Family Discussion of the Week: Pleasing to God

And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased." (Luke 3:2)

Adults: Do you think that God was "well pleased" by your actions in recent weeks? Why?

Kids: What good thing could you do this week that would be pleasing to God?

THIS IS MY BELOVED SON

This Sunday's celebration of the Baptism of the Lord closes the Christmas season. In the scriptures we see one more epiphany, or manifestation, of the Spirit of God in Jesus—but this time it is as an adult, rather than as a child. Jesus' baptism also serves as the inauguration of his prophetic mission and the messianic age.

Today's reading from Isaiah describes God's chosen Messiah, upon whom God's spirit rests. In the Acts of the Apostles Peter says that "God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power" (Acts 10:38). Finally, in the proclamation from Matthew's Gospel Jesus' baptism in water goes almost unnoticed. The crucial moment comes when the Spirit of God comes upon Jesus and a voice from heaven echoes the words of Isaiah: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased" (Matthew 3:17). From the Pastor's Desk...

The Liturgical Season of Christmas comes to end this weekend with our celebration of the Baptism of the Lord (**technically at Evening Prayer which we will celebrate at 6pm this Sunday**). The Baptism of the Lord is the 3rd of the three manifestations of Jesus celebrated in the Christmas Season (with the Angels announcement to the Shepherds at Christmas and the Adoration of the Magi at the Epiphany being the other two). The Baptism of the Lord is the manifestation that is part of Jesus' transition into his public ministry that would ultimately end with his Passion, Death and Resurrection. God the Father confirms Jesus' identity as His Son when he rises out of the waters of the Jordan River. Jesus did not need to be Baptized by St. John for his sake (forgiveness of sin), but rather by participating in it He accomplished several things- He sanctified the waters of this world to become the instrument of Baptism for the rest of time; He validated St. John's baptism and ministry; He set the example for His disciples to follow and reinforced the necessity of Baptism; and as stated above, it allows for the Father to publicly affirm Jesus' identity as the Son of God. In the Gospels, Jesus essentially goes from His Baptism to the Temptations in the Desert which is where the Lent begins on the first Sunday of Lent every year. This is a great weekend to renew our gratitude for our Baptisms in which we, too, became daughters and sons of God!

May God bless our first week of Ordinary Time ahead!

****Epiphany Home Blessing Cards** Last weekend we distributed the House Blessing Cards on the Feast of the Epiphany. Recall that the "20+C+M+B+26" on the cards stands for the present year with the first letter of the 3 magi, Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar, which can also stand for the first letters of the Latin phrase "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" which translates to "Christ bless this home/dwelling." There is a prayer that you are encouraged to say on the back as you place them over the main door to your house on the inside. It says- "May all who come to our home rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve Christ in everyone we meet. Amen." Every year I say what a great year we will have if we can allow God to accomplish that prayer in us in our homes as well as our parish family here at Our Lady of Peace. So let us focus on that in 2026.

****Epiphany Announcement of Easter and the Moveable Feasts (for the year 2026)**

"Know, dear brothers and sisters,
that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ,
so by leave of God's mercy
we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection,
who is our Savior.

On the eighteenth day of February will fall Ash Wednesday,
and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season.
On the fifth day of April you will celebrate with joy Easter Day,
the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the seventeenth day of May will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the twenty-fourth day of May, the feast of Pentecost.
On the seventh day of June the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

On the twenty-ninth day of November, the First Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ,
to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen."

****Thoughts on Purifying the Sacred Vessels during Mass** You may have noticed that at the beginning of Advent we started to purify the sacred vessels at the altar immediately after Holy Communion. This was a recommendation of the Liturgy Committee for several reasons:

1. The universal law as stated in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no. 279 states, "The sacred vessels are purified by the priest, the deacon, or an instituted acolyte after Communion or after Mass, insofar as possible at the credence table." Since I have been at OLP and I believe for many years before, we had been doing the purification after Mass. Unfortunately after a closer look at what the rubrics call for and the challenge of timing (the clergy desire to be available to greet people after Mass and the priests commit to hearing confessions right after Mass in Advent and Lent as well), after Mass continues to become a more and more challenging time to purify in the way the church asks us. The reason we purify at the altar instead of the credence table is just a practical matter of space and less congestion.
2. Purifying during the Mass allows the congregation to have the sacredness of the Eucharist reinforced for them as they see the care we take with the vessels and any left over body and blood of Christ. Hopefully the attention to such detail reminds us what we believe and not to take this gift for granted.
3. The moment after the distribution of Holy Communion is the most significant opportunity for individual prayer time that there is during the Mass. Purifying at this time can allow for more time for personal, silent prayer with God. I encourage you not to be watching the liturgical action at that time (what I sometimes call the Clergy "doing the dishes" from our spiritual meal) but to close your eyes and to focus on receiving the great embrace from God that the Mass (and in this specific moment, Holy Communion) is. Maybe the image of St. John laying his head on the chest of Jesus at the last supper can help you enter into that moment even more. Whatever it takes- receive this amazing embrace of God's love, and love and thank Him back in your heart, and if you get a few more seconds to that now while we purify the vessels, I cannot see any way that would not be a good thing.

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments - January is Human Trafficking Prevention Month: In 2024, the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children received over 27,800 reports of possible child sex trafficking. The average age of child sex trafficking victims is 15 years old. Child sex trafficking is child abuse. It occurs when a minor is advertised, solicited, or exploited through a commercial sex act where sex is exchanged for money, food, shelter, drugs or anything of value. Traffickers can be family members (even parents), friends, gangs, foster parents, trusted adults or boyfriends. Talk openly with your child about this reality and build resiliency. Address myths that glamorize the commercial sex industry. Warn about online risks: social media and gaming platforms are used by traffickers to target, groom, and recruit victims. Prepare your child: at some point they will likely encounter inappropriate messages or harmful content. Teach them how to respond safely.
