#### Family Discussion of the Week: Holy Visitors

Jesus said to Martha, "There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her." (Lk 10:42)

Adults: Which response to God's call is more natural to you - prayer or action? Why? *Kids:* In the past week, when have you prayed and when have you done good things for others? Which could you do better?

#### A MINDSET OF SERVICE

There's a lot of traveling, delivering, and visiting going on in our readings today. In Genesis Abraham cares for the needs of three mysterious travelers. The psalm responds, celebrating the kind of righteousness that Abraham practices. Then, in his letter to the Colossians, Saint Paul describes his own ministry as almost like a delivery service: he, God's steward, brings the word of God to their community. Finally, Luke's Gospel shares the well-known story of Mary and Martha, and the different ways they welcome Jesus into their home. Amid all this coming and going, we are invited to pay attention to the ways we tend to the needs of others. Each of us can ask, How am I present to God and others in my life? Copyright © J. S. #### From the Pastor's Desk...

This week I will be away on vacation in St. Louis from the evening of Sunday, July 20th to the evening of Friday, July 25th. I thank Fr. Nick and Fr. Shane for covering Masses and emergencies while I am gone. I will be traveling with several of my seminary friends and the highlight will be visiting the Shrine of St. Rose Phillippine Duchesne. St. Rose was born in France in the 1769 and came to the United States to teach the Native Americans as well as the French in America where she spent 34 years and died in 1852. She was canonized in 1988 and her shrine is in St. Charles, Missouri just outside of St. Louis.

St. Rose is one of eleven saints who have shrines in present day United States of America and she is one of seven of the eleven who ministered after the US was founded- the seven being St. Rose Phillippine Duchesne (1769-1852- Louisiana and Missouri), St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (1774-1821- Maryland), St. Theodore Guerin (1798-1856- Indiana), St. John Nuemann (1811-1860- Pennsylvania), St. Marianne Cope (1838-1918- New York and Hawaii), St. Frances Xavier Cabrini (1850-1917- New York), and St. Catherine Drexel (1858-1955- Pennsylvania).

The other four lived and ministered in territory before it became the United States- the North American Martyrs (killed between 1642-1649 in New York before a state and Canada), St. Kateri Tekakwitha (1656-1680-New York before a state and Canada), St. Junipero Serra (1713-1784- California before a state), and St. Damien of Molokai (1840-1899- Hawaii before a state).

\*\*<u>OLP has been asked to host one of our seminarians</u> for one month this summer as part of their formation and discernment. **Sam Ghering, from St. Patrick Parish in Franklin, PA**, who just finished his first year in seminary formation and is 19 years old, will be staying with us from July 16th until August 10th so please welcome him into our parish family.

-Saturday, September 6th (5-10pm) for our Annual Parish Picnic \*\*Parish Recreation through Mary Prayer Plan Last week we have the Marian Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel on Wednesday, July 16th. This marked the transition into the 4th phase of our Parish Re-Creation Prayer Plan between May 15th (the Anniversary of the Dedication of our Church Building) and September 30th (the Anniversary of the founding of our parish). From July 16th until August 15th (the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary), we will pray the Angelus. Each day that you pray the Angelus you are encouraged to move a crucifix from the prayer fence to the prayer bowl. Again, we will continue to see the prayers for our parish's new birth build up as our prayer bowl continues to fill.

Part of the goal of our Marian Prayer Plan, in addition to the main purpose of seeking our Blessed Mother's intercession for the rebirth of Jesus at Our Lady of Peace Parish, is to get exposed to different devotions and prayers connected to Mary. We also are seeking to learn more about what we as Catholics believe about Mary through our Formation Series called "Pray with Mary" and being held monthly through the prayer plan window. So ultimately, we hope to grow in our understanding, devotion and love of Mary, our parish patron, as we turn to her in prayer for our parish.

With that in mind, let's learn a little more about Mary under the title of Our Lady of Mount Carmel through Franciscan Media. "Hermits lived on Mount Carmel near the Fountain of Elijah in northern Israel in the 12th century. They had a chapel dedicated to Our Lady. By the 13th century they became known as "Brothers of Our Lady of Mount Carmel." They soon celebrated a special Mass and Office in honor of Mary. In 1726, it became a celebration of the universal Church under the title of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. For centuries the Carmelites have seen themselves as specially related to Mary. Their great saints and theologians have promoted devotion to her and often championed the mystery of her Immaculate Conception. There is a tradition that Mary appeared to Saint Simon Stock, a leader of the Carmelites in England, in the 13th Century and gave him a scapular, telling him to promote devotion to it. The scapular is a modified version of Mary's own garment. It symbolizes her special protection and calls the wearers to consecrate themselves to her in a special way. The scapular reminds us of the gospel call to prayer and penance-a call that Mary models in a splendid way."
