Family Discussion of the Week: Actions Worthy of Praise

Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, among those born of women no one has arisen greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he." (Matthew 11:11) *Adults:* How do you prepare yourself to meet Christ in those around you?

Kids: What good thing have you done so far during Advent to be like Jesus?

REASON TO REJOICE

Dark violet is used throughout Advent to express its character as a season of spiritual preparation for Christmas and "the coming of the Lord." But on the Third Sunday of Advent, formerly known as *Gaudete* (Latin for "rejoice") Sunday, rose may be added to the liturgical environment. The entire liturgy is infused with a spirit of rejoicing.

Today's first reading and Gospel proclaim the reality of God's saving work in our midst. Isaiah exuberantly describes the idyllic transformation of all creation as a result of God's presence in the midst of the people. In the Gospel, Jesus connects Isaiah's prophecy with what is happening in his own ministry. In addition to the list of healings from Isaiah (the blind, the lame, lepers, and the deaf), Jesus' presence brings two other reasons for rejoicing: "The dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them" (Matthew 11:5).

From the Pastor's Desk...

A blessed Gaudete Sunday to you! Recall the liturgical color of this 3rd Sunday of Advent is Rose and the theme of this week is JOY. This week we also shift into Late Advent from December 17-24 which shifts our spiritual focus from preparation for the 2nd Coming of Christ to celebrating the gift of Jesus' first coming over 2000 years ago. One opportunity that our parish will again provide to help incorporate prayer in the days of Late Advent is praying the "O Antiphons" each day at 12:05pm in the church and on Facebook Live (See the O Antiphons below. Recall that the O Antiphons are part of the build-up in anticipation during this last week of Advent. They are introduced at Evening Prayer on December 17th, and are seven jewels of liturgical song, one for each day until Christmas Eve (which I see as a kind of Holy Week for Christmas and are again traditionally called the days of "Late" Advent). They seem to sum up all our Advent longing for the Savior. The "O Antiphons" are intoned with special solemnity in monasteries at Vespers, before and after the Magnificat, Mary's prayer of praise and thanksgiving from the Gospel of Luke (2:42-55), which is sung or said every evening as the climax of this Hour of the Divine Office.

A vestige of the "Great O's" can be seen in verses of the familiar Advent hymn, "O Come, O Come Emmanuel". Each antiphon is a name of Christ, one of his attributes mentioned in Scripture. The "O Antiphons" (Latin in parenthesis) appear below in English translation, with scriptural sources and suggested symbols. The first letters of the titles in Latin taken backwards form an acrostic of "Ero Cras" which translates to "I will be tomorrow", mirroring the theme of the antiphons.

The "O Antiphons"

December 17: (O Sapientia) O WISDOM, who came from the mouth of the Most High, reaching from end to end and ordering all things mightily and sweetly: Come, and teach us the way of prudence.

Sirach 24:2; Wisdom 8:1. Symbols: oil lamp, open book.

December 18: (O Adonai) O LORD AND RULER of the House of Israel, who appeared to Moses in the flame of the burning bush and gave him the law on Sinai: Come, and redeem us with outstretched arm.

Exodus 3:2, 20:1. Symbols: burning bush, stone tablets.

December 19: (O Radix Jesse) O ROOT OF JESSE, who stands for an ensign of the people, before whom kings shall keep silence and unto whom the Gentiles shall make supplication: Come to deliver us, and tarry not. Isaiah 11:1-3. Symbol: vine or plant with flower (especially a rose).

December 20: (O Clavis David) O KEY OF DAVID, and Scepter of the House of Israel, who opens and no man shuts, who shuts and no man opens: Come, and bring forth the captive from his prison, he who sits in darkness and in the shadow of death.

Isaiah 22:22. Symbols: key; broken chains.

December 21: (O Oriens) O DAWN OF THE EAST, brightness of the light eternal, and Sun of Justice: Come, and enlighten them that sit in darkness and in the shadow of death.

Psalm 19:6-7. Symbol: rising sun.

December 22: (O Rex Gentium) O KING OF THE GENTILES and their desired One, the Cornerstone that makes both one: Come, and deliver man, whom You formed out of the dust of the earth.

Psalm 2:7-8, Ephesians 2:14-20. Symbols, Crown, scepter. **December 23:** (O Emmanuel) O EMMANUEL, God with us, our King and Lawgiver, the expected of the nations and their Savior: Come to save us, O Lord our God.

Isaiah 7:14; 33:22. Symbols: tablets of stone, Chalice and Host.

May God bless our third week of Advent ahead!

- **Advent Confessions As Advent is a season of new beginnings it is a great time to experience the Sacrament of Reconciliation which is THE Sacrament of new beginnings. There is no more appropriate and effective way to prepare for the gift of Christ and Christmas than to experience Reconciliation. Here are the opportunities at OLP:
 - a. Confessions after all Sunday Masses
 - b. Normal weekly opportunities- Wednesdays from 11:15am-Noon; Saturdays from 8:30-9am and 3:45-4:45pm
 - c. "The Light Is on For You"- Wednesday, December 17th from 5-7pm. All participating Erie churches are open for confessions during this time, OLP will have 3 confessors.
 - d. Extra Confession Times in Late Advent
 - i. Friday, Dec. 19th from 11:15am-12Noon.
 - ii. Monday, Dec. 22nd from 6-7pm.

- **<u>Masses this Week</u> *Monday, Dec. 15th* to *Saturday, Dec. 20th* Weekdays in Advent (no additional feasts).
- **With much gratitude I share with you that long time OLP parishioners, Pat and Dennis Buto, who have been transporting your weekly food donations from church to the West Millcreek Food Pantry for decades, are "retiring" from this ministry and Scott Barnes is taking the lead in this commitment. I offer a huge thank you to the Buto's on behalf all of us at OLP and add the Lord's affirmation from the Scriptures, "well done, good and faithful servants!"
- **Thank you so much to all those who were able to donate to Our Lady of Peace Parish for #iGiveCatholic 2025! At \$43,622 and 154 donors (as of this writing); OLP had the highest amounts for the Diocese of Erie in both these categories. Well done OLP!
- **Our Neighbors Place Next weekend we will be promoting OLP's participation in "Our Neighbor's Place" Ministry which is the Emergency Overflow Shelter in Erie overseen by different local church communities during the winter months. OLP will be providing volunteers and resources the week of Wednesday, January 14th to Tuesday, January 20th. I believe it is a critical ministry for our parish to be involved in so please be ready to hear more about it next weekend and be open to the ways that you can help.

**Follow up to my homily on hope and new life in the church from the weekend of November 29-30 Several weeks ago I mentioned some hopeful statistics between OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation for Adults) at parishes and college campuses as well as October counts at OLP. I want to repeat them here so you can all see them.

OCIA Participation:

Significant Increase in OCIA conversions throughout the United States- The increase is not isolated, as dioceses across the country—including New York, Detroit, Atlanta, Los Angeles, and Washington D.C.—are reporting significantly larger OCIA classes, with some noting their largest numbers in decades. This was also affirmed by many bishops at their latest USCCB meeting in November.

Significant Growth in Parishes-: Specific parishes have seen their numbers double or triple in a single year. For instance, St. Joseph's Church in Greenwich Village reported that interest in OCIA tripled, with about 130 people signing up. At OLP we went from having classes of 3-6 from 2019-2023 to 10 in 2024-25 and now 18 in 2025-26.

Growth on Campuses across the U.S.- Increases of doubling and tripling are reported across the U.S., from large state schools (like Texas A&M, Arizona State, Minnesota., Illinois, Nebraska) to Catholic institutions (like Notre Dame and Gannon).

Global Trend- Similar surges in young adult converts are seen in countries like Austria, Canada, France, and the UK.

October counts at OLP:

We reached height in the last 25 years with the average of 3,089 people participating in Mass in October 2004.

From 2004 to 2019, we saw a steady decline to 1,375 average mass attendance in 2019, and reached a low in October 2020 (COVID) with the average of 521 people attending Masses at OLP. Increased to the 900 in 2021 and 2022.

Increased to 1,055 in 2023, 1,140 in 2024 and 1,158 in 2025.

So, we have seemed to bottom out and are slowly building back up over the last 5 years since COVID.

Reasons:

Post-COVID Yearning: Some church leaders credit a "post-COVID sacramental boom," as people who postponed religious connection during the pandemic now seek community and a deeper sense of purpose.

Motivations: Converts and participants often cite various reasons for their interest, including a yearning to connect with something bigger than themselves amid confusing news headlines, the influence of the National Eucharistic Revival, and personal evangelization.

Let's allow these statistics to be a witness to new life in the church and our parish, and a source of hope this Advent Season!

**OLP Cursillo 2026 Last year we tried something new in collaboration with the Cursillo Retreat Movement in our Diocese and it was a great success. For the men's retreat in February 2025, OLP parishioners comprised most of the team and two thirds of the candidates and it was a great boost to both our parish and the Cursillo Movement. So we are going continue that with the Women's Cursillo April 17-19, 2026, at Our Lady of Mercy Church in Harborcreek. I will be one of the spiritual directors, along with Deacon Ralph, and hopefully the lay leader (called a rector) will be as well.

Here's a little more about Erie Cursillo from their website... "Cursillo (kur-SEE-yo) literally means "little course" and is an intense three-day spiritual retreat, the purpose of which is a deep personal encounter with Jesus Christ. Those who experience the Cursillo Movement know it is more than just three days of religious instruction. It is an effort to change the spiritual environment, to bring Jesus Christ into the world."
