

Family Discussion of the Week: **Overcoming Difficulties**

Jesus said, "You will be hated by all because of my name. But not a hair of your head will perish. By your endurance you will gain your souls." (Luke 21:17-19)

Adults: When bad things happen, how do you deal with them?

Kids: Have you ever worried about something that might happen? What can help you worry less?

LIFE IS HARD, BUT HAVE NO FEAR

Today's readings take a fearless look at reality and reach a conclusion that we all know: life is hard. The prophet Malachi preaches fire and brimstone, warning us that evildoers will perish in flames. Saint Paul offers his own warning to the Thessalonians: keep busy, but never become a busybody. He reminds Christians that the apostles themselves worked in "toil and drudgery" as a model for how we ought to contribute to our community. The Gospel returns to the apocalyptic tone of Malachi, describing the utter chaos of the end-times. We will know the end is near when violence, catastrophe, and hatred dominate the earth. But we must not fear! God's saving plan brings peace to our hearts. Malachi speaks of the sun's "healing rays," and Jesus himself promises to protect every hair on our heads. Copyright © J. S. Serra Prayer for Vocations

From the Pastor's Desk...

Sunday, November 16, 2025, is World Day of the Poor, a day established by Pope Francis in 2017 for Catholics to "reflect on how poverty is at the very heart of the Gospel." The theme for 2025 is *You are my hope (Ps 71:5)*. "Amid life's trials, our hope is inspired by the firm and reassuring certainty of God's love, poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit," wrote Pope Leo XIV in his message for the day. "The living God is in fact 'the God of hope' (Rom 15:13), and Christ, by his death and resurrection, has himself become 'our hope." (1 Tim 1:1). Pope Leo said that the poor "can be witnesses to a strong and steadfast hope, precisely because they embody it in the midst of uncertainty, poverty, instability, and marginalization," not being able to "rely on the security of power and possessions." Pope Leo also reminded us that "the gravest form of poverty is not to know God."

After the Year of Mercy in 2016, Pope Francis said he wanted to set aside a day so that, throughout the world, Christian communities could become even greater signs of Christ's charity for those in need. We are called, Pope Francis wrote in his first World Day of the Poor message, "to draw near to the poor, to encounter them, to meet their gaze, to embrace them, and to let them feel the warmth of love that breaks through their solitude. Their outstretched hand is also an invitation to step out of our certainties and comforts, and to acknowledge the value of poverty in itself." The pope said that for Christ's disciples, "poverty is, above all, a call to follow Jesus in his own poverty," and he asked Catholics to take as their example St. Francis of Assisi, who kept his gaze fixed on Christ, allowing him to see and serve the poor.

I take this day focused on the poor to remind you of the ways we serve the poor in this season of Fall and Winter:

- 1. "Coats for Kids" drive hosted by Inter-Church Ministries in October.
- 2. Collection of desserts for the West Millcreek Food Pantry Thanksgiving Dinners through November 23rd.
- 3. Collection of non-perishable food items at all Masses, November 24^{th} through November 30^{th} (including Thanksgiving Mass on Thursday, November 27^{th}) for the West Millcreek Food Pantry.
- 4. Advents Service Project: Donations of Gift Cards for the Shining Star Project for St. Martin Center Christmas Gift Distribution now until December 8th.
- 5. Advent Service Project: Donations of toiletries and cleaning supplies for the West Millcreek Food Pantry families, now through December 14th. The items are packed at our Advent Community Gathering on Tuesday, December 16th.
- 6. Opportunities to volunteer at Emmaus Soup Kitchen and Erie City Mission as part of our regular OLP monthly commitments.
- 7. Volunteer for the Our Neighbors Place Overflow Shelter for OLP's week of service, January 14-20, 2026 (there will be a signup weekend of December 20-21).
- 8. Keep an eye on the parish bulletin and weekly email for other opportunities to serve the poor of our community.

I thank the OLP Outreach Committee led by JoAnn Barnes and our Parish Outreach Coordinator, Andy Heinlein for all they do to help organize and execute these efforts. I have

said it before and I will say it again; I believe one significant way the Catholic Church is going to reclaim credibility in our society after the challenges we have faced is a renewed commitment to serving the poor and needy in our community. So let's all be part of that renewed commitment and renewed credibility by doing our part in serving those most in need in our community!

**Vocations are everyone's Business! As we reflect on the universal call to holiness on All Saints Day, the US Catholic Church invites us to celebrate National Vocation Awareness Week the first week of November every year. To help us all grow in awareness of the Vocation situation in the Diocese of Erie regarding clergy vocations, I present these most recent statistics.

Current statistics (2025): Active Diocesan Priests: 87 Retired Diocesan Priests: 37 Diocesan Permanent Deacons: 61

Total Seminarians: 8

Propaedeutic Year: 2 St. Mark Seminary: 3

Major Seminary: 3 (no priesthood ordinations until 2028)

The number of active diocesan priests has decreased from 130 in 2012 and 210 in 1990, and is projected to be 62 by 2031. So what can we do to encourage our young people to be open to the vocations to Holy Orders and Religious Life?

- 1. Pray: Dedicate time each day to pray for vocations or join the 31 Club that commits to offering Mass for vocations once a month.
- 2. Offer gentle encouragement to youth and create space for individuals to hear God's call. Consider joining the Serra Club of Erie that specifically seeks to find ways to support vocations. Initiate or support parish activities like a monthly Holy Hour for vocations, and don't be afraid to courageously ask young men and women if they have considered a vocation.
- 3. Build a close-knit spiritual family within the parish that nurtures vocations.
- 4. Donate to the work of vocations to help support current and future priests and seminarians.

I hope we all believe that fostering vocations is ALL of our responsibility and not just the work of priests and religious. Let's keep praying that God provides laborers for the harvest!






