

Family Discussion of the Week: Daily Prayer

Jesus said, "So I say to you, Ask, and it will be given you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you." (Lk 11:9)

Adults: Have your most recent prayers been prayers of praise, petition, or sorrow? Which kind of prayer do you need to practice more often?

Kids: What are you most thankful for right now?

ASKING FOR HELP

The Beatitudes praise the poor in spirit. One characteristic of those who are poor in spirit is their ability to ask for help; they know when others can provide what they lack. Today's readings encourage us to practice poverty in spirit by asking God for what we need. What could be more natural than to ask God for good things? God is, after all, the inventor of goodness and the giver of all good things.

Asking God for help puts us in conversation with God. These conversations take many forms. The reading from Genesis shows Abraham bantering with God like a skilled negotiator, while Saint Paul's letter to the Colossians praises God for answering us even when we don't deserve it. In Saint Luke's Gospel, Jesus not only gives us words to use in our conversations with God (the Our Father), but also promises that God always listens to our prayers. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

From the Pastor's Desk...

Last weekend we made the following announcements about clergy assignments that affect Our Lady of Peace Parish. Fr. Nick Fratus has been assigned to ministry with the elderly and sick in DuBois, PA with residence at St. Catherine Rectory. Fr. Luke Daghir has been assigned the new parochial vicar (assistant pastor) at OLP while also covering Mass at Mercyhurst University. These assignments take effect August 12th. So, we will say goodbye to Fr. Nick the weekend of August 9-10 with coffee and donuts after the Sunday morning Masses and he will be present after all Masses. On August 23-24 we will welcome Fr. Luke Daghir with coffee and donuts after the Sunday morning Masses; and he will be around after all Masses that weekend. Please pray for Fr. Nick and Fr. Luke, and all the priests and parishes affected by the new assignments. Bishop Persico also asks us all to pray for vocations to the priesthood as assignments are getting more and more challenging as our older priests retire.

Another assignment that affects us is that Fr. Kevin Holland, native son of OLP, will be the new parochial vicar at St. Jude Parish (with new pastor Fr. Mike Polinek) AND will be the new chaplain for the Erie Catholic School System of which Our Lady of Peace School is a part of. This is great news for ECSS, as this is a newly created position and will be another step in renewing the Catholic identity of the system, and each school in it, as well as bringing Fr. Kevin's energy and commitment to the schools.

Speaking of the Erie Catholic School System, the new president, Mr. Travis Washko, will begin his tenure on August Ist. And congratulations to OLP parishioners, Mrs. Emily Fluegel and Mr. Corey Ferraro, who have been named the principal and assistant principal respectively at OLP School for the 2025-26 school year. This all made me feel very hopeful for a new chapter of growth and improvement for ECSS and OLP School. Please keep the school and the system in your prayers as well, for their renewal and success moving forward with new leadership and vision.






