries of our faith. Through this mystery we experience our relationship to God: Creator, Savior, and Holy Spirit. This relationship is not easy to understand or to describe. It does not become clearer through analysis. Its complexity mirrors the complexity of all our relationships. We understand our relationships with our spouses, our children, our parents, and our friends only through daily give-and-take, annual rituals, and the life-changing moments we share. We understand our relationships only as we live them. The relationships we have with those we love, and who love us, sustain us through an uncertain and difficult life. This is the Holy Trinity.

What is striking about today's readings is that each is incomplete. What they do offer is a description of a moment in our relationship, a memory of a time and an event when our relationship made sense even though that sense may be beyond our ability to describe fully. Often that is all that our faith offers, that is, a memory of what is possible, what is promised, what has been given. A memory of eternity, of love beyond understanding is to be cherished and nurtured even if not fully understood. This is the Holy Trinity.

#### From the Pastor's Desk...

A happy Father's Day to all! We offer special prayers and thanks today for the gift of our earthly fathers, as well as our amazing heavenly Father, who provide for us and love us. We will offer a special blessing for our fathers during Mass to ask God to grant them the grace they need to fulfill their heroic call to fatherhood that our families and world so greatly need.

This weekend we also celebrate our next Jubilee here at OLP for Artists (Feb 15-18)/Bands and Popular Music (May 10-11)/Sports (June 14-15)/Choirs (Nov 22-23). Remember the dates in parentheses are the dates that these Jubilee groups are being celebrated at the Vatican but we grouped them so we could celebrate the jubilee once a month at OLP. We will recite the Jubilee Prayer after the intercessions and will add a blessing for artists, bands and popular music, sports, and choirs during Mass as well. I share a summary of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) resource for music ministers released earlier this year for the Jubilee titled "Pilgrims on the Way of Hope: A Resource for the Jubilee of Musical Bands."

In the beginning, the bishops reflect on the spiritual nature of music and its ability to accompany and unify the faithful. Quoting Pope Francis at his 2018 audience with international choirs, they noted music as "the true instrument of evangelization," which can make "one sense the beauty of paradise" by touching their hearts. They note, that the creative spark that initiates the human artist was first conceived of and lovingly passed down from the Divine Artist.

Next posing music as a symbol of beauty, the bishops write: "It is in living and acting that man establishes his relationship with being, with the truth and with the good. The artist has a special relationship to beauty. In a very true sense, it can be said that beauty is the vocation bestowed on him by the Creator in the gift of 'artistic talent.' And, certainly, this too is a talent which ought to be made to bear fruit, in keeping with the sense of the Gospel parable of the talents." They go on to note that all those who follow the artistic vocation - be they musicians, writers, or visual artists – have an obligation to develop their talents to put them at the service of the community. In this idea of art as service, the bishops implore artists to produce art for its own sake, rather than as a means of gaining fame or fortune. Just as architecture designs places for worship, music designs atmospheres in which the vast mysteries of faith may be contemplated. The beauty of sacred music – and all sacred art for that matter – can elevate the soul, inspire the faithful, bridge cultures, and nourish the faith of others: "Every genuine inspiration, however, contains some tremor of that 'breath' with which the Creator Spirit suffused the work of creation from the very beginning. He touches [human genius] with a kind of inner illumination which brings together the sense of the good and the beautiful, and he awakens energies of mind and heart which enable it to conceive an idea and give it form in a work of art."

What an important task our musicians, artists and athletes have... so may God bless them and our week ahead!

- \*\*There will again be an Erie Catholic Corpus Christi Procession next Sunday, June 22<sup>nd</sup> at 2pm at St. Peter Cathedral. The procession begins and ends at the Cathedral and makes its way through downtown Erie. If it rains, they will have all the services in the Church. If you are unable to walk, there will be prayers in the church throughout the procession. This is not only a great opportunity to pray with your pastor and parish family, but also with Bishiop Persico and our greater Catholic Community of Erie. Being the largest parish in the Diocese, I hope Our Lady of Peace will set the example and have a large representation there.

  \*\*Noah Pilgrimage/Stop at St. Leo Jubilee Parish in Ridgway
  This week (June 17-19) is the annual parish pilgrimage to Sights
- and Sounds Biblical Theatre in Lancaster, PA and we will be seeing "Noah" this year (the original production that put Sights and Sounds on the national radar back in 1987!). We will be stopping for Mass at St. Leo Church in Ridgway, PA, which is one of the two Jubilee Churches of the Diocese of Erie designated by Bishop Persico, on Tuesday, June 17<sup>th</sup> at 10:30am. Even if you are not going on the pilgrimage you are welcome to join us for a tour and Mass (Ridgway is about a two and a half hour drive from Erie). And I thank Fr. Nick and Fr. Shane for again covering for me while I am gone. As

Remember that social gatherings are an important part of community building and relationship strengthening and are a key component of a healthy parish so I hope you can join. - \*\*Marian Prayer for the Re-Creation of our Parish Our 3<sup>rd</sup> prayer for our Parish Re-Creation Prayer Plan, the Litany of Loreto, continues this week. From June 9th until July 15th we will pray the Litany daily; which is the only approved Litany to Mary in our Catholic Tradition. Each day that you pray the litany you are encouraged to move a bead from the prayer fence to the prayer bowl. Again, we will continue to see the prayers for our parish's new birth build up as the beads build up in our prayer bowl with the ties and Marian medals.

\*\*Catholic Services Appeal 2025 We had 417 Pledges for \$233,442. Thank you to all who have pledged! We have exceeded our assessment to the Diocese of Erie (\$152,600) and reached our goal of 400 pledges. Remember our parish project is the renovation of the rectory kitchen as well as the replacing of the flooring for the first floor. Please consider making a pledge if you have not already. Pledge envelopes are at the doors of the church or at the parish office.

\*\*OLP Parish Re-Creation Plan Over the last few months, our parish leadership has been introducing the concept of resurrection and new life coming to Our Lady of Peace Parish. Amidst all the transitions occurring in the Diocese, OLP has an opportunity and a responsibility to be a key pillar in the Erie Catholic community. The work that started back in 2018 with the Renovation Committee and now has renewed momentum with the Campus Vision Committee is focused on meeting this call.

I now share some examples of what we have identified by the 2018 Renovation Committee as we discern together how to move forward. After reviewing input from our ministry leaders, diocesan consultants and church liturgical teachings, the committee has identified limitations imposed by our current physical space and is interested in finding solutions that will allow us to continue to meet the physical and spiritual needs of our parishioners now and for years to come. Our physical worship space influences our liturgical experiences. For example, the placement of the Baptismal Font is a powerful statement of our role as Catholic Christians. Currently, it is hidden behind the ambo and its accessibility is limited due to the steps and its size. Ideally, the font would be in a location and of a size that would visibly remind us all of our own Baptism and our Baptismal promises.


We desire to establish an environment that encourages us to gather as a community. For example, the vestibule or narthex should be large enough to accommodate fellowship before/after mass as well as ministry activities. Ideally, it should be a place that serves as a transition point physically and spiritually to and from worship. While we have made our current space work, there is an opportunity to make it better.

In addition to addressing our current limitations, we are also looking for opportunities to grow our ministries and our parish community. Over the years, I have heard your feedback on the need for a larger gathering space or community center. A multi-purpose space connected to our existing church building would assist us in further forming youth and adults in the Catholic faith and provide new ways to serve the parish family and the greater community. Additionally, we currently do not have an accessible meeting space where all can participate. And finally, as our parish has grown, we are running out of office space for our staff and seriously lack adequate storage space for our ministries and parish needs.


So where do we go from here? Over the summer, the ministry leaders who previously provided feedback will be given a chance to review and update their suggestions. Then, in the fall several things will happen. First, we will provide you with some education on church architecture and liturgical rituals and then

explain the physical limitations that we see in our present space. We will be surveying parishioners on what you see as the biggest needs in renovation and will have listening sessions where we will provide more details on the work of the committee so far and seek your feedback on all of this so we can move forward together united in mission.

In the meantime, I ask for your continued prayers for growth and re-birth. As I have mentioned before, prayer has to be at the center of this process. I have already introduced the Marion prayer plan. Hopefully you have been participating in this, and if not, you can begin at any time. Currently, we are praying the "Litany of Our Lady of Loretto." As we pray together, learn together and go deeper in experiencing our relationship with our God, we will grow in our faith and as a parish community.




#### OLP Casserole Club benefiting Maria House Project


