

SALVATION IN DAILY LIFE

This Sunday is the feast of the Holy Family, which comes on the first Sunday after Christmas Day. Today's feast celebrates how the humanity of Jesus (including his entire family life) has brought saving significance into the daily rhythms of our human family life.

The scriptures offer instruction and encouragement on how to share—within our families, parish families, and the wider human family—the love that God shares with us in Jesus. Selections from Sirach, Psalm 128, and Colossians encourage us to reflect divine love and thus find holiness in all our human relationships. The reading from Matthew's Gospel offers a living example of love in the actions Joseph took to protect his young family from danger and to nurture them within the larger family of faith of their time.

From the Pastor's Desk...

Happy Feast of the Holy Family and 4th Day of the Christmas Octave! I would like to share with you an article from Our Sunday Visitor written in 2021 regarding the family. It is about St. John Paul II's apostolic exhortation on the family that I just finished re-reading with a group of men from our parish who are raising families with children age 14 and younger. I was reminded of the great insights of JPII in this writing and so again wanted to share a summary with you.

"5 takeaways for families on the 40th anniversary of John Paul II's 'Familiaris Consortio' by Soren and Ever Johnson: It's not a stretch to say that the writings of Pope St. John Paul II can fill a library. But for us, one slender volume stands out in a sweeping 26-year pontificate that saw 14 encyclicals, 16 books and thousands of homilies, speeches and addresses. Celebrating 40 years this Nov. 22, the apostolic exhortation Familiaris Consortio ("The Community of the Family") was characterized by papal biographer George Weigel as one of St. John Paul II's "personal favorites." Familiaris Consortio, issued Nov. 22, 1981, has been called a plan of action, a road map and strategy for the Christian family; it is also a forerunner to Pope Francis' Amoris Laetitia ("The Joy of Love"). This quick read (three hours, give or take) is not only our personal favorite from the saint; it's a bracing vision that explodes with insights and strategies for the challenges every Christian family faces today.

The following is a list of five takeaways that we hope will inspire you to sit down and read the full document — one that might just become one of your personal favorites as well.

1. Your example is where everything starts

"The future of humanity passes by way of the family," wrote Pope St. John Paul II (No. 75). By extension, the future of your family passes by way of ... yes, your own personal example.

Do our children see us as parents who are leading them consistently and lovingly in prayer? "Only by praying together with their children," John Paul II writes in a striking passage, "can a father and mother — exercising their royal priesthood — penetrate the innermost depths of their children's hearts and leave an impression that the future events in their lives will not be able to efface" (No. 60).

When life gets difficult — when the inevitable temptations and hardships are encountered by our children — will the "innermost depths" of their hearts bear a permanent, convincing impression of God's tender care for his people and of our faithfulness in mirroring that care for our children? Please God, yes!

2. You can't outsource your role as primary educator and first herald

"You have asked to have your children baptized," we heard from the priest at the baptism of each of our children. "In so doing, you are accepting the responsibility of training him/her in the practice of the Faith. ... Do you clearly understand what you are undertaking?" "We do," we answered as parents.

But then what? Nature abhors a vacuum, and sadly, too many parents today have — through whatever combination of woundedness, neglect and distraction — created a vacuum of authority and formation.

Familiaris Consortio is a wake-up call that no, we are not primarily our children's chauffeur for curbside drop-off at CCD or

Catholic school. In fact, we are the "first and foremost educators" and "first heralds of the Gospel" of our families, which St. John Paul II calls "the first and vital cell of society," "a school of humanity," an "educating community," "the first school of the social virtues," and a "society in its own original right."

3. Your family is a 'Little Trinity'

"Families, become what you are," John Paul II writes. The family, he continues, is the "living image of God," "a communion of persons."

To a culture that has forgotten the blueprint for the family, *Familiaris Consortio* invites us back to the Holy Trinity. Our family is a little icon or image of the Trinity. If each person of the Trinity is focused not on himself, not on material things, but on others, then our family is called to image this othercentered, "self-giving" way of life. As St. John Paul II writes, the "experience of communion and sharing should characterize the family's daily life." "As a community of love," he writes, "it finds in self-giving the law that guides it and makes it grow" (No. 37).

Becoming who we are as families, *Familiaris Consortio* reminds us, means a constant turning toward the Trinity in our daily life.

4. Your family is a 'Little Church'

If we're honest, we know that our culture defaults to a thin, reductionist view of "home" as a place to drop our stuff before we run off to the next activity. Our homes easily slip into "entertainment centers" where each member of the family pursues his or her own individual interests.

Familiaris Consortio instead outlines the vision for the family's "church in miniature" or "domestic church." "The dignity and responsibility of the Christian family as the domestic church," St. John Paul II writes, "can be achieved only with God's unceasing aid, which will surely be granted if it is humbly and trustingly petitioned in prayer" (No. 59).

Like a majestic cathedral, our homes ought to offer our children an immersive experience in the Faith. A beautiful home altar or prayer corner, icons, a crucifix — these and other visuals, suffused in "a family atmosphere so animated with love and reverence for God," will help to deepen our families' "fidelity and intensity of prayer" and "actual participation in the mission of the Church" (No. 62).

5. Your family is on mission

If our family is a "communion of persons," an image of the Trinity, and a "domestic church," then it only follows that we have been entrusted with what St. John Paul II calls a "missionary task."

"The future of evangelization," he writes, "depends in great part on the Church of the home" (No. 52). No pressure, Mom and Dad! By "radiating the joy of love" and the "certainty of the hope for which it must give an account," he writes, "the Christian family loudly proclaims both the present virtues of the Kingdom of God and the hope of a blessed life to come" (No. 52).

St. Joseph, Pillar of Families, pray for us!
St. John Paul II, pray for us!"
May God bless the rest of our Christmas Octave ahead!

- **Christmas Octave and Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God
 We celebrate Christmas as an Octave so from Thursday,
 December 25 to Thursday, January 1st our Masses will have full
 solemnity as if Christmas Day with a Gloria, extra music and
 chant as well as the use of the Roman Canon (Eucharistic
 Prayer I). Both ends of the octave, Christmas and Mary, Mary
 of God (January 1st) are Holy Days of Obligation. Masses for
 Mary, Mother of God will be Wednesday, December 31st at
 5:30pm and Thursday, January 1st at 10am.
- **Holy Hour for Peace We will again "ring in the New Year" with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 11pm-12
 Midnight on New Year's Eve (Wednesday, December 31st). What a great way to start the new year by receiving the Blessing (Benediction) of Jesus through His Eucharistic Presence right at Midnight! We will pray for peace in our world through a litany of peace. After the Holy Hour there will be time for a champagne toast and fellowship in the rectory.
- **Thank you to Warren and Christine Beaver and Mike and Mary Beth Whitman for, again, donating the Christmas Books for our Parish! This year we are giving out the book "The Forgotten Way: the St. James Master Plan" by Matthew Kelly. Matthew Kelly develops a simple yet profound approach to holiness based on the 11 words from the Letter of St. James in the Bible... "Someone who does not trip up in speech has reached perfection." James 3:2. I hope you will take advantage of this gift and allow the wisdom of St. James and Matthew Kelly draw you closer to perfection.
- **Christmas Season Recall that the Christmas Season lasts for 2 and a half weeks. Highlights include the Feast of the Holy Family (Sunday, December 28th), Mary, the Mother of God (Thursday, January 1st), and the Epiphany (Sunday, January 4th when we will have the Proclamation of the dates for Easter and other significant dates of the Liturgical Year and hand out the house blessing cards). The Christmas Season will conclude on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord on Sunday, January 11th and we will have Solemn Evening Prayer with Benediction at 6pm to conclude our Christmas celebration.
- **Volunteer Appreciation Dinner Our Parish Volunteer
 Appreciation Dinner will be Saturday, January 24th at 6pm. All volunteers are encouraged to RSVP to the church office by January 12th.

- **House Blessings The Christmas Season, and more specifically the Epiphany, is the traditional time of year for house blessings. Fr. Luke and I are more than willing to come to your homes and bless them with you. Feel free to call either one of us and set up a time to do so.
- *** Masses this Week Monday, Dec. 29th- 5th Day within the Octave of Christmas and the Feast of St. Thomas Beckett (13th Century Bishop of Canterbury killed by King Henry II); Tuesday, Dec. 30th- 6th Day of the Octave of Christmas; Wednesday, December 31st- 7th Day within the Octave of Christmas and feast of St. Sylvester I, Pope; Thursday, January 1st- Solemnity of the Mary, the Holy Mother of God, the Octave day of Christmas; Friday, Jan. 2nd- Sts. Basil the Great and Gregory of Nanzianzen, Bishops, Doctors of the Church (4th Century): Saturday, Jan. 3rd- the Holy Name of Jesus.
- **Our Neighbors Place OLP will participate in "Our Neighbor's Place" Ministry, which is the Emergency Overflow Shelter in Erie overseen by local church communities during the winter months. OLP will be providing volunteers and resources the week of Wednesday, January 14th to Tuesday, January 20th. This is a critical ministry, and I believe it is essential for our parish to be involved; please be open to the ways you can help. **OLP Cursillo 2026 Last year we tried something new in collaboration with the Cursillo Retreat Movement in our Diocese and it was a great success. For the men's retreat in February 2025, OLP parishioners comprised most of the team and two thirds of the candidates and it was a great boost to both our parish and the Cursillo Movement. So we are going continue that with the Women's Cursillo April 17-19, 2026, at Our Lady of Mercy Church in Harborcreek. I will be one of the spiritual directors, along with Deacon Ralph, and hopefully the lay leader (called a rector) will be as well.

Here's a little more about Erie Cursillo from their website... "Cursillo (kur-SEE-yo) literally means "little course" and is an intense three-day spiritual retreat, the purpose of which is a deep personal encounter with Jesus Christ. Those who experience the Cursillo Movement know it is more than just three days of religious instruction. It is an effort to change the spiritual environment, to bring Jesus Christ into the world."
