

# From the Pastor's Desk...

As we reflect on the universal call to holiness on All Saints Day, the US Catholic Church invites us to celebrate National Vocation Awareness Week the first week of November every year. To help us all grow in awareness of the Vocation situation in the Diocese of Erie regarding clergy vocations, I present these most recent statistics.

Current statistics (2025) Active Diocesan Priests: 87 Retired Diocesan Priests: 37 Diocesan Permanent Deacons: 61

Total Seminarians: 8 Propaedeutic Year: 2 St. Mark Seminary: 3

Major Seminary: 3 (no priesthood ordinations until 2028) The number of active diocesan priests has decreased from 130 in 2012 and 210 in 1990, and is projected to be 62 by 2031. So what can we do to encourage our young people to be open to the vocations to Holy Orders and Religious

- 1. Pray: Dedicate time each day to pray for vocations. This week our First Friday Adoration (Friday, November 7th) will be dedicated to praying for vocations. There will be resources in the church to help you pray. Consider stopping any time between 7:30am and 7pm Benediction to say a prayer for vocations in our diocese. Also, join the 31 Club that commits to offering Mass for vocations once a month.
- 2. Offer gentle encouragement to youth and create space for individuals to hear God's call. Consider joining the Serra Club of Erie that specifically seeks to find ways to support vocations. Initiate or support parish activities like a monthly Holy Hour for vocations, and don't be afraid to courageously ask young men and women if they have considered a vocation.
- 3. Build a close-knit spiritual family within the parish that nurtures vocations.
- 4. Donate to the work of vocations to help support current and future priests and seminarians.

I hope we all believe that fostering vocations is ALL of our responsibility and not just the work of priests and religious. Let's keep praying that God provides laborers for the harvest! May God bless our church and diocese with vocations to the priesthood, diaconate and religious life... and our week ahead!



Annual Report Summary of Fiscal Year July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025

### **INCOME**

- 1. Parishioner contributions were greater than budget. We had several large end of year donations and are also seeing the fruit of the increased offertory campaign last
- 2. The Market Change for long-term investments was greater than budgeted as the market did better than we had planned.
- 3. Misc/Faith Form Fees/Youth Min/Fundraiser was greater than budget due to an insurance settlement we received to replace the damaged Chiller (south of the church).

### **EXPENSE**

- 1. Lay Staff Salaries/Benefits were higher than budgeted due to the addition of Sr. Kathleen Dietz, FSO, our Director of Adult Faith Formation, last fall after the budget was submitted.
- 2. Rectory/Office Expenses were less than budgeted as we had planned to install a new server and not yet done so.
- 3. There's a \$10,000 difference in several categories due to a conservative budgeting approach.
- 4. Another factor in our lower expenses this year is that we did not spend the money donated for Erie Gives 2024 which was designated for rectory updates. Parish Leadership decided now is the time to move forward with a larger parish renovation. The funds are being held to be used for rectory renovations, as the CSA 2025 funds will also be held until we know what the re-creation plan looks like.


