Family Discussion of the Week: *Come, Follow Me*

Then Jesus told his disciples, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me." (Matthew 16:24)

Adults: In what concrete ways do you take up your cross and follow Jesus?

Kids: When has it been difficult to be a follower of Jesus?

THE CROSS OF JESUS

The perception of a cross changed dramatically after Jesus' crucifixion. Before that event, death on a cross was not only horrible, it was degrading. It was a penalty reserved only for the most wretched of criminals. The word "glory" would not have found its way into the same sentence containing the word "cross." But all that changed with Jesus. Over time, believers began to venerate and honor the cross. They painted, sculpted, and carved images of it. Many lost their own lives for their association with it. Today our reverence for and relationship with the cross recalls little of the contempt originally associated with it. As it has been through the ages, it is our perception of the cross that determines how we follow Jesus.

From the Pastor's Desk...

To my spiritual family of Our Lady of Peace-

Happy Sunday! I am very grateful for the staff and parish's desire to celebrate my 25th Anniversary of Priesthood this weekend! My anniversary is September 7th but we celebrate this weekend due to Labor Day and the parish picnic.

I share with you part of my comments from the Jubilarian Banquet at the Emmaus Convocation in Latrobe this past June. Before I do, allow me to explain this event. The highlight of Emmaus every year is Friday afternoon when we celebrate the Jubilarian Mass and Banquet where the Deacons of the Diocese join us as well. The Bishop presides at the Mass and all the Jubilarians (25, 40, 50, 60 years) are the primary concelebrants. Usually one of the 40-year jubilarians preaches the homily and the rest of the clergy applaud for the group as they process out of the chapel with the Bishop. Then at the banquet representatives of each of the jubilarian classes speak on behalf of their class. I was ordained with James Reardon, who has since left the priesthood, and Fr. David Perry who now serves as a priest of the Diocese of Pittsburgh (where he is originally from) so it was left to me to make comments for my class. So here is an excerpt I wanted to share...

"I have been pastor at Our Lady of Peace parish in Erie from 2017-2026. I was blessed to overlap with Fr. David Renne for about 4 months who was truly well-beloved for his 4 years at OLP. Then over the next nine years I have had five more Parochial Vicars- Fr. Kyle Seyler (20 months), Fr. Mark Hoffman (3 years), Fr. Dave Whiteford (1 Year), Fr. Dan Hoffman (1 year), Fr. Nick Fratus (1 year) and now Fr. Luke Daghir (starting his 2nd year). I am blessed to serve with each of these brothers in Christ and appreciate how they have all had an impact in my growth in the priesthood and as a pastor.

There have been many special graces during my Priesthood that have allowed me get this far but I would like to point out two of them here...

One- I have been involved in the Jesus Caritas fraternity of priest for 23 years. We started with a group of 8 men who have stayed together since. The core group is myself, Fr. Chris Singer, Fr. Mark Nowak, Fr. Bill O'Brien and Fr. David Foradori. We have been together since 2003. Fr. Dick Sullivan, Fr. Chuck Schmidt and Fr. Monty Sayers were part of that original group and have since passed away and we have added two members over the years in Fr. Jamie Power and Fr. Kevin Holland. This group has been a great source of fraternity and spiritual support to me as we meet 9-10 times a year for 5 hours including prayer, a meal and life and faith sharing.

Two- My (our) participation in the Amazing Parish movement. Four years ago, I started working with Amazing Parish. They are essentially a coaching ministry to Catholic Pastors whom they expect to identify a Parish Leadership Team who will help the pastor lead the parish in creating a culture of unceasing prayer, discipleship and healthy teamwork. This has been a huge gift to me that has not only renewed my priesthood but has pushed me to be a better pastor and kept me accountable and has rekindled my spiritual life. They have an annual retreat for priests which I can honestly say have been the best retreats I have experienced since being ordained (I have participated in two).

I am truly extremely grateful to God for the gift of my vocation to the priesthood. Echoing some of the things Archbishop Hebda mentioned... It is such a privilege that people completely open their hearts and lives to us- their greatest joys and most challenging sorrows- just because we have been ordained a priest of Jesus Christ. I pray that all of us never take that gift and privilege for granted and that we have the grace to allow Christ to work powerfully through us. I am grateful and proud to be a part of the presbyterate of the Diocese of Erie where we do allow the Holy Spirit to keep us united even in our diversity.

I thank God for creating and calling me to be a priest and I pray that God can help me reflect outwardly the great joy I find in my heart and soul in the mission with which he has blessed me. I really cannot imagine a better vocation than the one we are all so blessed to have- we get to help souls find their eternal destination in and through Christ. And for that I say... Praised be Jesus Christ... Now and forever!"

The Picnic Committee is mostly made up of our Families Together Ministry with some others who help plan and execute one incredible night. Then we will have music by Rooftop Project outside from 6:30-9pm, Face Painting and Magic Steve Balloons from 6:30-8pm, Bingo from 7-8pm, Bonfire at 8:30pm, Basket Raffle Drawings and the Parish Raffle Drawings at 9pm and fireworks at 9:30pm to conclude the night.

****Parish Picnic Needs** Raffle basket donations can be dropped off at the church office. We are also in need of volunteers to help out; sign-ups are in the vestibule. ****Masses this Week** *Monday, August 31st and Wednesday, Sept. 2nd. Weekdays in Ordinary Time; Tuesday, Sept. 1st- Mass for the Care of Creation; Thursday, Sept. 3rd- St. Gregory the Great, Pope and Doctor of the Church (6th Century theologian known for liturgical reform and chant (named after him)); Friday, Sept. 4th- Votive Mass of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus; Saturday, Sept. 5th- St. Teresa of Calcutta, Virgin (20th Century founder of the Missionaries of Charity to serve the "poorest of the poor").*

****World Day of Prayer for Creation** Tuesday, September 1st is the World Day of Prayer for Creation established by Pope Francis in 2015. Here's a little history that led up to that moment. According to an ancient liturgical tradition of the Eastern Church, September 1st is the day symbolizing God's act of creation of the world ("In the beginning"). Grounded in that symbolism, the Ecumenical Patriarchate of the Orthodox Church made a prophetic step in 1989: they invited all Christians to pray together on that day, offering "prayers and supplications to the Maker of all, both as thanksgiving for the great gift of Creation and as petitions for its protection and salvation."

Grassroots celebrations began in the 1990s, in ecumenical circles at large and Catholic communities in particular. Eventually, various episcopal bodies officially embraced the world day of prayer, such as European bishops (CCEE) in an ecumenical assembly of 1997 and the Philippine bishops in a pastoral letter of 2003. Other churches also adopted it, for example the World Council of Churches in 2002. In 2015, at the Vatican press conference to release the *Laudato Si'* encyclical, Orthodox bishop John Zizioulas was a speaker and he reminded the Catholic Church of the 1989 invitation to pray together. A few weeks later, Pope Francis officially instituted the World Day of Prayer for Creation for the universal Church.

****New School Year** Many schools including the Erie Catholic School System and Our Lady of Peace School started classes last week. This is year two for Mr. Travis Washko as the President of ECSS and he continues to work hard to create unity and raise the standards at ECSS. OLP parishioner, Corey Ferraro, will be taking over as principal at St. George (he was Vice Principal at OLP last year) so we wish him well and pray for his important work there. I enter my second year on the ECSS Board as well as the Committee of Pastors and Mission Enhancement Committees who report to the board. We continue to work hard to improve the academic standards as well as the Catholic Identity at ECSS.

I also want to mention that over the last year our Pastoral Council and Parish Leadership Team have created a goal for the next few years to actively seek ways to engage school families in the life of our parish. We are encouraging our active parish community to look at our school families who presently do not participate in the life of our parish with gratitude and hope and in the spirit of the new evangelization. My prayer is that our parishioners can find ways to bridge the gap between the parish and the school and help unite us as one community of faith. Let's pray this week for all of us who are a part of leading ECSS to do so with the gifts of wisdom, right counsel and fortitude from the Holy Spirit, and for all of us at OLP to continue to embrace ECSS and OLP School as an integral part of our parish mission!

School Masses will generally be on Thursdays at 2pm. Anyone is welcome to attend those Masses but be aware, you must enter through the parish office door and be buzzed in.

Note: the September 3rd School Mass is at 1:30PM.

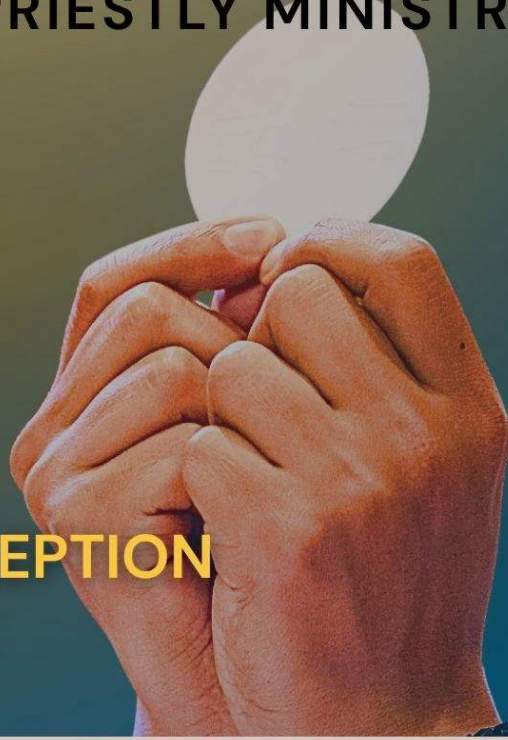

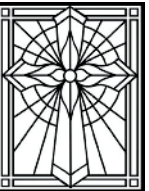
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
