

### Family Discussion of the Week: Our Need to Change

This is the one (John the Baptist) of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said, "The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight." (Matthew 3:3)

**Adults:** What do you need to change so that others can learn from watching you that Christ walks among us?

Kids: What could you do so that others will see in you what it means to follow Jesus?

### THE LONG-AWAITED ONE

As the Sundays of Advent unfold the scriptures shift focus from the final coming of the Lord to his historical birth. Today's scriptures blend the two. Isaiah's disillusionment with the kings of his own day led him to envision an ideal king who would rule with divine approval and be led by divine wisdom. For centuries the Jewish people anticipated the arrival of that Messiah, who would usher in a blessed age when the whole world would finally dwell in justice and peace.

After centuries of such growing expectation, the preaching of John the Baptist about the imminent arrival of the Messiah could not help but provoke intense interest. The Baptist's message about preparation for "the one who is coming" (Matthew 3:11) makes clear that Jesus is, in fact, the long-awaited one who is ushering in the new age foretold by Isaiah and all the prophets. ### From the Pastor's Desk...

I have always seen the window of December 8th to 12th (Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe) as a special opportunity to ensure that Mary is part of our Advent preparations. In 2019, Pope Francis added the feast of Our Lady of Loreto on December 10th to the universal calendar of the church; so now we even have more opportunity to honor Mary in this stretch coming up this week. Our Lady of Loreto is the main Marian devotion in Italy and the shrine holds the Holy House of Nazareth (where we visited during our Eucharistic Miracles of Italy Pilgrimage in May). There is also a Litany of Loreto to Mary which is the only Litany to Mary officially approved by the Catholic Church and which includes many of the Marian Titles for Mary acknowledged in our Catholic Tradition over the years.

So I encourage you to do something extra this week to honor our Blessed Mother. Consider praying the rosary, or a novena to Mary, or the Litany of Loreto (which is included on the next page), or refamiliarize yourself with our stain glass windows in the chapel that are dedicated to Mary (and are explained in the hallway outside the sacristy. As a Marian Parish, we can never honor Mary enough. Recall the words of St. Maximilian Kolbe who had a great devotion to Mary... "Never be afraid of loving the Blessed Virgin too much. You can never love her more than Jesus did."

May God bless us in this special Marian window and our second week of Advent ahead!





### Office for the Protection of Children/Youth

### Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments - Bullying:

Bullying is defined as any unwanted aggressive behavior by another youth or group of youths that involves an observed or perceived power imbalance and is repeated multiple times or is highly likely to be repeated. 20% of youth ages 12-18 experience bullying. When adults respond quickly to bullying behavior, they send the message that bullying is not acceptable. There are ways parents can make a positive difference. Parents can educate themselves on the signs that a child is being bullied or is a bully. Parents should keep the lines of communication open with their child and model for their child how to treat others. Encourage your child to be inclusive by welcoming others to join their activities and groups. 




