Family Discussion of the Week: Laying Down Your Burdens

Jesus said, "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." (Matthew 11:28-29)

Adults: When has Jesus refreshed you when you felt burdened by problems?

Kids: What burden do you need Jesus to help you carry?

SHARE THE BURDEN

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). These words of our Savior seem to be in stark contrast to the previous chapter from the same Gospel, when we were told that if we do not take up our crosses, we are not worthy of Christ. Connecting these two messages might help us on our faith journeys. Being a follower of Christ surely means that we must embrace the cross, in its mystery of both suffering and triumph. This is something that we need not do alone, for the burden is often too heavy for us to carry by ourselves. Who, then, do we turn to? We can turn to the Body of Christ—the community of disciples gathered for worship. When we find the burden too heavy, let us remember that we can share that burden with our Christian sisters and brothers, who can help bring us rest.

Happy 250th birthday to the United States of America! The 250th anniversary of the founding of our nation is a worthy occasion to reflect upon the great privilege and responsibility of living in this country. It is also a good opportunity to read the Declaration of Independence and the U.S. Constitution, particularly its first ten amendments, known as the Bill of Rights or visit one of our beautiful national parks, which are national treasures. It is fascinating to learn about the thirteen Catholics whose statues are included in the National Statuary Hall Collection at the U.S. Capitol in Washington, D.C. Finally, following the lead of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, we are all still encouraged to consecrate ourselves and our nation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus if you weren't able to participate in June and to pray that our nation never forgets its religious roots and always provides religious freedom.

I also want to share that Our Lady of Peace has entered into a parish partnership with the popular prayer app, Hallow, as of July 1st. We will be offering more information on what that means over the next few months and then have an official Launch Weekend September 12/13 (Parish Picnic is September 12th!). With that being said, I mention now that Hallow is celebrating America's birth in a big way with its recent challenge.

Subscribers of the app have taken part in many previous prayer challenges that tie into the liturgical seasons. ****Pope Leo's Encyclical on Technology and AI** On May 25, 2026, Pope Leo XIV released his first encyclical, Magnifica Humanitas ("The Greatness of Humanity") on Faith and Technology. This important document reflects on human dignity, technology, artificial intelligence, and the challenges facing society in today's digital age. Drawing from the Church's long tradition of Catholic social teaching — including *Rerum Novarum*, *Centesimus Annus*, and *Laudato Si'* — Pope Leo reminds us that every human person is created in the image and likeness of God and possesses a dignity that no machine or technology can replace.

The encyclical discusses many modern concerns, including artificial intelligence, social media, excessive screen use, the impact of technology on children and families, human labor, autonomous weapons, and the importance of authentic human relationships. While acknowledging the benefits of technology, Pope Leo stresses that technology should always serve the human person and the common good — never diminish human dignity or moral responsibility. In a fast-paced digital world, Magnifica Humanitas invites Catholics to reflect more deeply on what it truly means to be human and how we are called to live faithfully and responsibly amid rapid technological change.

There are many resources out there to help digest the encyclical including Word on Fire, OSV, EWTN and the USCCB which is where I would suggest you start if you want to go deeper.

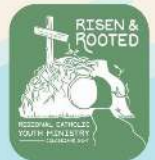

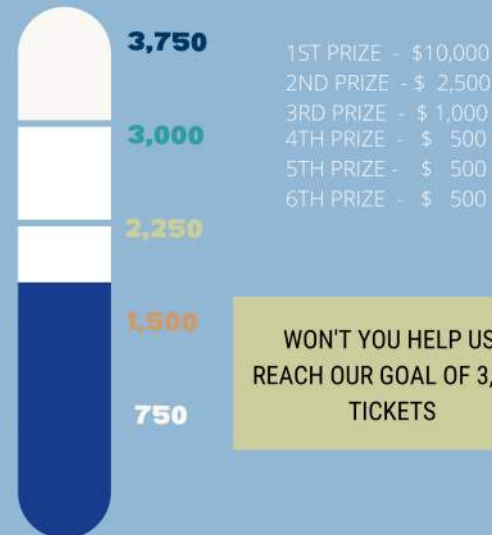
