Family Discussion of the Week: Putting on the Light of Christ

Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on he armor of light. (Romans 13:12b) Adults: What will you do during Advent so that others can see that you have put on the light of Jesus Christ?

Kids: What will you do during Advent so that others can see the light of Jesus in you?

HOPEFUL EXPECTATION

Our liturgical year begins with the season of Advent—a time of hopeful expectation of the coming of the Lord. On the First Sunday of Advent we look forward to the end of time when we will awaken to the dawn of Christ's new day.

Today we hear Isaiah speak of a day when God's power will have brought universal peace and God's Word will have instructed all people, radiating God's "light" (teachings) into all of human society. Only when humanity walks "in the light of the LORD" (Isaiah 2:5), when all people desire to be instructed "in [God's] ways" (Isaiah 2:3), will the world be set aright and our deepest longings fulfilled. The reading from Romans calls us to "awake from sleep" for this final "day is at hand" (Romans 13:11, 12). Advent has been a period of preparation for over 1,500 years of the Church's tradition and is seen as a time for new beginnings.

As Advent is a season of new beginnings it is a great time to experience the Sacrament of Reconciliation which is THE Sacrament of new beginnings. There is no more appropriate and effective way to prepare for the gift of Christ and Christmas than to experience Reconciliation. Here are the opportunities for the great Sacrament of Reconciliation during Advent at OLP:

- a. Confessions after all Sunday Masses
- b. Normal weekly opportunities- Wednesdays: 11:15am-Noon; Saturdays: 8:30-9am and 3:45-4:45pm
- c. "The Light Is On For You"- Wednesday, December 17th from 5-7pm. All participating Erie churches are open for confessions during this time; at OLP will have 3 confessors.

 - i. Friday, December 19th: 11:15am-12Noon.
 - ii. Monday, December 22nd from 6-7pm.

**Liturgical Adjustments at OLP/ Spiritual Communion Prayer

As we look forward to starting a new liturgical year next weekend with the First Sunday in Advent, I wanted to update you of an adjustment we will be making at Mass. But first some background... when COVID hit in 2020, we started saying the Spiritual Communion Prayer before or after the Communion Procession for those who were attending Mass via livestream through the Our Lady of Peace YouTube Channel. This was a way to help them ask for grace at the moment of Holy Communion online even if they could not receive Holy Communion and be there in person. We have continued that practice for the past 5 years as we have livestreamed our 9am Mass for those who may have still been weary of returning to Mass or unable to do so.

We have learned that technically the Spiritual Communion Prayer is not part of the Rite of the Catholic Mass, the parish staff and liturgy committee feel it is time to **stop saying the Spiritual**Communion Prayer verbally at the livestream Mass and to encourage our online participants to say the prayer on their own. For the first few weeks we will prompt the livestream congregation to say the prayer on their own and after that no mention of the spiritual communion prayer will be made at Mass. We will include the prayer in description on our YouTube livestream for Masses. Below is the Spiritual Communion Prayer we have been using:

"My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Blessed Sacrament.

I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if you were already there, and I unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen."

(Saint Alphonsus Liguori)

On a related note, I want to clarify that if you are physically able to be at Mass in person, that watching/praying the Mass online is not a valid way to attend Mass each week. I am surprised to still hear people say that they are being told by others that attending Mass online fulfills the "first Catholic precept ("You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation.") that requires the faithful to participate in the Eucharistic celebration when the Christian community gathers together on the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord." (taken from paragraph 2042 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church). One of the ways God brought good from the cross of COVID was to motivate parishes like OLP to figure out how to provide online Mass for those who are homebound. It was not to allow those who could physically be at Mass a way to fulfill the obligation by staying at home on their own free will. If you miss Mass on the weekend, it is good for you to watch the Mass online to still be connected with us and to hear the message but you should still get to confession and commit to being at Mass physically the next week.



Advent Wreath Year A

IF YOU are setting up an Advent wreath in your home this year, here are some prayers you could say while you light its candles. You may say these before or after a meal, when waking up, before going to bed, or whenever you and the members of your household gather for prayer. Before you say the prayer, read and talk over the Gospel reading you heard at Sunday Mass that week.

Week 1: O God, who invite us to stay awake because we do not know the day the Lord will come, let this candle signify the dawn of the day when your Son will come again. Help us to avoid doing things we want to hide and to live always as children of the light. Through Christ our Lord.

Week 2: O God, who sent John the Baptist to tell us to prepare the way of the Lord, let these two candles light the way for us. Help us to walk now and always in a straight path to you. May love of God and love of neighbor light our way. Through Christ our Lord.

Week 3: O God, who promised that the least one born into the Kingdom of God is greater than John the Baptist, fill us with joy as we light the rose candle. Make us happy when we serve you, and let us see the light of your glory. Through Christ our Lord.

Week 4: O God, who sent an angel to comfort Joseph in his dream, comfort us when we are afraid. Turn our darkness into light. Let these four candles warm our hearts as we await the coming of Emmanuel, God-with-us. Through Christ our Lord.




