Jesus answered them, "Strive to enter through the narrow door; for many, I tell you, will try to enter and will not be able." (Lk 13:24)

Adults: What daily choices are you making that will allow you to be recognized at the doorway of the reign of God?

Kids: What good habits are you practicing in order to be a good Christian?

WELCOME THE STRANGER

We have become accustomed to seeing pictures in the media and stories on the news about immigrants from Latin America and refugees from Syria fleeing violence and destruction in their own countries, trying to make their way to a safe place. We have also seen the reactions of people who want to keep them away from their countries, who fail to welcome the stranger and the helpless children. Have we forgotten Jesus' call to comfort the homeless and the stranger? "They shall bring all your brothers and sisters from all the nations . . . to Jerusalem, my holy mountain, says the LORD."

In the three readings for this day, we are told that we are to welcome these strangers, to welcome the discipline of the Lord, which leads to peace, and to "strive to enter through the narrow gate" into the glory of God's own homeland, the reign of God.

Luke was assigned to us the summer of 2023 when he was a transitional deacon and then spent Christmas 2023 and the Sacred Triduum of 2024 with us as well as June 2024 as an ordained priest so he is no stranger to us. **New Regional Youth Minister

with St. Jude the Apostle and St. Francis in McKean Parishes to hire a Regional Youth Minister who will work with Sarah Beaver from OLP to expand our youth ministry to those 3 parishes.

Chandler Villanueva is the new youth minister. Chandler recently graduated from Gannon University with a degree in Philosophy and has been highly involved with our ministry at OLP for several years as a volunteer. We are very excited to add

Chandler to our team at OLP and look forward to the greater impact of our youth ministry in West Erie.

**New Church Sanctuary Bell
There recently was a nice piece on Erie News Now about the new bell at OLP. We had something in the bulletin over the summer about it, but I will review it here again. Nick Marinelli donated a new sanctuary bell to OLP in honor of his mother and father, Gloria and Nick Marinelli. Gloria passed away a year ago after being a faithful member of OLP for over 50 years and Nick wanted to fulfill her dream of having such a bell at OLP in her memory. It was made by the Marinelli Bell Company in Italy which is one of the oldest bell making companies in the world. And the bell at OLP is one of only 2 or 3 in the United States.

So what is a sacristy or sanctuary bell? If the bell is used when the Priest enters into the sanctuary area from the side Vesting Sacristy, it is called a sacristy bell and if it is used when the Priest enters the church's Worship Space at the beginning of Mass, it is called a Sanctuary Bell. So the one at OLP is called a Sanctuary Bell. It is routinely used during daily Masses. Sanctuary bells are rung at the entrance of the clergy and are used as a warning that the Liturgy of the Mass is about to begin. Simultaneously, it signals for everyone to please stand for the entrance procession. I again thank Nick and his family for this generous donation!

- **Pray with Mary Series The next session is this Thursday, August 28th from 6:30-7:30pm in the school cafeteria. The topics presented will be the Doctrine of the Coronation of Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth, the title of Mary as Our Lady of Peace (sometimes titled Our Lady, Queen of Peace) and the Prayer to Mary called the Hail Holy Queen.
- **Church Picnic Schedule Only 2 weeks from one of our parish highlights every year...the parish picnic! On Saturday, September 6th we will gather for 5pm Mass in the Church where our Pastoral Council, PLT and Staff will recommit to serving our parish in the various capacities in which they serve. Around 6pm we will have dinner, cooked and served by our Picnic Committee that is mostly made up of our Families Together Ministry with some other helpers interspersed. Then will have music by Rooftop Project outside: 6:30-9pm, Face Painting by Connie, Magic Steve Balloons: 6:30-8pm, Bingo: 7-8pm, Bonfire: 8:30pm, Basket Raffle Drawings, the Parish Raffle Drawings: 9pm and fireworks at 9:30pm to conclude the night.
- **Parish Picnic Needs We are in need of baskets for the Basket Raffle; and volunteers for set up and clean up as well as serving the meal and other areas. Sign ups are in the church vestibule after Masses and throughout the week. Families Together Ministries and the parish cover the costs of the picnic but donations to defray the cost are welcome. Please see the office if you would like to make a contribution.
- **Masses this Week Monday, August 25th- St. Joseph Calasanz, Priest (17th Century, founded Clerics Regular of Religious Schools, patron of all Christian schools dedicated to assisting the poor); Tuesday, August 26th- Weekday in Ordinary Time; Wednesday, August 27th- St. Monica (4th Century, patron of mothers; persevering prayer leading to conversion is a source of comfort and encouragement for those seeking the conversion of loved ones); Thursday, August 28th- St. Augustine, Bishop, Doctor of the Church (5th Century, son of St. Monica; becomes a "Servant of God"); Friday, August 29th- The Passion of St. John the Baptist; Saturday, August 30th- Blessed Virgin Mary.

**There will be a new Synod Listening Session at OLP on Monday, September 15th from 6:30-8pm. The topic will be the baptismal call of the Catholic Laity. This is following up on the synod on synodality that took place throughout the universal Catholic Church that took place between 2022-2024. Listening sessions like this will be held at parishes throughout the Diocese of Erie throughout September and a Diocesan Report will then be submitted to the US Catholic Conference by November 1st. Then a US report will be submitted to the Vatican by the end of 2025. More information will be coming on our listening session in the next few weeks but for now mark your calendars to be a part of this ongoing movement in the church re-initiated by Pope Francis and being continued by Pope Leo XIV.

**Prayer Plan for OLP Recreation Between August 15th and September 30th, which is the 70th Anniversary of the founding of our parish, you are asked to pray the Rosary once a week for the intention of a new birth of Jesus at Our Lady of Peace and to place a mini rose into the vase in front of the statue of Mary at our Marian Altar in the main church. I hope that this will not only be opportunity for our practiced Rosary prayers to seek Mary's intercession for our parish, but for those of us who are not used to praying the Rosary to explore a new prayer and devotion that is considered one of the most powerful and efficacious in our Catholic Tradition. So at the Masses on the Assumption we gave out Rosaries made from the items that had been placed in our Prayer Bowls over the last 3 months. These Rosaries were made by members of our Parish Leadership Team (PLT) as they have prayed for you. So let's pile up those roses in the next month and a half as an expression of our love and devotion to our patroness, Our Lady of Peace!

**Comments on the Situation at St. Jude | I mentioned last week that I was saddened, frustrated and angered by the investigation of financial improprieties at St. Jude the Apostle Church in Erie that became public recently. I told those at Masses that if they were there at Mass (generally 25% of Catholics) after the news that week, that they were among those identified by Jesus in the Gospel as "those who have been given much" in the life grace and faith. And to those of us given much in faith and grace to continue to be faithful to the Church even as these things happen, "much is demanded" in persevering so that others can be given hope. I am reminded of a line from the movie "Hacksaw Ridge" that really hit home with me and I believe is very relevant now..."Most of these men don't believe the same way you do, but they believe so much in how much you believe." Let's give others in the church and community something to believe in, even if it's belief in how much we believe. 


