Family Discussion of the Week: Spreading the Light of Christ

Jesus said, "In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:16)

Adults: In what way might you be hiding the light of Christ from others? What could you do to improve this?

Kids: How can you let the light of Christ in you shine for others this week?

GOD'S CALL

The person who has been "saved," who has "heard the good news of salvation," still lives in an unsaved world, a world sadly oblivious to the presence of God. Today's readings outline how the disciple is present in the world.

The outline begins with Isaiah: "Share your bread . . . shelter the oppressed . . . clothe the naked" (Isaiah 58:7). Those who hear the word of salvation are not insensitive to the urgent needs of others. Then Paul reminds his flock that he brought Christ to them not in eloquence or wisdom, but by being with them in the "weakness and fear" of their daily lives (1 Corinthians 2:3). Finally, Jesus tells his disciples to go out into the gloom and darkness of the streets of the world and let God's light shine through their good deeds.

We disciples don't save the world. To the extent, however, that we have heard the word of God and been awakened to God's presence, we may spread that word and bring that presence to others.

Nick's home parish) on January 27th. The exact cause of death has not yet been declared but it is understood to be natural causes. Fr. The pilot launch of the Called By Name campaign that was announced in last week's bulletin begins this weekend. This is not only an opportunity for us to reflect upon God's personal call in our own lives, but also a chance to allow God to call others through our invitation. Do you know of a Catholic single young man between the ages of 14-40 who may be called to the priesthood or religious life? If so, help us to encourage him by submitting his name and contact information. There are two ways to submit that information: online or by completing a printed form.

2. Complete a hardcopy form to include the name of the young man and his contact information. (Forms are available in the back of the church near the bulletins.) You can then submit that completed form by mailing it to the parish or dropping it off at the parish office.

Feel free to submit more than one name if you know of several young men who may have a calling to a religious vocation and who show signs of holiness and leadership. Those whose names are submitted will receive a personal letter of encouragement and some resources to help them discern from Bishop Persico and Fr. Scott Jabo, the Vocation Director.






