

Family Discussion of the Week: Accepting the Christian Message

Jesus said to the disciples, "Whenever you enter a town and they do not welcome you, go out into its streets and say, 'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest against you. Yet know this: the kingdom of God has come near." (Lk 10:11)

Adults: Were do you see the message of Christian faith being rejected in the world today? What is your response to that?

Kids: What can you do when you are generous with others, and they do not want what you give them?

GOD'S PROVIDENCE

Today's readings celebrate God's providence. No matter how wonderful (or heartbreaking) our relationships are, God always provides for us. No one cares for us the way God does.

Isaiah delights us with a deeply intimate image of God caring for us "as a mother comforts her child." The prophet describes us not as the usual "children of God," but as "babies." We should not resist this image, but rejoice in it. Trusting in God's care, we can all let down our guard and rest like infants in the lap of our mother.

Saint Paul's trust in God allows him to be at peace like this. He boldly declares that no one can "make troubles" for him, because he has given himself completely to Jesus. And when Jesus sends his disciples out to preach and heal, he challenges them not to provide for themselves, but to let faith be their guide.

Last year, the U.S. Bishops raised up Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati, whose feast is July 4, in their national framework for accompanying youth and young adults: "His example of taking action in the present moment can be a great inspiration for youth and young adults setting out on their own missionary paths today." Blessed Giorgio, who died 100 years ago this week and who had a great love for Christ, the Church, and the marginalized, is an exemplary Catholic young adult that the U.S. Bishops featured as a model for young people in their new national framework, "Listen, Teach, Send (usccb.org/listen-teach-send). And this year Pope Leo XIV will canonize Blessed Giorgio along with Blessed Carlo Acutis (Feast day October 12th) on September 7th. This will be a great highlight of the Jubilee Year and we look forward to celebrating. Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati and Blessed Carlo Acutis, pray for us and our youth!

Also, this weekend OLP participates in the Annual Diocesan Missionary Cooperative which involves us hosting someone from the missionary areas of our world as an opportunity to pray for them and offer our financial support of their mission. We welcome Fr. Jinto George from the Diocese of Thuckalay, India to hear more about how they bring the light and love of Jesus Christ to their part of the world.
