#### A Family Perspective

In today's gospel, Jesus teaches that we will find abundance by sharing what little we have. Regardless of how limited our time, money, or food may be, it becomes sufficient when shared.

#### From the Pastor's Desk...

A blessed Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ (Corpus Christi)! For the feast, there will again be a city-wide Catholic Eucharistic Procession THIS Sunday, June 22nd at 2pm at St. Peter Cathedral. The procession begins and ends at the Cathedral and makes its way through downtown Erie. If it rains, they will have all the services in the Church. If you are unable to walk, there will be prayers in the church throughout the procession. This is not only a great opportunity to pray with your pastor and parish family, but also with Bishiop Persico and our greater Catholic Community of Erie. Being the largest parish in the Diocese, I hope Our Lady of Peace will set the example and have a large representation there.

We also look forward to celebrating two other solemnities this week in our liturgical calendar:

- 1. The Nativity of St. John the Baptist, Tuesday, June 24<sup>th</sup>
   One of only three birthdays celebrated on the Church's liturgical calendar, the Nativity of Our Lord (December 25), the Nativity of His Mother (September 8), and the Nativity of His forerunner, John the Baptist, on June 24. St. John the Baptist was set apart from the womb to prepare the way of the Lord and was a significant figure connected to the Incarnation and the Redemption. The Church honors him because of his role in preparing the way for Christ. Theories have been proposed that St. John the Baptist was sanctified in the womb of St. Elizabeth at the Visitation when he leapt at the presence of Jesus in Mary. This theory concludes that St. John was therefore only one of three persons born without sin since he had been sanctified in the womb and therefore one of three nativities that we celebrate.
- 2. The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, Friday, June 27<sup>th</sup>- this is a moveable feast that honors the Sacred Heart. In 1675, Jesus told St. Margaret Mary that He wanted the Feast of the Sacred Heart to be celebrated on the Friday after the Corpus Christi octave. In 1856, the Feast of the Sacred Heart became a universal feast. St. John Paul II, a great devotee of the Sacred Heart, said, "This feast reminds us of the mystery of the love of God for the people of all times."

May God bless our Diocesan Clergy and our week ahead!



Through our support of the Peter's Pence Collection, we are also helping to strengthen the ties that bind us together as the Family of God. Thank you for your generosity.






