

#### GOD IS ON THE SIDE OF THE POOR

Two of today's readings make it quite clear that God is on the side of the poor. Amos describes in detail the exploitation of the poor and needy. The psalm repeats that God acts to benefit the poor and lowly. But Luke turns things upside down, telling a tale of a conflicted steward, about to be fired, who demonstrates his cleverness and is rewarded. Like the community to whom Paul writes in Timothy, these readings are personal, directed to believers, members of the Jewish and Christian communities, who struggle to deal with personal choices about how to conduct their lives. - \*\*Registration Weekend This weekend we invite families or individuals to consider officially registering as parishioners at Our Lady of Peace Parish if you have not done so. Please stop in the vestibule and we can help you with registration or provide more information.

So why register as a member of OLP? Here are a few reasons to consider: ONE- registration is a way of committing to living out your Catholic faith in an intentional way through the mission of our parish through stewardship of your time, talent and treasure. It formally engages you in the financial support of our parish mission and also allows us to provide documentation of your financial support for tax purposes; TWO- registration is a

concrete way to show you are actively practicing your faith and is typically required for those seeking to be Godparents or Sponsors for Baptism and Confirmation; THREE- registration allows our welcome committee to get to know you and share information about our parish community and life as well as invite you to one of our Welcome Luncheons; FOUR- registration allows you to receive all parish mailings and communication through email as well as placing you on the mailing list for our Diocesan FAITH Magazine which is published six times a year. So we would love you to consider registering at OLP if you are not registered at a parish already and please consider inviting your family, friends, neighbors and co-workers who are Catholic and do not have a parish to formally register at OLP. \*\*I will be away from the parish this week as I attend my Annual Retreat required by the church's law. I will be joining Fr. Steve Schreiber (from St. Joseph BOL and Sacred Heart) and other pastors from around the country who are participating in the Amazing Parish Movement. I thank Fr. Luke and Fr. Pray for me as I will surely be praying for you, my spiritual family! \*\*Becoming Catholic/New OCIA Year OCIA (the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults) is the program through which adults become members of our Catholic faith through the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist). If you are interested in becoming Catholic (meaning you were never baptized or were baptized in another Christian denomination) or want to complete your Catholic initiation (you were baptized Catholic but never Confirmed), please contact the office to register for the program or if you just have questions about the program.   The next step in our Parish Vision and Re-Creation Plan after our 4 and a half months of intentional prayer is a parish mission. The Mission will take place October 5-7, 2025 and is called "Passionate Faith: Growing in Holiness and Mission with Nate Schaff from Amazing Parish." Nate is also the coach for our Parish Leadership Team (PLT). The Parish Mission is three evenings of inspiration and prayer from 6:30-

\*\*Parish Vision and Re-creation Plan Letter sent to all

Parishioners the Week of September 8<sup>th</sup> "Of all the letters that I have written to you over the last 8 years I would suggest this is among the most important. Today I write to you about our Parish Vision and Re-Creation Plan (PVRP) that we have all been praying about this summer. I shared from the pulpit and bulletin in April and May how we got to this point and how prayer is laying the foundation for the next steps. Remember that we are still in the last phase of that prayer plan; praying the rosary once a week for the intention of rebirth at our parish.

In May, I mentioned that the Parish Vision and Re-Creation Plan is a plan to allow God to bring new life and new mission to Our Lady of Peace. It is a plan to help move our community from living our parish mission on Sundays to living out our mission seven days a week. It is a plan that cannot happen without you.

This plan also cannot happen without the help of a team of committed parishioners and professionals who can guide us. With that in mind, back in the Spring we created a Parish Vision Committee (PVC) to help lead us through the practical steps of this re-creation process. This team consists of Herb Morrow, Mike Zavasky, Gina Adams, Kevin Cooney, Brian Kuzmin, Joe Rys, Dominick Sisinni, Andrew Wawrzyniak, Mary Beth Whitman and myself. The PVC solicited the help of local Liturgical Design Consultant, Dr. Michael DeSanctis, a retired professor at Gannon University and member of St. Jude Parish. Also, we have contracted with LaBella Associates, an architecture firm out of Rochester, NY who specializes in liturgical design and will walk with us through most of the steps outlined below starting with a feasibility study. LaBella was chosen after a significant process that included interviews with several local firms.

I am very excited to announce that the next step in our PVRP is a Parish Mission; "Passionate Faith: Growing in Holiness and Mission" will take place from October 5-7. It will be led by Nate Schaaf from Amazing Parish. Nate is also the coach for our Parish Leadership Team (PLT). The Parish Mission is three evenings of inspiration and prayer from 6:30-8pm and I hope you will join in this time to grow in faith. Please mark your calendars and plan around this essential step in our re-creation plan.

After the parish mission, we will take a deeper dive into the Sacraments, learning more about how we are called to worship and celebrate them in our Catholic tradition. This will take place over 4 weeks, with each session being offered twice a week:

WEEK I Monday 10/27 -6:30-8pm Thursday 10/30 -10-11:30am

WEEK 2 Wednesday 11/5 -6:30-8pm Thursday 11/6 -10-11:30am

WEEK 3 Thursday 11/13- 6:30-8pm Thursday 11/13 -10-11:30am

WEEK 4 Monday 11/17 -6:30-8pm Thursday 11/20 -10-11:30am Once we have been inspired by our parish mission, have learned about the Church's teaching on the Sacraments and their celebration, the next step is listening sessions. In January 2026, LaBella will lead listening sessions to get your input on how to build our parish campus to incorporate what we have learned and how to improve what we do.

So, how can you participate in this process fully?

- 1. Continue to pray for our parish vision and re-creationespecially the Rosary in September.
- 2. Come to the Parish Mission on October 5-7.
- 3. Attend the four Formation Sessions between October 27-November 20.
- 4. Join the Listening Sessions in January.

Thank you for your support and participation in this Parish Vision and Re-Creation Plan! I cannot wait to see what the Holy Spirit is going to accomplish in and through Our Lady of Peace Parish in the next 5 years as we go through this process! May God bless our parish and our Parish Vision Re-Creation Plan!"

Whether you've been attending for years and never officially registered, or you-re new like us and considering making OLP your home parish, we encourage you to stop by the table in the back of church today.




