

#### Family Discussion of the Week: The Rich and the Poor

There was a rich man and at his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to satisfy his hunger with what fell from the rich man's table. (Luke 16:19-21) Adults: What are the "rewards" of caring for the needs of the poor?

Kids: What is one thing you and your family could do this week to help those who are poor or sick?

#### HOW GOD INTENDS US TO LIVE

Today's readings are again directed to believers, communities of faith. As in last week's reading, Amos confronts us with a condemnation of those whose lives are focused on pleasure and self-absorption. The psalm contrasts that focus with the Lord's—justice for the oppressed; food the hungry; freedom for captives; sight to the blind; raising of those who are bowed down; loving the just; protecting strangers, orphans, and the widow; and by doing so, thwarting the way of the wicked. Timothy urges the pursuit of righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. Luke tells the familiar tale of the wealthy man and the poor beggar at his doorstep, who experience life very differently in this world and in the next. #### From Fr. Luke Daghir...

Profiles in Hope

The Jubilee Year of Hope, which was designated by Pope Francis and continued by Pope Leo, is a special year of reconciliation and pilgrimage. It is a time to renew ourselves in the year 2025, which is 2,025 years since the Incarnation of Jesus.

The emphasis of this Jubilee Year is about hope and how we are "Pilgrims of Hope."

In 1956, then-Senator John F. Kennedy published *Profiles in Courage*, a Pulitzer Prize-winning book that highlighted the courage of eight U.S. senators. Kennedy believed that these senators put their careers at risk by acting with principle over popularity.

Kennedy admired these leaders who prioritized the common good over political gain, even when their choices came at a personal cost. *Profiles in Courage* highlighted examples of integrity, conviction, and moral strength in public life.

In this Jubilee Year of Hope, it is good for us to consider *Profiles in Hope* in our own lives. In other words, who in our lives have been examples of hope?

- Think of a person who has been a *Profile in Hope* in your life
- How did this person exemplify hope?
- Is there a story about this person that reminds you of how they are or were a person of hope?

Thank God for this person; this Profile in Hope in your life.






