Family Discussion of the Week: Following Jesus

Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people. (Matthew 4:23)

Adults: To whom could you preach the gospel of Jesus Christ this week with actions rather than words?

Kids: What could you do for someone this week that would tell them something about Jesus?

SEEKING THE LIGHT

In today's readings we find ourselves being drawn more deeply into relationship with Jesus. We are getting to know more about him as we see how he struggles with the news of his cousin John's arrest. His first response is to withdraw, to leave Nazareth and go to Capernaum. There he is perhaps both consoled and challenged by the words of Isaiah that Matthew quotes: "the people who sit in darkness have seen a great light, / on those dwelling in a land overshadowed by death / light has arisen" (Matthew 4:16). Jesus contemplates his cousin's death, perhaps his own death, and he seeks the light. Maybe it is these words of Isaiah that move Jesus out of his withdrawal and into action. He begins to preach, teach, cure disease and illness, and proclaim the gospel of the kingdom.

Called By Name

Helping young men discern God's call in their lives

Next weekend our parish will begin participating with 8-10 other parishes in a pilot launch of **Called By Name**, an initiative to promote vocations to the priesthood and religious life. During this pilot phase, parishioners are asked to submit the names of Catholic single young men between the ages of 14 and 40 who might have a calling to a religious vocation. This pilot phase is focused only on young men; a broader launch of Called By Name will occur later in 2026 and will include women and be diocesan-wide. This pilot phase gives the Vocations Department an opportunity to monitor, evaluate and tweak the process of implementing Called By Name prior to the broader diocesan-wide launch.

In preparation for this special weekend, we are asking you to participate by spending time this week thinking and praying about someone in our parish whom God may be calling to the priesthood or religious life - someone with the qualities that you would want in your priest or a religious brother. You will be able to submit the names of those young men online or by submitting a printed form beginning next weekend. More information will be shared next weekend.

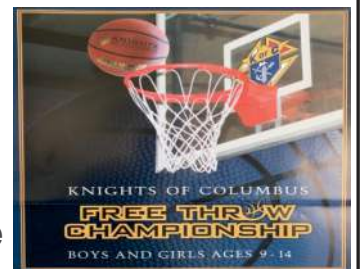
