**Your Light Must Shine Before Others**

**In the Spotlight:** Our society loves celebrity. We love it so much that we've created a whole social class of them, people who are celebrated: celebrities. The place we often find them is "in the spotlight." But in one of his usual twists on our usual assumptions about what is right and good, Jesus today informs us that we shouldn't be *in* the spotlight, we should *be* the spotlight. Paul understood this when he was writing to the Corinthians. He did not come to them as a celebrity, as the one to be celebrated; he came weak, fearful, and trembling so that the light of the gospel, and not his own, might shine. Isaiah gives us a bit more information about whom we should shine our light upon: the hungry who need to be fed, the homeless who need shelter, the oppressed who need a voice. Our own little spotlight, then, becomes the very light of the dawning day, as we build lives and communities that live in charity and justice.

## From the Pastor's Desk...

Happy February! The beginning of the month of February is a time to celebrate several traditional customs in our Catholic faith. February 2<sup>nd</sup> is the feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple and traditionally called Candlemas Day. It is halfway between the Winter Solstice and the Spring Equinox and so, in the Northern Hemisphere as we see the days becoming longer, we celebrate Jesus as the Light of the World and bless our candles that constantly remind us of that. At the 12:10pm Mass on Monday, February 2<sup>nd</sup>, we will start Mass with a blessing of candles (you are invited to bring any candles you would like blessed for your shrines at home) and have a candlelight procession to celebrate Jesus as the Light of the World. Also, there will be some candles that will be available to take for a donation.

February 3<sup>rd</sup> is the Feast of St. Blaise and the traditional day to offer throat blessings due to the story of St. Blaise helping a young boy with a throat issue. So at all Masses this weekend (January 31/February 1) we will offer a solemn general blessing for this purpose as part of the concluding rites and then after Mass, clergy from OLP will offer personal blessings for those who wish to receive them. On Tuesday, February 3<sup>rd</sup>, throat blessings are offered after the Homily at both daily Masses. The blessing prayer which I share here, reminds us the this is a blessing for general health and healing. *"Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God heal you of any disease of the throat and other any illness, in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Amen."* The blessing is offered with two candles crossed and tied with red ribbon that were blessed the previous day. February 11<sup>th</sup> is the World Day of Prayer for the Sick (the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes where many people have experienced hope and healing through Mary's intercession) so this is a good time to recommit ourselves to prayer for all those who are sick and suffering in body, mind or soul. Please know if that is you, that your pastor and your parish family pray for you and are here for you to help you carry your cross with faith, hope and love. May God bless those who are sick and our week ahead!

Those whose names are submitted will receive a personal letter of encouragement and some resources to help them discern from Bishop Persico and Fr. Scott Jabo, the Vocation Director.
