

Sunday's Readings:

Entrance Antiphon - All the earth shall bow down before you, O God, / and shall sing to you, / shall sing to your name, O Most High!

First Reading - The glory of the LORD shows through Israel, a light to all nations, that salvation may reach to the ends of the earth (Isaiah 49:3, 5-6).

Psalm - Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will (Psalm 40).

Second Reading - All those who call upon the name of the Lord are called to be holy (1 Corinthians 1:1-3).

Gospel - John the Baptist testifies: The one who comes after me, on whom the Spirit comes down and remains, is the Son of God (John 1:29-34).

Family Discussion of the Week: Jesus, the Son of God

(John said,) "I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel." (John 1:31)

Adults: We witness to Christ as John did, by living lives full of generosity, forgiveness, and mercy toward others. When do you find it most difficult to do this?

Kids: Who has surprised you by doing something kind for you when you did not expect it?

CALLED TO BE HOLY

With this Sunday we begin Ordinary Time. The readings tell us about God's relationship with Israel and John the Baptist's relationship with Jesus. Israel's relationship with God is so close, so intimate, that it is through Israel that God's "salvation [will] reach to the ends of the earth" (Isaiah 49:6). But we know from John the Baptist that for Israel to accomplish God's will, it must also recognize that Jesus is the Son of God. During these weeks we also get to know Jesus. We begin to understand more deeply our relationship to Jesus and what that relationship means for us, who are "called to be holy" (1 Corinthians 1:2). Copyright © J. S. Paluch

****Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of the Unborn and Holy Hour for Life** From the US Bishops in 2013, on January 22nd, the anniversary of the Supreme Court Decision Roe vs. Wade that legalized abortion in the United States (in 1973), all dioceses in the United States shall observe "a day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion." At OLP we will have Eucharistic Adoration from 7:30am to 6:30pm on Thursday (January 22nd) and a holy hour with Adoration from 6:30-7:30pm to pray for this intention.

****Week of Prayer for Christian Unity** This week we enter into the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (**January 18-25 every year**). Ecumenism is the name we give to the movement and effort to seek greater unity among all Christians (efforts at unity among people of all religions is called "Interfaith"). Certainly part of that effort is to initiate ways we can pray, serve and stand for justice together with Christians from other denominations. But it also involves engaging in dialogue and study with other Christians in the effort to find ways to overcome that which still divides us. The Holy Spirit that gave birth to the church is the key to bringing greater Christian Unity so we pray for the Holy Spirit to inspire us and our leaders to be instruments of this unity that God desires.

****"Adult Night Out" Trivia Night**



****Masses this Week** **Monday, Jan. 19th**- Mass for the Unity of Christians; **Tuesday, Jan. 20th**- St. Sebastian, Martyr (3rd Century Roman Chief of the Praetorian Guard and patron of soldiers and athletes); **Wednesday, Jan. 21st**- St. Agnes, Virgin and Martyr (4th Century model of Christian Virtue, killed at the age of 12); **Thursday, Jan. 22nd**- Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of the Unborn/Mass for Giving Thanks to God for the Gift of Human Life; **Friday, Jan. 23rd**- St. Marianne Cope, Virgin (born in Germany in 1838 but immigrated to Utica, NY within a year, eventually joined the Sisters of St. Francis in Syracuse, NY and finally went to Hawaii to serve the needs of the lepers); **Saturday, Jan. 24th**- St. Francis de Sales, Bishop and Doctor of the Church (17th century bishop in Geneva and helped bring many Catholics back to the faith who had left during the Protestant Reformation).






