

#### **Sunday's Readings:**

Entrance Antiphon - I saw the holy city, a new Jerusalem, / coming down out of heaven from God, / prepared like a bride adorned for her husband.

Adults: In what ways can you better honor and care for your body, God's holy temple? Kids: How can you take good care of your body, since it is God's house?

#### AN ENORMOUS CALL

Jesus came to the Jerusalem temple and he looked all around. He came there because the temple is the citadel of meaning in that society, the symbolic expression of all that is true and good and beautiful, the ultimate hope and desire of his people for the presence of God. He did not like what he saw. . . The core of faith had been co-opted into aggressive commodity transactions.

Imagine that Jesus has called the Church to be a people in mission, the mission of subverting the dominant distortion of social reality, that the neighborhood might be reconstituted. What an enormous call, to work as alternative to a social system gone crazy. It is an incredibly upstream vocation, to live a different kind of life in order that the world may come to know that the pathologies in which we get caught are not the truth of our life

Imagine the Church, consider your call, to live a life worthy of your calling to God's purposes and not according to the distorted ambitions of our society. People who depart the life of distortion find themselves floating in well-being, going back into the neighborhood in generosity, going to city hall with courage, living true existence in response to the faithful gift of God. #### From the Pastor's Desk...

As we continue through the month of November, I remind you that our Catholic Tradition encourages us to pray for our beloved dead and visit their places of rest at the cemeteries during this month. This is also a good chance to encourage all of you, no matter what age you are, to make arrangements for your funeral (at the funeral home AND the church) so that you can ensure that your funeral is done the way you want it to be. It is always a regrettable situation when one of our parishioners who made Mass a priority in their life does not end up with a funeral mass because those who are planning their funeral do not have that same prioritization. Selecting your Funeral Mass readings and music can also allow you to reinforce the message you want your loved ones to hear at the funeral. If you would like to work on that, please stop by the parish office and we can get you the resources to help you with that.

I also take this opportunity to review a few of the Catholic Church's expectations on funerals and burials in general that are often misunderstood or not known...

The first two points have to do with Cremation. ONE-It is permissible for Catholics to be cremated so long as it is not done in rejection of our belief in the resurrection of the body at the second coming of Jesus Christ. TWO- We are expected to bury our deceased loved ones in blessed ground (Catholic cemetery OR a grave in a public cemetery that is blessed at the Committal Service after the Funeral). It is not, therefore, acceptable to leave cremated remains in an urn in our homes or have them scattered somewhere outside of a cemetery.

THREE- please, consult with your pastor or the priest who will be presiding over the Rite of Christian Burial with you BEFORE making any final plans or traveling arrangements. Some days and times may not work for the priest's or church's schedule; and it can be difficult if people have already purchased flight tickets, etc. (the flexibility of the family is appreciated). Please do not arrange the funeral date and time with the thought that the funeral home will find me a priest. Fr. Luke and I want to pray with you and appreciate the opportunity to be a part of the conversation to find a time that works for everyone.

FOUR- our Rite of Christian Burial includes 3 partsfirst, the Vigil Service at the Funeral Home. The church encourages an opportunity for visitation, viewing and prayer at a funeral home or other site because it allows for closure in seeing our loved one laid out as well as an opportunity for our family and friends to offer their support. To skip this step is to shortchange the grieving process and makes it more difficult for our friends and family to reach out to us. The second part of the Rite is the funeral Mass at the Church. There is no greater prayer that we can offer for our loved one than the Catholic Mass. The best thing we can do for the soul of our loved one who has died (and for all of us who remain) is to celebrate a Funeral Mass. To choose to have a funeral service at the funeral home suggests a lack of understanding and appreciation for the significance of the Mass. Even if someone is not Catholic or has been a way from the church, it could still be appropriate to have a Mass so please investigate this with the priest involved before making assumptions. The third part of the Rite is the Committal Service at the cemetery. This brings prayerful closure and helps

us make a connection to their final place of rest. Even if the Committal is done later (the body needed to be cremated or some other reason), it is still appropriate to ask a priest or deacon to lead you in that prayer (and Fr. Nick and I are happy to do that for and with you!).

As always, if you have any questions or clarifications on the Church's Guidelines for Funerals and Burials, please contact me. May all our beloved dead through the mercy of God rest in peace. Amen. And may God bless our week ahead! Fr. Rich

#### Office for the Protection of Children/Youth

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments - Know the Warning Signs of a Predator: Perpetrators are not waiting on the street to snatch kids; only 10% of sexually abused children are abused by strangers. 90% are abused by someone known and trusted by the child/ child's family. Perpetrators integrate themselves into everyone's life, not just the child. They build relationships so that they are trusted to be alone with the child. One of the most important ways to ensure the safety of children in our environments is to know the warning signs of adults who present a risk of harm to children. Among these signs are when the person (1) always wants to be alone with a child in areas where no one can monitor the interactions, (2) allows a child to do things their parents would not permit, (3) is always more excited to be with children than with adults, and (4) discourages others from participating in activities involving kids. Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

On the weekend of November 15-16, a second collection will be taken up in our parishes for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD).

Your support for this collection, which going forward in the Diocese of Erie will be known as the Local Needs Collection, brings change to communities across the country and empowers those living in poverty to transform their communities into reflections of the Kingdom of God. For more than 50 years, CCHD has helped people with low income address the root causes of poverty and injustice, not by giving "one-size-fits-all" handouts, but by funding local organizations that empower people to make positive impacts in their own communities. 
