

TRUST IN GOD

On this final Sunday of Advent our scriptures focus on the historical birth of Jesus, who is son of David and Son of God, child and king, Jesus and Emmanuel.


Isaiah the prophet begs Ahaz to ask for a sign, to allow God to offer him reassurance of the survival of the Davidic dynasty. The king hypocritically refuses to "tempt the LORD" in that way (Isaiah 7:12), but the prophet foretells the birth of a son, an heir to the throne, who will prove the Lord's enduring protection of God's chosen lineage on the throne of David. The child will be called Emmanuel.

Matthew's reference to this history in his description of the birth of Jesus highlights the contrast between the faithless refusal of trust shown by Ahaz, and the complete trust in God shown by Mary and Joseph in bringing about the birth of Jesus Christ. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

I encourage you to get to the church early for the 5:00pm and Midnight Masses on Christmas Eve. **Prelude music from 4:15-5pm (Selah Praise Band), 7:15-7:30PM (Cantor), and 11:30pm – Midnight (Voice of Peace Choir).** This is a great way to prepare for our Christmas Masses and to show gratitude to our music groups who put much time into preparing for the Christmas Season and help make it so special. We also look forward to hearing the Announcement of Christmas at Midnight Mass.

**Please note that we only have one daily Mass on Wednesday, December 24th at 7am. There is NO 12:10pm Mass that day.

Remember that we celebrate Christmas as an Octave so from Thursday, December 25 to Thursday, January Ist our Masses will have full solemnity as if it is Christmas Day with a Gloria, extra music and chant as well as the use of the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I). Both ends of the octave, Christmas and Mary, Mary of God (January Ist) are Holy Days of Obligation. Masses for Mary, Mother of God will be Wednesday, December 31st at 5:30pm and Thursday, January Ist at 10am.

May God bless our 4th week of Late Advent and our Christmas Octave ahead!

- **Last call for Advent Confessions.... After all Sunday Masses this weekend and 6-7pm on Monday, December 22nd.
- **Our Neighbors Place This weekend we will be promoting OLP's participation in "Our Neighbor's Place" Ministry which is the Emergency Overflow Shelter in Erie overseen by local church communities during the winter months. OLP will be providing volunteers and resources the week of Wednesday, January 14th to Tuesday, January 20th. This is a critical ministry, and I believe it is essential for our parish to be involved; so please be ready to hear more about it and be open to the ways that you can help.
- **Please note that the parish office will be closed starting on Wednesday, December 24th at Noon and will reopen on Monday, January 5, 2026. Thank you for understanding the need to give our parish staff a well-deserved break.
- **Volunteer Appreciation Dinner Our Parish Volunteer

 Appreciation Dinner will be Saturday, January 24th at 6pm. All volunteers are encouraged to RSVP to the church office by January 12th.

- **Masses this Week Monday, Dec. 22nd to Wednesday, Dec. 24th- Weekdays in Advent; Thursday, Dec. 25th- the Nativity of the Lord; Friday, Dec. 26th- St. Stephen, Protomartyr; Saturday, Dec. 27th- St. John, Apostle and Evangelist.
- **Thank you to Warren and Christine Beaver and Mike and Mary Beth Whitman for, again, donating the Christmas Books for our Parish! This year we are giving out the book "The Forgotten Way: the St. James Master Plan" by Matthew Kelly. Matthew Kelly develops a simple yet profound approach to holiness based on the 11 words from the Letter of St. James in the Bible... "Someone who does not trip up in speech has reached perfection." James 3:2. I hope you will take advantage of this gift and allow the wisdom of St. James and Matthew Kelly draw you closer to perfection.
- **Christmas Gloria The Gloria returns to Mass on Christmas Eve as we join the Angels who sang the opening line of the Gloria on that first Christmas Night. Let's prepare to give Glory to God in our Christmas celebrations!
- **Christmas Season Recall that the Christmas Season lasts for 2 and a half weeks. Highlights include the Feast of the Holy Family (Sunday, December 28th), Mary, the Mother of God (Thursday, January 1st), and the Epiphany (Sunday, January 4th when we will have the Proclamation of the dates for Easter and other significant dates of the Liturgical Year and hand out the house blessing cards). The Christmas Season will conclude on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord on Sunday, January 11th and we will have Solemn Evening Prayer with Benediction at 6pm to conclude our Christmas celebration.
- **Holy Hour for Peace We will again "ring in the New Year" with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 11pm-12

 Midnight on New Year's Eve (Wednesday, December 31st). What a great way to start the new year by receiving the Blessing (Benediction) of Jesus through His Eucharistic Presence right at Midnight! We will pray for peace in our world through a litany of peace. After the Holy Hour there will be time for a champagne toast and fellowship in the rectory.
- **OLP Cursillo 2026 Last year we tried something new in collaboration with the Cursillo Retreat Movement in our Diocese and it was a great success. For the men's retreat in February 2025, OLP parishioners comprised most of the team and two thirds of the candidates and it was a great boost to both our parish and the Cursillo Movement. So we are going continue that with the Women's Cursillo April 17-19, 2026, at Our Lady of Mercy Church in Harborcreek. I will be one of the spiritual directors, along with Deacon Ralph, and hopefully the lay leader (called a rector) will be as well.

Here's a little more about Erie Cursillo from their website... "Cursillo (kur-SEE-yo) literally means "little course" and is an intense three-day spiritual retreat, the purpose of which is a deep personal encounter with Jesus Christ. Those who experience the Cursillo Movement know it is more than just three days of religious instruction. It is an effort to change the spiritual environment, to bring Jesus Christ into the world." **Follow up to my homily on hope and new life in the church from the weekend of November 29-30 Several weeks ago I mentioned some hopeful statistics between OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation for Adults) at parishes and college campuses as well as October counts at OLP. I want to repeat them here so you can all see them.

OCIA Participation:

Significant Increase in OCIA conversions throughout the United States- The increase is not isolated, as dioceses across the country—including New York, Detroit, Atlanta, Los Angeles, and Washington D.C.—are reporting significantly larger OCIA classes, with some noting their largest numbers in decades. This was also affirmed by many bishops at their latest USCCB meeting in November.

Significant Growth in Parishes-: Specific parishes have seen their numbers double or triple in a single year. For instance, St. Joseph's Church in Greenwich Village reported that interest in OCIA tripled, with about 130 people signing up. At OLP we went from having classes of 3-6 from 2019-2023 to 10 in 2024-25 and now 18 in 2025-26.

Growth on Campuses across the U.S.- Increases of doubling and tripling are reported across the U.S., from large state schools (like Texas A&M, Arizona State, Minnesota., Illinois, Nebraska) to Catholic institutions (like Notre Dame and Gannon).

Global Trend- Similar surges in young adult converts are seen in countries like Austria, Canada, France, and the UK.

October counts at OLP:

We reached height in the last 25 years with the average of 3,089 people participating in Mass in October 2004.

From 2004 to 2019, we saw a steady decline to 1,375 average mass attendance in 2019, and reached a low in October 2020 (COVID) with the average of 521 people attending Masses at OLP. Increased to the 900 in 2021 and 2022. Increased to 1,055 in 2023, 1,140 in 2024 and 1,158 in 2025.

So, we have seemed to bottom out and are slowly building back up over the last 5 years since COVID.

Reasons:

Post-COVID Yearning: Some church leaders credit a "post-COVID sacramental boom," as people who postponed religious connection during the pandemic now seek community and a deeper sense of purpose.

Motivations: Converts and participants often cite various reasons for their interest, including a yearning to connect with something bigger than themselves amid confusing news headlines, the influence of the National Eucharistic Revival, and personal evangelization.

Let's allow these statistics to be a witness to new life in the church and our parish, and a source of hope!



Key Highlights from the US Bishops Conference meeting in Nov. 2025:

- Immigration: Issued a pastoral message calling for meaningful immigration reform, emphasizing human dignity, secure borders, and protection for migrants, sending it to Pope Leo XIV. (https://www.usccb.org/resources/USCCB% 20Special%20Message%20on%20Immigra tion.pdf)
- Healthcare Directives: Overwhelmingly approved revisions to the <u>Ethical and</u> <u>Religious Directives</u>, prohibiting genderaffirming interventions in Catholic healthcare settings.
- Elections & Leadership: Elected Archbishop Paul S. Skluzacek as President, Bishop Daniel E. Flores as Vice President, and Bishop Kevin C. Rhoades as Secretary of the USCCB.
- Liturgical Texts: Approved new liturgical Bible text (Catholic American Bible) for 2027 and other liturgical updates.
- National Eucharistic Congress: Approved plans for a major Eucharistic Congress in 2029.
- Al in the Church: Heard a presentation on artificial intelligence as an "evangelical opportunity" for the Church.
- Consecration: Voted to consecrate the U.S. to the Sacred Heart of Jesus in 2026 for the 250th anniversary of the nation's founding.






