

**Adults:** When have you felt that possessions were becoming too important in your life? Kids: Have you ever received a gift you wanted a lot and then found it didn't make you as happy as you thought it would?

#### USING OUR TIME WISELY

A jar of honey lasts practically forever. The oldest jar of honey ever discovered was over five thousand years old. Hopey is quite different from market-fresh produce, then; because most fruits and vegetables last only a few days, we treat them carefully. At this time of summer, we rush to find recipes for cherries and cucumbers so we won't waste a single one. We wouldn't feel that same urgency about honey.

In our own way, we are as delightful and fragile as ripe produce. Today's readings urge us not to spoil, but to make good use of our limited time on earth. Ecclesiastes reminds us that because God provides for us now and always, we can manage our daily affairs without anxiety. \*\*Masses this Week Monday, August 4<sup>th</sup>- St. John Vianney, Priest (19<sup>th</sup> Century French Patron of Parish Priests); Tuesday, August 5<sup>th</sup>- Dedication of the Basilica of St. Mary Major (first church in the West/Latin Church to be dedicated to Mary in the 5<sup>th</sup> Century); Wednesday, August 6<sup>th</sup>- The Transfiguration of the Lord (celebrated in the Eastern Church as far back as the 5<sup>th</sup> Century and made a universal feast in the 15<sup>th</sup> Century); Thursday, August 7<sup>th</sup>- Sts. Pope Sixtus II, Pope, and Companions, Martyrs (3<sup>rd</sup> Century)t; Friday, August 8<sup>th</sup>- St. Dominic, Priest (13<sup>th</sup> Century founder of the Order of Preachers); Saturday, August 9<sup>th</sup>- St. Theresa Benedicta of the Cross, Virgin, Martyr (20<sup>th</sup> Century Philosopher, Jewish Convert and Carmelite executed at Auschwitz).

\*\*Priest Assignments Affecting OLP Fr. Nick Fratus has been assigned to ministry with the elderly and sick in DuBois, PA with residence at St. Catherine Rectory. Fr. 
