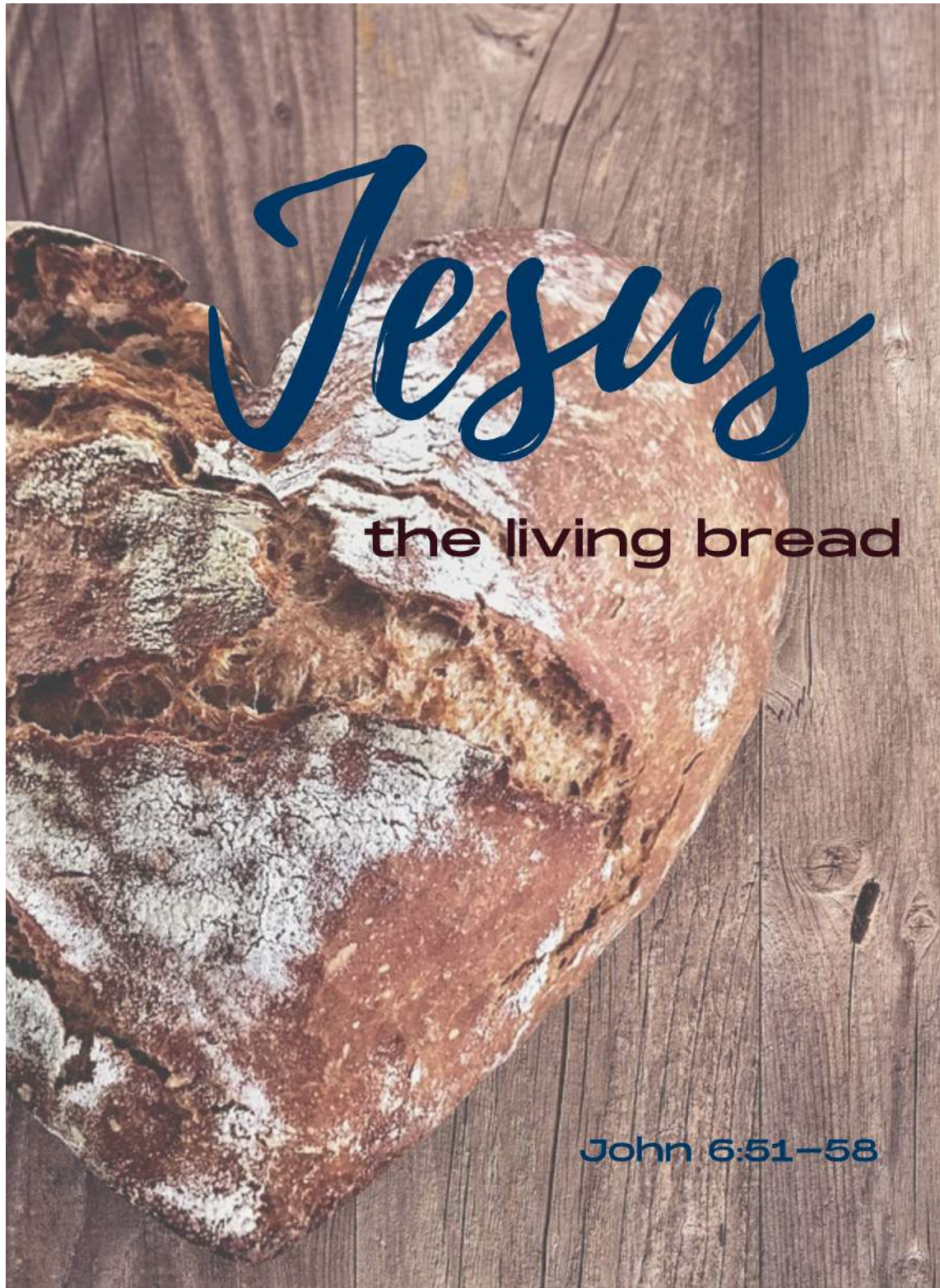

Sunday's Readings:

NOURISHING FOOD

Manna in the desert, water from a rock, bread, wine. God provides food to nourish our bodies and our souls, to bring us into union with the Divine. This is what we celebrate on this Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. The Israelites who journeyed through the desert for forty years knew physical hunger, but they were also hungry for more—they needed to know that God was with them as they made their way through the dangerous desert. We too experience hunger. We need to be assured that the Lord is with us as we navigate the circumstances of our lives, some of which feel dangerous, if not to our bodies, certainly to our spirit. Our participation in the Eucharist provides this assurance and more: fed with Christ's Body and Blood, we are drawn into communion with Christ and one another.

Serra Prayer for Vocations

From the Pastor's Desk...

A blessed Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ! We celebrate the great gift of God sharing his substantial self with us through the Eucharist in a focused way this weekend. I encourage you to join me in the **Eucharistic Procession which will take place at St. Peter Cathedral this Sunday, June 7th at 2pm with Bishop Persico in attendance.** We will process around the neighborhood of the Cathedral. This is a unique way to honor our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and to give witness to our belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. If you are unable to process, there will be prayers in the Cathedral during the procession which ends with prayers and Benediction inside the Cathedral.

On another note, I would like to share parts of an article from Our Sunday Visitor about the US Bishops decision to consecrate our country to the Sacred Heart of Jesus this week.

"Archbishop Alexander K. Sample of Portland, Oregon, who chairs the USCCB Committee for Religious Liberty, told OSV News there are three essential reasons the bishops voted for the consecration.

First "would be to place our nation under the kingship of Christ," he said. "Yes, we are a democratic republic; we are a civil society — but no civil society can long endure without being under the kingship of Christ himself; to place ourselves under God's providence and care." And while our young nation fought a revolution to throw off a monarchy, Archbishop Sample emphasized the continuity between Jesus' kingship and America's founding ideals. "In the history of our nation, it's undoubtable and it's irrefutable that the faith — and our reliance on God — really was the foundation that our Founding Fathers placed this nation on," he said. "So at this time, as we celebrate the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, it's to remind all of us that — whatever civil government we might have — we are all under, ultimately, the kingship of Christ."

Second, Archbishop Sample noted "there's a certain reparation aspect to the Sacred Heart. I think we can't forget that part of the consecration is to make reparation for offenses against God; against the heart of Christ." Some of those offenses, he remarked, are part of American history. "We are a great and blessed nation — but there are mistakes that we have made as a people over these 250 years. And so this is a good time," the archbishop added, "to also make reparation to the heart of Christ for those offenses against his love, and his mercy, and his justice — for all peoples."

Finally, Archbishop Sample said, "there's this desire, through this consecration, to also call us to have a greater heart for the poor and the suffering ... as we honor the Sacred Heart of Jesus, we can't just honor it as a private devotion. It has to move us, and move our hearts.

Pope Francis, he said, "was a man who loved these beautiful, rich devotions we have in the faith ... and wanted to call our attention to the fact that the heart of Christ is the heart of mercy ... and through the heart of Jesus, we find healing and reconciliation." Pope Francis brought the Sacred Heart to wider Catholic attention with the 2024 encyclical "Dilexit Nos" ("He Loved Us"), observing the devotion needs to be revived for our era.

So we at Our Lady of Peace are continuing with the US Bishops in the novena and consecration that they are leading this week (see details below in my additional notes) and I share the prayer that the USCCB has written to the Sacred Heart on this occasion and encourage you to pray it throughout the week.

"O Most Sacred Heart of Jesus:

You know the longings of our hearts, and you desire that we enjoy friendship with you.

From your pierced side, you have poured out the wellspring of life, for which we thirst.

Your heart burns with a love for all people to return to a right relationship with you.

We celebrate the abundant gifts you have given this nation, founded on the self-evident truths that our Creator has endowed all people with the right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.

We make reparation for the offenses against you and against human dignity that have taken place in this nation.

May our hearts be united to yours, so that our families and communities enjoy peace and happiness; may broken relationships be reconciled, injustices repaired, and the wounds of our land be healed.

May your holy Catholic Church serve as a sign, pointing all people to your infinite love.

O Desire of Nations and Center of History, we ask you to bless these United States of America.

Who live and reign with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

God, for ever and ever.

Amen.

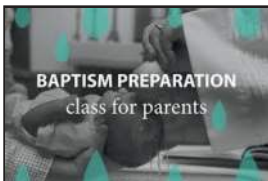

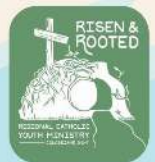

Safe boundaries - teach them to say "no" to anything that makes them uncomfortable. Online safety - Remind them not to share personal details or passwords online. Open conversations build confidence and help kids make smart choices when you're not around.
