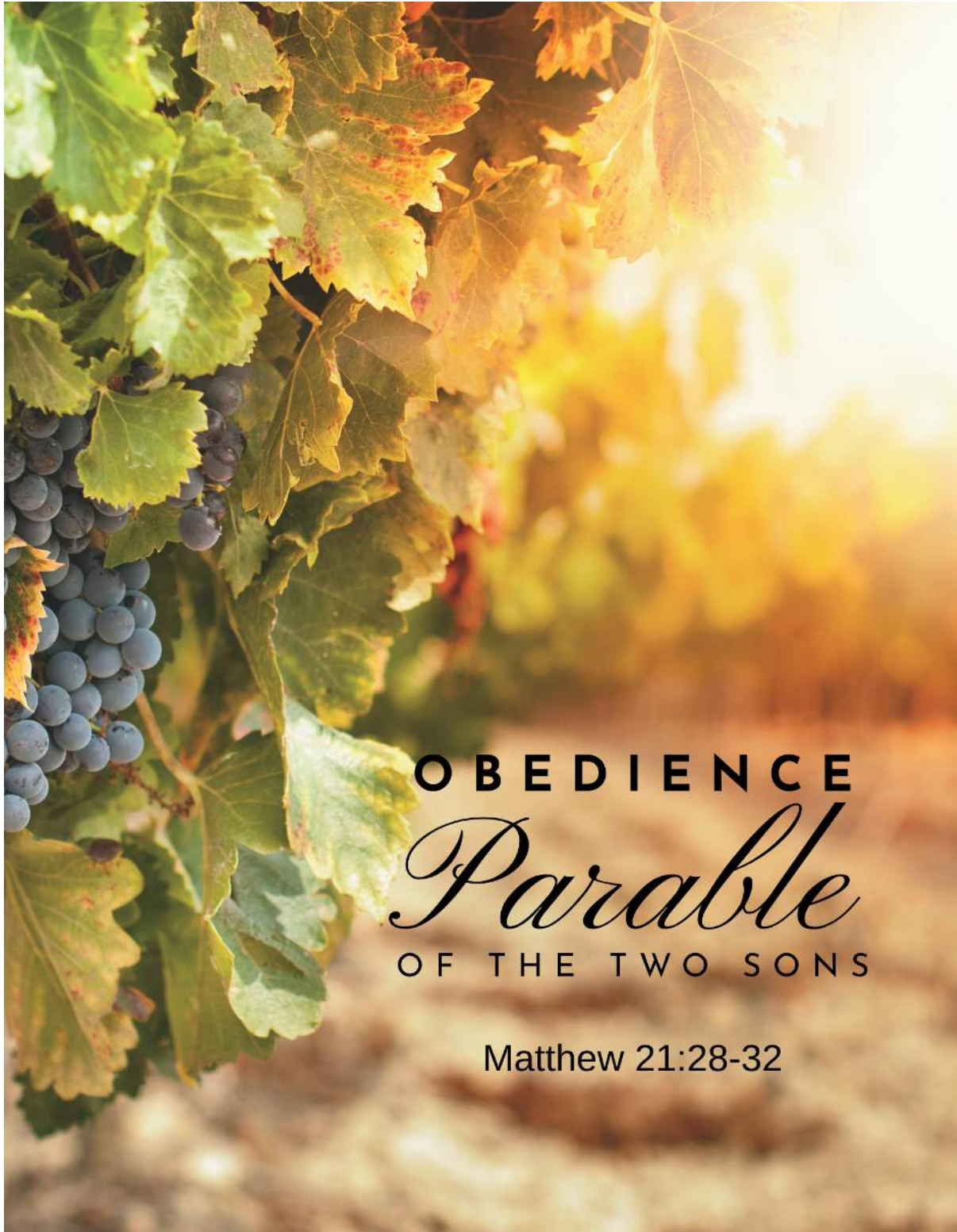

Full details can be found on page 2 including the 3 dimensions of OLP Prays- the Parish Ministries Prayer Team, the Parish Prayer Line and the Parish Book of Intentions. The first two have been going for years at OLP but many in our community were not aware of them. So, if you are willing to be a part of those who pray OR if you have intentions to be prayed for, please join OLP Prays and be a part of lifting each other up in intercessory prayer. The book of intentions is new at OLP and will be placed near the Blessed Mother Altar in the back of church. All are welcome to write your intentions at any time. These intentions as well as the intentions on the prayer line will be included at every Mass in the General Intercessions.

This is all part of our effort to strengthen the culture of prayer at OLP which our participation in Amazing Parish has encouraged. It also builds on our partnership with Hallow. I want to remind you that one of the many appealing features of our Hallow App Community is that we can directly seek prayers for specific intentions right on the App; then anyone in the community can offer prayer (through the app) for your intention. You are even notified that someone has prayed for your intention! I often hear people admit that they forget to pray for the intentions they have promised others that they will pray for and this provides a way to be accountable. Even if you do not pray immediately for the intention when you receive an alert, when you go to pray your next prayer in Hallow, it will remind you of the intentions that have been shared since your last prayer and give you an option to pray for them. I love this way of prayer for each other! It's like the way that Amazing Parish has encouraged us to ask people how we can pray for them and then to take that moment to pray with right in that moment, only this is through our online community.

I hope all these ministries and opportunities help us to grow in a culture of prayer and that our parish and the broader community in Erie will truly know that "OLP PRAYS!"

****Parish Picnic Thank You** Thank you to everyone who attended and a special thank you to everyone who helped plan and execute the event! Our Picnic Committee, which is primarily our Families Together Ministry with a few others who join in, did an incredible job. The picnic committee is very grateful to many volunteers whose help was invaluable. In addition to many individuals I thank the Knights of Columbus and the Parish Pastoral Council. There were an estimated 600+ meals served; so great attendance despite the threat of rain and moving mostly inside. We had 93 baskets donated for our basket raffle; which is the most so far. ****Parish Registration Weekend** Why register as a member of OLP? Here are a few reasons to consider:

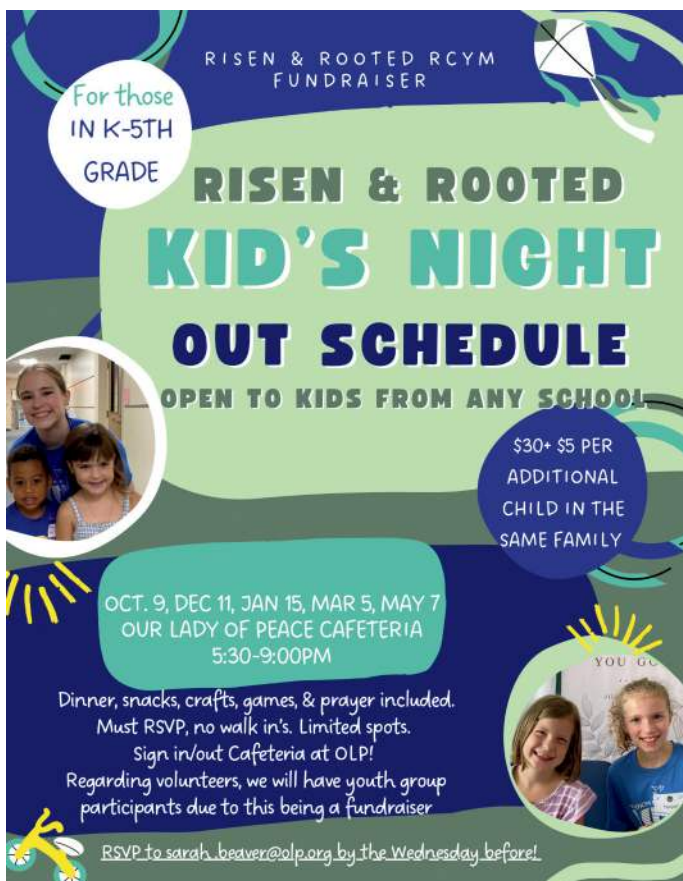

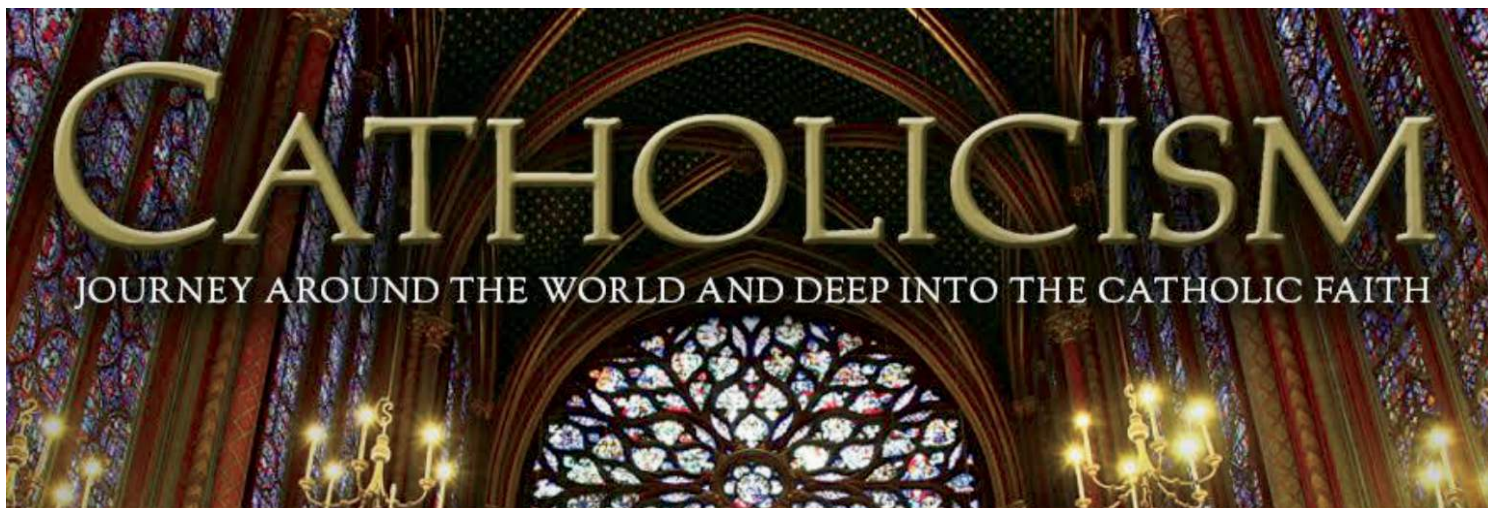

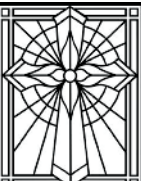
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
